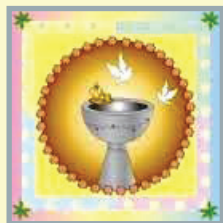

Do you really want to be a saint?

What makes someone a saint, anyway? A saint is simply a soul completely in love with God and therefore loving toward everyone God created. These days we remember the saints and all the souls who have gone before us.

What is All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2)? On these days, we remember those who have died, both those in heaven (so many of them!) and those on their way there (in God's hospital that we call Purgatory).

What is Purgatory? Didn't we do away with that in the 1970s? Purgatory is actually a great mercy of the Lord for those on their way to heaven but in need of some healing beforehand. Not everyone dies a saint, and that's what Purgatory is for.

Why do we pray for the dead? Isn't that morbid? Our relationships with the people we knew and loved here on earth don't end upon death. They need our prayers to quicken their time of healing before heaven. And we can even ask them to pray for us!

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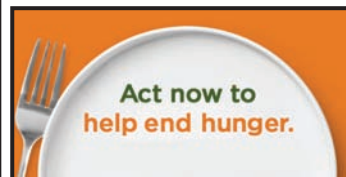


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
