Saturday from 1:00 - 2:00 pm in Church. Upon request, at any other time.



The summer months are usually a good time to engage in some reading. One of the books I am currently reading is entitled: "White Fragility" and was written by Professor Robin DiAngelo of Westfield State University. It is currently on the New York Times best seller list and has been a book of interest especially during these times of national discussions and protests about racist attitudes and actions.

The title of her book is intriguing enough. It certainly challenges us to look at our own attitudes, misconceptions, stereotypical behaviors and for many of us it also challenges us to evaluate the "white" privileged environments that we grew up in (myself included). One of the more popular sitcoms that appealed to our so-called "privileged culture" that we watched back in the 1970's was entitled: "All in the Family." It featured a White Anglo Saxon Protestant fellow named Archie Bunker, who was a loudmouth bigot who believed in every racial, sexist and prejudiced stereotype he ever heard. When I served as a parish priest at Queen of Peace Parish in North Arlington some years ago, I remember being in the sacristy with several other priests when one of our ushers came in to greet us. At the time Pope John Paul II was in declining health and the subject of who might replace him was raised. One of the possible candidates at the time was a black African cardinal and when his name was mentioned the usher suddenly blurted out: "If we ever elect a black pope I'll leave the church." Of course we were all stunned that he said this in front of us all just before Mass began. I'm sure that his comments were indicative of other such "white fragility" rhetoric and antics that was going around at the time.

In their November 2018 pastoral letter against racism called; "Open Wide Our Hearts," the bishops of the United States stated: "We call on everyone, especially all Christians and those of other faith traditions, to help repair the breach caused by racism, which damages the human family. Professor DiAngelo tells us in her book that "Racism has been among the most complex social dilemmas since the founding of our country."

As American citizens it is up to us to show by our patriotism that "all men and women are created equal" and as faith based people of God to witness the truth that they are also created in the image and likeness of God.

May the Lord grant you his peace.



CURRENT PROCEDURES FOR ATTENDING MASS AT ST. ANNE'S

- 1. Weekday Masses have resumed with the following directives:
 - **a.** The maximum number of people who can be present is 50.
 - b. A mask <u>MUST</u> be worn and a distance of six feet must be maintained between persons outside individual families.
 - **c.** Registration is REQUIRED. To best protect the safety and wellness of our entire parish, the Archdiocese has mandated a registration system that will allow us to contact trace in the event that anyone becomes ill. You will be able to sign up for Masses in weekly blocks on EVENTBRITE. You can access EVENTBRITE by going to our webpage: www.stannefairlawnnj.org and selecting Masses you would like to attend.
 - **d.** When Mass is over, please leave promptly so that we can immediately begin sanitizing the Church.
- We have resumed THREE weekend Masses, on Saturday at 5:15 p.m., and Sunday at 9:30 a.m. & 11:30 am with the same provisions as weekday Masses (see above). 7:30 am Sunday Mass will resume on Sunday, August 30th.
- 3. Baptisms, weddings, and funerals can be resumed with all cautionary social-distancing measures in place. Based on state public official guidelines, the maximum number of participants for Funeral, Baptisms and Weddings remains at 25% of the church's capacity or 50 participants in total, whichever number is lower, which in our case is 50 maximum.
- 4. The Church will remain open for private prayer at the following times daily until 1:00 pm.

Please be aware that there still will be a risk for anyone who attends a Mass. Even with the best health practices and strict social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus.

We want to make every effort to ensure that these health practices will be followed by us. So, we all need to cooperate with each other. We are limited to the amount of people in church at each service. That is why we have to register for the Mass we want to go to. We have also added greeters to help the ushers find a place for you to be during Mass. After any service, we will sanitize the church & bathrooms. We are sure that if we follow these protocols, we can reduce the risks.

We want to thank you all for your patience and understanding. We realize that these precautions are inconvenient and cumbersome. However, our greatest priority is to help us all to worship in a setting where we all feel safe and secure. Thank you! We look forward to seeing your faces again!

FAITH FORMATION NEWS

Registration is open for the 2020/2021 Faith Formation Program year. To register, please contact the Faith Formation Staff for further information and registration materials. We can be reached at 201-791-1616, Colleen's extension is 218 and Claire's extension is 224 or email at stannefaith@gmail.com. Please know that our guidelines for the new year are still quite fluid/uncertain since we have not received updated guidelines from the Archdiocese and/or the State/Local government. Our utmost concern is for the health and safety of our entire community and for everyone's spiritual well-being. At this time, it is our intention to offer hybrid/blended programs - in-person and virtual, sessions that are limited in size and everyone will need to wear a face covering. We have developed a "REOPEN TEAM" which consists of parents and professionals to aid in developing reopening guidelines and follow through.

The Faith Formation programs available are:

SUNDAY MORNING: For: Grades 1-8 - 10:45 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

FAMILY CATECHESIS: For: Grades 6, 7 and 8 only; for families who wish to teach their children at home. Large group sessions for adults and children are held several times throughout the school year.

SPECIAL NEEDS/ANGELS CLASS: Tuesday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m.

HOME STUDY: For: Grades 1- 5 only; for families who wish to teach their children at home. Large group sessions for adults and children are held several times throughout the school year.

SUMMER FAITH - hopefully next Summer, 2021: For: Grades 1 through 6 (entering in September) From: 7 days in late June through mid July (7 days total), meet from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Students enrolling in the Summer Faith Program next year (2021) must have attended the St. Anne Faith Formation program **one year prior** to enrolling in the summer program and should be enrolled for Sunday Faith or Home Study for the 2020/2021 Faith Formation program year. If they were not enrolled in St. Anne Faith Formation Program for one year, they can enroll in the Sunday Faith or Home Study program. The only exception is for grade 1.

Sacrament Preparation for Children

Our Faith Formation journey is one in which we grow in a deeper relationship with the person of Christ and understanding of the Catholic Church. Preparation for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation happen separately from the scheduled Faith Formation Sessions and Catholic School Religion class. The young people are enrolled in the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Preparation sessions once one full year of curriculum has been completed. Children traditionally enroll in the Faith Formation Program in 1st grade and First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are generally celebrated in 2nd grade. Young people being presented for the Sacrament of Confirmation (currently Spring of 8th grade) should have attended continuous Catholic faith formation since First Holy Communion. There will be special Parent Meetings and Family/Child Preparation Sessions for all children who choose to receive the Sacraments. Notifications of Meetings and Preparation Sessions will be mailed to families at the appropriate time. Guidelines will be outlined at a Special Sacrament Preparation Parent meeting. Families that have children attending Catholic School, should reach out to the Faith Formation Office at the end of first grade and the beginning of 7th grade to be included in all Sacrament Preparation communications. We have the contact information for those that are currently enrolled in our Faith Formation program as public/private school students. Our email is stannefaith@gmail.com.

Enrollment in the Sacrament Preparation Program(s) (First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) may be delayed due to excessive absences and/or missed years of attendance. "Catechesis for school-age children is an initial catechesis but not a fragmentary one, since it will have to reveal, although in an elementary way, all the principal mysteries of faith and their effects on the child's moral and religious life." (National Directory for Catechesis, USCCB, Structured Catechesis 642)




