A popular hymn that is sung from time to time in our churches is the song; "Seek the Lord." The song is based on the first reading from the Book of Isaiah, chapter 55: verses 6-9 that is being proclaimed at our Masses this weekend. The song was written by the Jesuit priest Rev. Roc O'Connor who has been a member of the Jesuit community since 1967. He is a well regarded theologian and music composer who has been writing liturgical hymns since 1974.

The song is more commonly used at Penance Services, at liturgies during the Season of Lent and as an opening hymn from time to time. To seek the Lord in its essence means to seek the Lord's presence. The Hebrew word for "presence" can also be translated to mean the word "face." We can understand this to literally mean that when we seek the face of God, we are seeking nothing less than God's presence.

In fact, the Psalmist of Psalm 105 verse 4 writes: "Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always."

For us spiritually, to seek God continually in our faith lives, including our times of prayer and worship can be considered a conscious effort on our part to direct our attention and focus on our God and this makes us more aware that God is in our midst and in the fabric of our lives no matter what joys or sorrows we may be facing at any given time.

When we normally seek out someone we usually do so by the best means at our disposal. We can call them on the phone, we can text them, or reach out to them through social media. We can write to them, or even have someone else contact them on our behalf. When we seek out God, the best means at our disposal is our willingness to accept the gift and virtue of humility. It is that gift referenced by the Lord in this weekend's Gospel passage from St. Matthew when he teaches us by way of his parable: "Thus, the last will be first and the first will be last" (Matt: 20:16).

May the Lord grant you his peace and his presence.

We watch as the jets fly in with the power people and the money people, the suits, the budgets, the billions.

We wonder about monetary policy because we are among the haves, and about generosity because we care about the have-nots.

By slower modes we notice
Lazarus and the poor arriving from Africa,
and the beggars from Central Europe, and
the throng of environmentalists

of flowers and tanks
of growing things and killing fields.

We wonder about peace and war, about ecology and development, about hope and entitlement.

We listen beyond jeering protesters and soaring jets and faintly we hear the mumbling of the crucified one, something about feeding the hungry and giving drink to the thirsty, about clothing the naked, and noticing the prisoners, more about the least and about holiness among them. We are moved by the mumbles of the gospel, even while we are tenured in our privilege.

We are half ready to join the choir of hope, half afraid things might change, and in a third half of our faith turning to you, and your outpouring love that works justice and that binds us each and all to one another.

So we pray amidst jeering protesters and soaring jets. Come by here and make new, even at some risk to our entitlements.

The Archdiocese has increased the capacity for indoor gatherings for all liturgies (Masses, baptisms, weddings, funerals, etc.) to 150 people.

We will be live-streaming only one weekend Mass on a rotating basis going forward (5:15 p.m., 9:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m.). All our Daily Masses will continue to be live-streamed.

October 3 - Blessing of the Animals at noon in the labyrinth with social distancing measures in place.

October 4 - Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass returns.

CURRENT PROCEDURES FOR CHURCH

- 1. Mass Schedule: Weekday Mass Monday-Friday at 7:30 & 8:45 am. Saturday at 8:45 am; Saturday evening 5:15 p.m.; Sunday Mass 7:30 a.m., 9:30 a.m. & 11:30 a.m. All Masses will resume with the following procedures in place:
 - a. The maximum number of people who can be present for Sunday Masses is 150 people.
 - b. A mask **MUST** be worn & a distance of 6 ft must be maintained between persons outside individual families.
 - c. Registration is REQUIRED. To best protect the safety and wellness of our entire parish, the Archdiocese has mandated a registration system that will allow us to contact trace in the event that anyone becomes ill. You will be able to sign up for Masses in weekly blocks on EVENTBRITE. Go to www.stannefairlawnnj.org to sign up.
 - **d.** When Mass is over, please leave promptly so that we can immediately begin sanitizing the Church.
- 2. The Church will remain open for private prayer at the following times:

Monday-Friday: Until 5:00 pm; Saturday & Sunday: Until 2:00 pm

3. Baptisms, weddings, and funerals can be resumed with all cautionary social-distancing measures in place, with a maximum of 150 people present.

Please be aware that there still will be a risk for anyone who attends a Mass. Even with the best health practices and strict social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus.

We want to make every effort to ensure that these health practices will be followed by us. So, we all need to cooperate with each other. We're limited by the state and diocese to have no more than 150 attendees per Mass. So that's why we have to register for the Mass we want to go to. After any service, we will sanitize the church and bathrooms. I'm sure that if we follow these protocols, we can reduce the risks.

We want to thank you all for your patience and understanding. We realize that these precautions are inconvenient and cumbersome. However, our greatest priority is to help us all to worship in a setting where we all feel safe and secure. Thank you! We look forward to seeing your faces again!

FAITH FORMATION NEWS

Registration is open for the 2020/2021 Faith Formation Program year. To register, please contact the Faith Formation Staff for further information and registration materials. We can be reached at 201-791-1616, Colleen's extension is 218 and Claire's extension is 224 or email at stannefaith@gmail.com. Please know that our guidelines for the new year are still quite fluid/uncertain since we have not received updated guidelines from the Archdiocese and/or the State/Local government. Our utmost concern is for the health and safety of our entire community and for everyone's spiritual well-being. At this time, it is our intention to offer hybrid/blended programs - in-person and virtual, sessions that are limited in size and everyone will need to wear a face covering. We have developed a "REOPEN TEAM" which consists of parents and professionals to aid in developing reopening guidelines and follow through.

The Faith Formation programs available are:

SUNDAY MORNING: For: Grades 1-8 - 10:45 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

FAMILY CATECHESIS: For: Grades 6, 7 and 8 only; for families who wish to teach their children at home. Large group sessions for adults and children are held several times throughout the school year.

SPECIAL NEEDS/ANGELS CLASS: Tuesday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m.

HOME STUDY: For: Grades 1- 5 only; for families who wish to teach their children at home. Large group sessions for adults and children are held several times throughout the school year.

SUMMER FAITH - hopefully next Summer, 2021: For: Grades 1 through 6 (entering in September) From: 7 days in late June through mid July (7 days total), meet from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Students enrolling in the Summer Faith Program next year (2021) must have attended the St. Anne Faith Formation program **one year prior** to enrolling in the summer program and should be enrolled for Sunday Faith or Home Study for the 2020/2021 Faith Formation program year. If they were not enrolled in St. Anne Faith Formation Program for one year, they can enroll in the Sunday Faith or Home Study program. The only exception is for grade 1.
