Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As human beings, God has created us with both mortal bodies and immortal souls. He knows that we need care and nourishment for both. Throughout the week we try our best to eat, sleep, pray, work, exercise, and rest in a way that will benefit our bodily (and spiritual) existence. Then on Sunday, the Lord’s Day, **God asks us specifically to *recline at table* to be nourished by His Word and Sacrament at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.**



Sometimes our biggest challenge can be this reclining. The inertia and momentum of the week can carry over into our worship, causing us to be distracted, or worse, to neglect the obligation altogether. ***Justice to God (religion) obliges us to adore and thank God for His continuous blessings; because of our limited and weak human nature, God knows that we need specific times to fulfill this obligation (Baltimore Catechism).*** When He rested on the 7th Day, God blessed and sanctified the day for us as a day of worship and rest from servile work to anticipate what we are ultimately called to – the rest of God’s eternal beatitude in Heaven.

Each Sunday, Christ continues to say to us through His Church and her ministers: ***“Have the people recline”*** so that He can feed us with His Word and His Body and Blood in the Most Holy Eucharist. With all of the hungers and needs we experience as human beings, may they always remind us of our greatest hunger – the hunger for God Who alone can give us the peace and joy of soul we desire and that the world cannot give.

Most Precious Blood of Christ, poured out on the Cross, save us.

Gospel: John 6:1-15

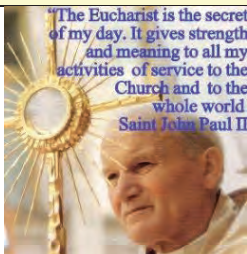

July 29.—ST. MARTHA, Virgin.

ST. JOHN tells us that "Jesus loved Martha and Mary and Lazarus," and yet but few glimpses are vouchsafed us of them. First, the sisters are set before us with a word. Martha received Jesus into her house, and was busy in outward, loving, lavish service, while Mary sat in silence at the feet



she had bathed with her tears. Then, their brother is ill, and they send to Jesus, "Lord, he whom Thou lovest is sick." And in His own time the Lord came, and they go out to meet Him; and then follows that scene of unutterable tenderness and of sublimity unsurpassed: the silent waiting of Mary; Martha strong in faith, but realizing so vividly, with her practical turn of mind, the fact of death, and hesitating: "Canst Thou show Thy wonders in the grave?" And then once again, on the eve of His Passion, we see Jesus at Bethany. Martha, true to her character, is serving; Mary, as at first, pours the precious ointment, in adoration and love, on His divine head. And then we find the tomb of St. Martha, at Tarascon, in Provence. When the storm of persecution came, the family of Bethany, with a few companions, were put into a boat, without oars or sail, and borne to the coast of France. St. Mary's tomb is at St. Baume; St. Lazarus is venerated as the founder of the Church of Marseilles; and the memory of the virtues and labors of St. Martha is still fragrant at Avignon and Tarascon.

Reflection.—When Martha received Jesus into her house, she was naturally busy in preparations for such a Guest. Mary sat at His feet, intent alone on listening to His gracious words. Her sister thought that the time required other service than this, and asked our Lord to bid Mary help in serving. Once again Jesus spoke in defence of Mary. "Martha, Martha," He said, "thou art lovingly anxious about many things; be not over-eager; do thy chosen work with recollectedness. Judge not Mary. Hers is the good part, the one only thing really necessary. Thine will be taken away, that something better be given thee." The life of action ceases when the body is laid down; but the life of contemplation endures and is perfected in heaven.
