SPIRITUAL LIFE

Reconciliation: Celebrated on Saturday from 4:00 – 5:00 PM, or by appointment with the priest. Parish Penance Services are celebrated during Advent and Lent.

Eucharistic Adoration: First Friday following the 9:00AM Mass until 6:30PM, followed by Benediction and Novena to St. Jude.

RCIA: The RCIA process is open to those who have never been baptized as well as those baptized into a different faith, and those needing to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. The group meets Tuesdays at 7:00PM. If interested, contact Deb for more information at RCIA@stjudeparish.org.

Anointing of the Sick: At any time, the sacrament of healing is available to all who are seriously ill, hospitalized or preparing for surgery, as well as those of advanced age. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements for administration of the sacrament. If there is an emergency, please call 973-691-1561 Ext 14.

Parish Registration: Is requested of all individual persons and families who worship regularly with us on Sundays and who intend to participate in the life of our parish with their time, talents, and treasure. For more information, call the Parish Office at 973-691-1561 or stop by the Information Office after any Mass on Saturday or Sunday. Registration is necessary for the issuing of sponsor certificates.

Matrimony: Contact the parish office at least six months before the prospective date.

Baptism: Baptism Preparation Class is held on the second Monday of every other month at 7:00PM in the church. Baptisms are held on Saturday at 12:00 Noon and Sunday at 2:00PM. Call the parish office to register for class and to schedule Baptism. Next Class: March 11, 2019.

**A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS
 HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly**

**Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
 February 10, 2019**

“Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts! He touched my mouth...and said ‘See now, that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged.’ Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, ‘Whom shall I send? Who will go for me?’ ‘Here I am, I said, send me.’”

The call of the prophet and the new vocation of the fishermen can be the image of the call that Jesus makes for us today. We need to respond to the invitation He graciously gives us, to be sent to announce His message. It is easy for us to make excuses, to hesitate, or even flee. The ‘unclean lips’ of Isaiah were purified to prepare him for his role. Our own lips are unclean when we use them to criticize, speak ill of others, or complain, or even use bad language. We can use the same tongue to pray, praise and show others His presence in our lives. Peter speaks for us all as he says: ‘but at your command I will lower the nets.’ What a surprise, leading him to the humble confession ‘depart from me Lord for I am a sinful man.’ Jesus responds with the familiar phrase ‘Do not be afraid...from now on...they followed Him.’

May we identify with Isaiah, seeking what the Lord asks of us. May we leave our tangled nets, acknowledge the Lord’s call and forgiveness, and follow Him.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jeremiah 17:5-8

Jeremiah compares a man who seeks strength in flesh but abandons God to a bush in the desert, bereft of nourishment and unable to grow. Yet a man who trusts in God is like a tree beside a river, fed & strengthened by it even during times of drought.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

Paul addresses those who believe in Christ’s teachings, but are not convinced that he rose from the dead. He calls their faith worthless, because they have not been freed from their sins. Paul then emphatically declares that Jesus did rise up again, as will all those who truly believe in him.

Gospel: Luke 6:17, 20-26

Jesus tells his followers that those who are insulted in this life because of him will be rewarded richly in heaven. Yet those well received by all will despair in heaven, since people had often respected false prophets and mistreated true prophets. Those who hunger, perhaps for spiritual knowledge, shall be filled. Yet those who are full in this life will be hungry.

Ordinary Time

So, here we are celebrating what the church refers to as ordinary time. You might be asking yourself, can anything connected with the celebration of the liturgy be ordinary? Well, first, it is important to understand the meaning of ordinary in this context. Ordinary is based on the word ordinal or counting, and comprises two periods – the Sundays after the Epiphany/Baptism of Our Lord up to Ash Wednesday, and the Sundays after Pentecost up until the start of Advent. As a matter of fact, that is how these Sundays used to be counted – The third Sunday after the Epiphany, etc. So, in looking at these Sundays, we spend a great deal of liturgical time in **ordinary time**, making it the longest time in the liturgical year, either 33 or 34 weeks (depending on the placement of the Baptism of the Lord). This means you miss the ordinal number one, and the number that starts the week of Pentecost.

The color worn during this time is green – a color symbolizing hope, life and anticipation. Ordinary time is a season focused on the Lord's three-year public ministry, His teachings and miracles; a reminder that the mission of the church is to share the hope and life of Christ with the world. So then, why do we see colors other than green during this time? There are certain solemnities and feasts that fall on Sundays during Ordinary Time that would preempt the observance of an ordinarily numbered Sunday. On preempted Sundays, the liturgical color of the feast or solemnity replaces the liturgical color green. These feast days include, in the Roman Catholic calendar, any holy day of obligation, any other solemnity, any feast of the Lord, and the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed Souls. These feasts are celebrated usually during the week, but a change is made if the date falls on a Sunday.

