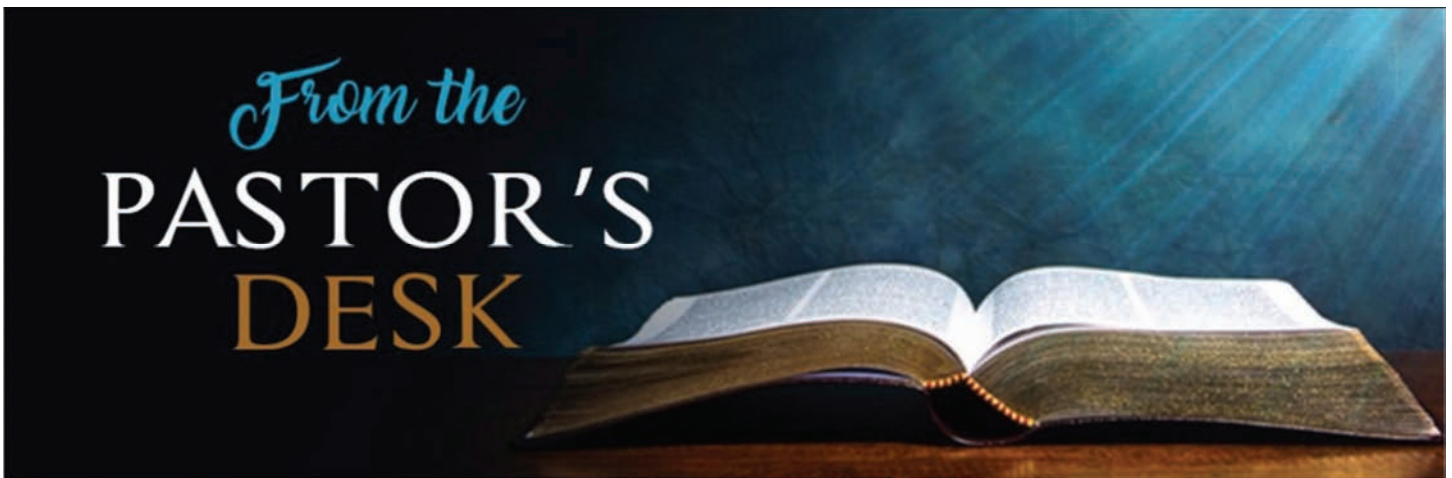

To Save the Many

We tend to define ourselves by what we do rather than by what we are. *What do you do?* is part of ordinary small talk. The man who robs someone is a robber, and the woman who rescues someone is a rescuer. What we do makes us what we are. But at the same time, what we are has a certain priority over what we do. The temptation to prize doing over being manifests itself in our words. We start to use the word *useful* as a synonym for *good*. We say *I hope you find this useful* when what we mean is *I hope this is good for you*. An overemphasis on our actions leads us to value our jobs. People are proud of being a manager, a director, a boss, a supervisor. Rank and status are confused with identity. No one wants to be a commoner, an understudy, a peasant. The mistake is to think that important jobs make us important people. They do not. Nor does the lack of such importance make us unimportant. The mistake is to believe that one is either a somebody or a nobody.

Jesus offers Himself as a model for His disciples. The Son of Man *did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many*. The Greek word used for the word *many* in this passage is *hoi polloi*. That could be translated as *riff-raff, the rank and file, the lowest of the low, commoners*. At every Mass, the words of the Consecration indicate that Jesus shed His Precious Blood for *many, the riff-raff*. Today's second reading reminds us *we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been similarly tested in every way, yet without sin*.

Jesus who dies for the rank and file warns us about lording over one another. Jesus warns the great ones, the managers, against exercising authority over the lesser ones. His teaching is that the desire for power, as an end in itself is evil.

Jesus died for the *hoi polloi*. Our dignity does not come from the things we do or can do. We are not valued for the quality of our life. Our dignity and value come from what we are (human beings, rational creatures made in the image of God) and from what we are being made into (the children of God by adoption through grace). The Lordship we Christians have is one of service to each other, just like the Lordship of Jesus who came to save us, to save the *hoi polloi*.

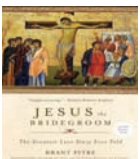

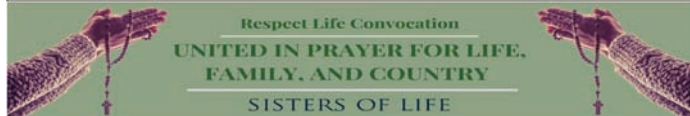

FOOD PANTRY RENOVATION UPDATE. YOUR GIFT AT WORK.

In addition to helping support dozens of Catholic Charities programs and ministries, the Appeal is in the second year of our three-year commitment to allocate \$200,000 annually toward the complete renovation of the Father English Food Pantry in Paterson, which serves about 18,000 people monthly.

The new food pantry will:

- Reconfigure the space to increase shelving and aisles

- Offer classes in English as a Second Language, health and nutrition, parenting, workforce training and computer skills
