

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Faith Formation: The Faith Formation Office will be open on Sunday from 7:30AM to 12:30PM, Monday and Wednesday from 9:00AM to 2:00PM.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation will be celebrated on Saturdays in the Church from 4:30PM to 5:15PM or by appointment with the priest. Parish Penance Services are celebrated during Advent and Lent.

Eucharistic Adoration: First Friday following the 9:00AM Mass until 4:00 PM in the Daily Mass Chapel.

RCIA: The RCIA process is open to those who have never been baptized, those baptized into a different faith, and those needing to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation RCIA@stjudeparish.org

Anointing of the Sick: At any time, the sacrament of healing is available to all who are seriously ill, hospitalized or preparing for surgery, as well as those of advanced age. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements for administration of the sacrament. If there is an emergency, please call 973-691-1561 Ext 14.

Parish Registration: Is requested of all individual persons and families who worship regularly with us on Sundays and who intend to participate in the life of our parish with their time, talents, and treasure. For more information, call the Parish Office at 973-691-1561 or stop by the Information Office after any Mass on Saturday or Sunday. Registration is necessary for the issuing of sponsor certificates.

Matrimony: Contact the parish office at least nine months before the prospective date.

Baptism: Baptisms are held on Saturday at 11:30AM and Sunday at 1:30PM. Call the parish office to register for class and to schedule Baptism. Our next Baptism Class is on Monday, October 14, at 6:30pm in the church.

Fellowship Prayer Group: Meets every Wednesday from 7:00 - 8:00PM in the Daily Mass Chapel.

Food Drive & Pet Food: Our Monthly Food Drive is held on the First Sunday of the Month and our Pet Food Drive is held on the Third Sunday of the Month. We ask that you bring all non-perishable items and leave them in the church narthex.

IV WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

'Do not cast me off in my old age' (cfr. Sal 71:9)

The IV World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on Sunday, 28 July 2024. The theme chosen by the Holy Father – "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. *Psalm* 71:9) – is meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throw-away culture.

In this year of preparation for the Jubilee, which the Holy Father wishes to be devoted to prayer, the theme of the World Day is taken from Psalm 71, the plea of an elderly person who reflects on the story of his friendship with God.

By cherishing the charisms of grandparents and the elderly, and the contribution they make to the life of the Church, the World Day seeks to support the efforts of every ecclesial community to forge bonds between the generations and to combat loneliness, in the awareness that – as Scripture states – "It is not good for man to be alone" (*Gen* 2:18).

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY Seventeenth Sunday

"I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit as you were also called to the one hope of your call..."

We often examine our conduct and conscience by examining the ten commandments, the eight beatitudes or seven capital sins. As we strive to grow and maintain a close relationship with Christ, may we see in the words of St. Paul, the bricks we have to live out our call. He cites these same virtues on many occasions, reminding us of their importance for our growth in holiness. Do I find them present in my life at this moment? He continues to call me.

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The Israelites complain that Moses led them to the desert and there is no food for them there. Then the Lord told Moses he would rain down bread from heaven so the people might know that AI, the Lord, am your God. @ God did as he had promised and in the morning the people found the bread that he had given them.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

Paul tells the Ephesians that they must give up their old way of life and live in accordance with the truth that Christ has brought them. He reminds them to acquire a spiritual way of thinking, and to remember that they are made in God=s image and act accordingly.

Gospel: John 6:24-35

The people Jesus had fed on five loaves of bread follow him, and Jesus tells them they should not be looking for perishable food, but for spiritual food. The people want a sign that they should believe in him. He explains that he is the bread of life, and anyone who believes will not experience hunger or thirst. The people did not fully understand that he was speaking in the spiritual sense, and not of actual food.
