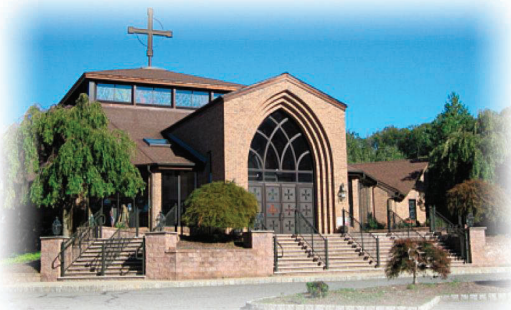

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Faith Formation: The Faith Formation Office will be open on Sunday from 7:30AM to 12:30PM, Monday and Wednesday from 9:00AM to 2:00PM.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation will be celebrated on Saturdays in the Church from 4:30PM to 5:15PM or by appointment with the priest. Parish Penance Services are celebrated during Advent and Lent.

Eucharistic Adoration: First Friday following the 9:00AM Mass until 4:00 PM in the Daily Mass Chapel.

RCIA: The RCIA process is open to those who have never been baptized, those baptized into a different faith, and those needing to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation RCIA@stjudeparish.org

Anointing of the Sick: At any time, the sacrament of healing is available to all who are seriously ill, hospitalized or preparing for surgery, as well as those of advanced age. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements for administration of the sacrament. If there is an emergency, please call 973-691-1561 Ext 14.

Parish Registration: Is requested of all individual persons and families who worship regularly with us on Sundays and who intend to participate in the life of our parish with their time, talents, and treasure. Registration is necessary for the issuing of sponsor certificates.

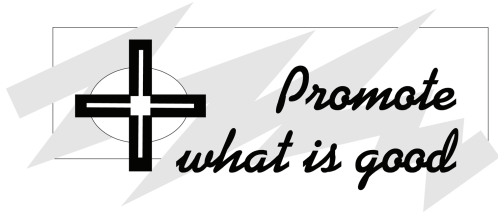
Matrimony: Contact the parish office at least nine months before the prospective date.

HIS WORD TODAY

**Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 28, 2024**

"A prophet like me will the Lord God raise up for you, from among your own kin, to him you shall listen... I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into their mouth, he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it."

The first pages of scripture tell us of a promised redeemer. The prophets, the spokespersons for God constantly reminded the people of their covenant with God. John the Baptist pointed out Jesus as the one. Jesus being present made a new covenant, and today that covenant is renewed in His church.

Promise, prophets, presence, preaching, the story of salvation for us all. FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here on earth is quite limited and should be well spent.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice, but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill, and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved on to other villages to proclaim the good news.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INCREASED SPIRITUAL GROWTH DURING OUR LENTEN SEASON

ASH WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 14th **OBLIGATORY FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday is a day of obligatory fast and abstinence. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays in Lent.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Praying the Stations of the Cross is part of the Catholic tradition of devotional prayer. To pray the "Way of the Cross" requires only that you meditate on the Passion of the Lord before each Station.

Stations of the Cross begin at **7:00PM** in the church every Friday evening from February 16th through March 22nd during Lent with the exception of Good Friday. Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, March 29th begin at **6:00PM**.

WELCOME HOME TO HEALING

"Welcome Home" is a diocesan initiative to invite all Catholics to experience the grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession is a wonderful opportunity to set aside our sinful ways and to draw closer to our Lord. Confessions will be held every Monday February 18th - March 19th from 7:00PM-8:30PM in every Catholic Church in the Diocese of Paterson.

SILENCE THROUGHOUT LENT

Just a reminder that **all liturgies throughout Lent will conclude in silence instead of a closing song.** This provides a new way to experience prayer in our lives, and respect for those around us who may wish to remain after liturgy in silent prayer. Therefore, we strive to remain silent until we exit our worship space.

OPERATION RICE BOWL

As part of our community's observance of Lent, we ask all families to participate in Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl, a program of prayer, fasting, learning, and giving. Please be sure to take home a Rice Bowl packet and follow this simple yet powerful Lenten practice. Packets are available in the church narthex. Visit www.csricebowl.org for more information. 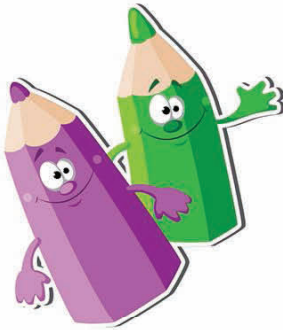