On the universal calendar, these include:

- Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on 2 February (liturgical color: white),
- Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist on 24 June (liturgical color: white),
- Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on 29 June (liturgical color: red)
- Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord on 6 August (liturgical color: white)
- Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on 14 September (liturgical color: red)
- Solemnity of All Saints on 1 November (liturgical color: white)
- Commemoration of All Faithful Departed Souls on 2 November (liturgical color: various)
- Feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of Saint John Lateran in Rome on 9 November (liturgical color: white).

The following observances always preempt a Sunday in Ordinary Time:

- Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity always preempts the Sunday immediately after Pentecost
- Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Our Lord always preempts the second Sunday after Pentecost
- Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King of the Universe always preempts the 34th (and final) Sunday in Ordinary Time

- Other solemnities which outrank Sundays of Ordinary Time vary from parish to parish and diocese to diocese; they may include the feast of the patron saint of a parish and the feast of the dedication of the parish church.

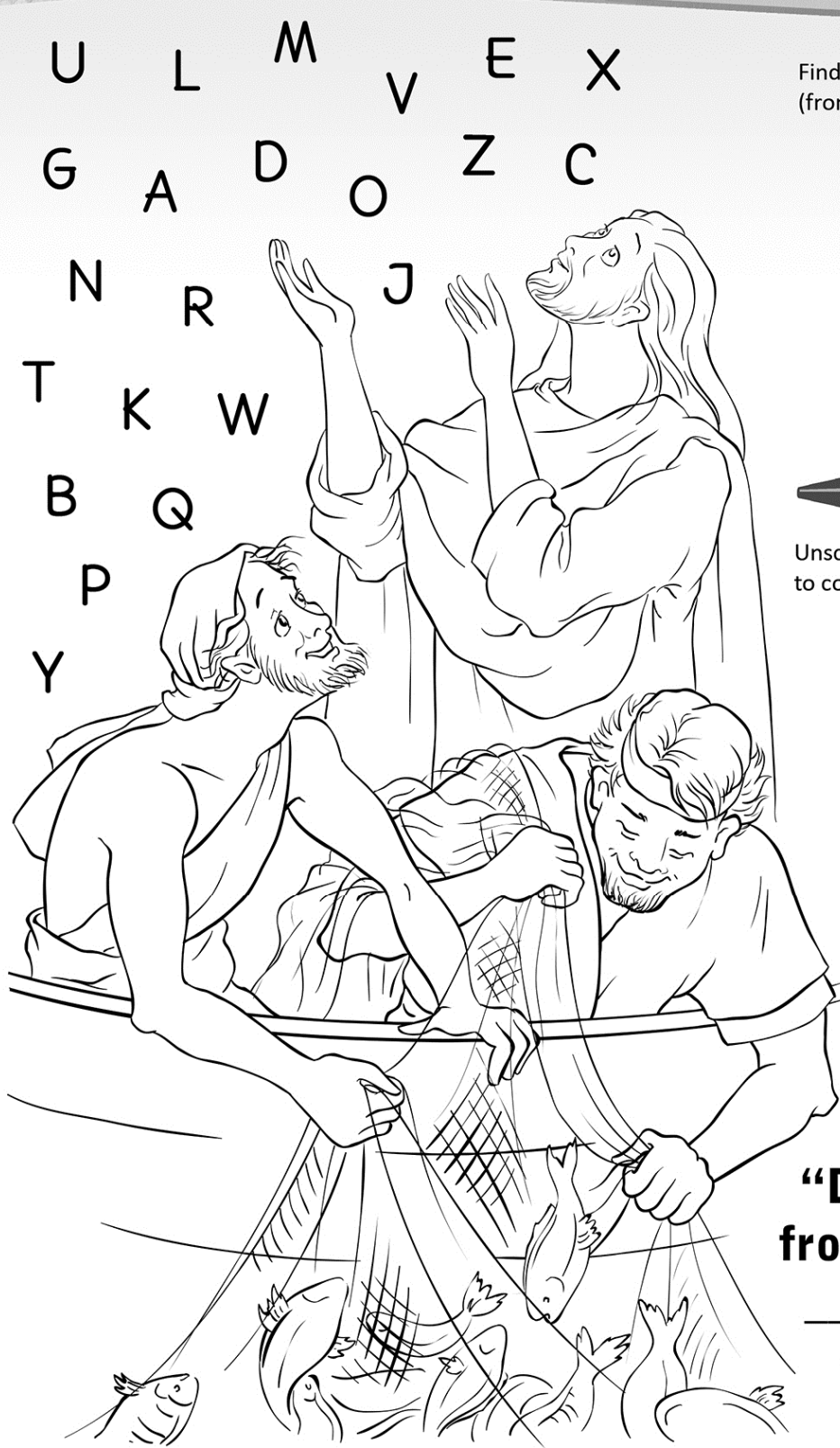
