First Reading: Acts 9:26-31 ✕ Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24
Gospel: John 15:1-8



Dear Friends,

Christians of the future will be mystics, or they will not exist at all. Theologian Karl Rahner, 1966

I am the (true) vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. John 15: 5-6

Jesus described himself as the “true vine” as he shared his deepest thoughts with his disciples. The adjective “true” in English usually means something honest, factual, or accurate. But, in ancient Greek, the language used in John’s gospel, the word used for true comes closer to what we want to convey in English by “faithfulness,” as in “I will never forget you,” “I will always be there for you.”

If so, then what Jesus was saying to his disciples that fateful night was that not even his impending death could separate him from them, “I will always be there for you.” Because of this kind of loving commitment to them, he was also telling them that he would always be the source of a genuinely loving life for them.

This means that Jesus’ death and resurrection revealed the full depth of the covenant that God had with his Chosen People and now with his disciples: “I will lay down my life for my friends!” His willing death showed how truly serious he was about his love for them, and for us.

He was, and still is, faithful to this love because he is the human embodiment of the love that the Father has for the Son and the Son for the Father. Since there is nothing deeper than God’s inner life, the Risen Christ revealed himself as the genuine source for a fruitful life.

Christ was about unconditional friendship with his disciples then and with us now. But we have a way of modeling our relationship with him based more on obligation than friendship. Transactional obligations focus on fulfilling a kind of “tit for tat” arrangement: if I do this for you, you will do that for me.

That’s why Jesus invited his first friends to abide with him...and he invites us to do the same. But we can’t abide with the Risen Christ the same way we abide with our human friends because we don’t see him. The basic way to abide with Christ is through mystical or contemplative time with him.

That might sound like something for monks or nuns. But we contemplate more often than we realize. To contemplate is to relish an experience, whatever it may be – a sunset, a walk, a delightful book or song, an exceptional quality of someone. Lovers do it, ball players do it before taking a shot or going up to bat, scientists do it as they examine a specimen.

Being with Christ contemplatively means, as with any friendship, spending time with him, letting him be with us and we with him. It means listening to him and letting him listen to us. It means relishing the gift of himself to us to allow his love to shape our love. It involves patience and even forgiveness, him with us and we with him! It opens us to appreciating him as he is, not simply for what we “get out of him.” It’s letting Christ get to know us as we share who we really are with him, which in turn helps us to be more understanding and accepting of our foibles. That in turn heals us of our brokenness so that we don’t project our darkness onto others.

Let me stress again: abiding with Christ cannot be limited to a Sunday morning or Saturday evening. It is not satisfying an obligation so we can get on with our “real lives.” Because it’s a friendship, it takes consistency, real time each day. As Jesus insisted in his True Vine description of himself, this helps us to keep in mind what genuine love is about – his unconditional self-gift to us. We’re meant to imitate him. That means, as St Augustine said of the Eucharist, becoming who we receive.

ARCHDIOCESAN 2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2024 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.**

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY MASSES

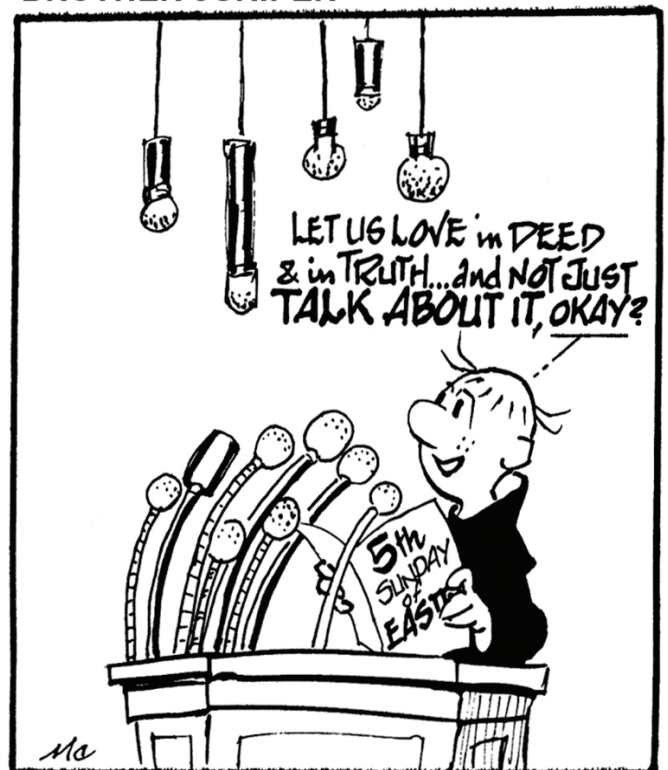

2. From the homepage, check the left-hand menu options. The second to last menu option says “envelopes & online giving.” Click that link, and a page with various giving options will appear. Select the Online Giving option to be taken directly to the system.
3. Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says **Create New Account**. Next you will see **New User Account Registration**. Fill out the form and click “submit.”

When you are enrolled, you can go into **Manage My Account**, where you will see **My Payment Methods**. Here you can choose to have the funds deducted from your checking or bank account (you will need your routing and account numbers on hand). Under **Manage My Account**, you will also see **Give a New Gift**. There you will decide when and how much to give. (In the list, Offertory Collection means the Sunday collection.) You can select recurring or one time gifts. You also have the option to access all the other special envelopes you would normally find in your envelope packet and which are generally one-time donations.
