First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17 ✠ Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19



Dear Friends,

And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan.

The famous Lutheran theologian, Paul Tillich, who died in the middle of the last century, wrote an autobiography, which he entitled *On the Boundary*. It was a very descriptive title. You see, he and his family were immigrants to the United States from Germany in the 1930's. Tillich had been very vocal about the dangers of Naziism.

Hence the title of his book. He spent over 50 years of his life living on the boundary between English and German, between democratic America and a totalitarian Germany. He also lived on the boundaries between different educational and religious systems, European and American, and different academic careers, as an author of popular books and a sought-after speaker while being a scholarly theologian.

To live on the boundaries of life well requires a kind of conversion, a shift in how one lives within one group while still mentally sharing life in another group. Tillich's autobiography describes how he did that. "Living on the boundary" also describes how the Samaritan lived in the worlds he inhabited, especially before and after he met Jesus. And it describes how we are being called to live our Christian lives today.

What boundary experiences did the Samaritan have? Initially, he lived as a Samaritan between Galilee and Judea. Once he became leprous, however, he had to adjust to life being ostracized by both Samaritans and Jews. As a leper, he must have felt the oddity of being a Samaritan living with Jewish lepers. While misery loves company, he was an outcast among outcasts and an outcast within an outcast group.

And then came Jesus! You can hear the shift that happened to the Samaritan leper. "Realizing that he had been healed" he went back to the healer, glorifying God, falling at Jesus' feet, thanking the Lord. All those movements tell us of a new way of being aware of how God had entered his life. He no longer thought of God as dwelling in the temple on the Samaritan mountain, Gerizim, or in the Jewish Temple on Zion. *He fell at the feet of Jesus, glorifying God in the process, thanking God as revealed in Jesus.*

He had experienced God in a new way through the humanity of Jesus! His gratitude became more focused and thus more personal, not just going through the Torah ritual of rejoining God's People. He had found a whole new people with whom he could belong; to worship God as a disciple of Jesus: through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ.

Cardinal Tobin's call to "pastoral conversion" is not unlike what the Samaritan or Tillich found in their boundary experiences. The circumstances of our times, he says, are challenging our personal and time-honored ways as parishes to experience Christ. To do this, will mean risking redefining our parish boundaries so we can still be Catholic but be so through some new relationships.

This will mean breaking boundaries by reaching out to some new people in our midst: people from different communities, who, although as Catholic as we are, are used to worshipping God, forming community, and working with each other in ways somewhat differently than ours. This will be hard...but St. Anne has gone through a change like this in our recent past, in 2005, when the Franciscans moved out.

Like the Samaritan, we will still be experiencing God. But now we may find him with those who are Catholics, or former Catholics, or non-practicing. We will have to welcome each other as brothers and sisters of the same Christ. We will have to think of building our communities not as we have always done so, but with new ways that will work better because of these challenges. No doubt, this will be an adjustment for all of us. Because we are Catholics, however, the Spirit of Christ will help us be better Christians.

Go to the DONATE button in the top right hand corner of the homepage

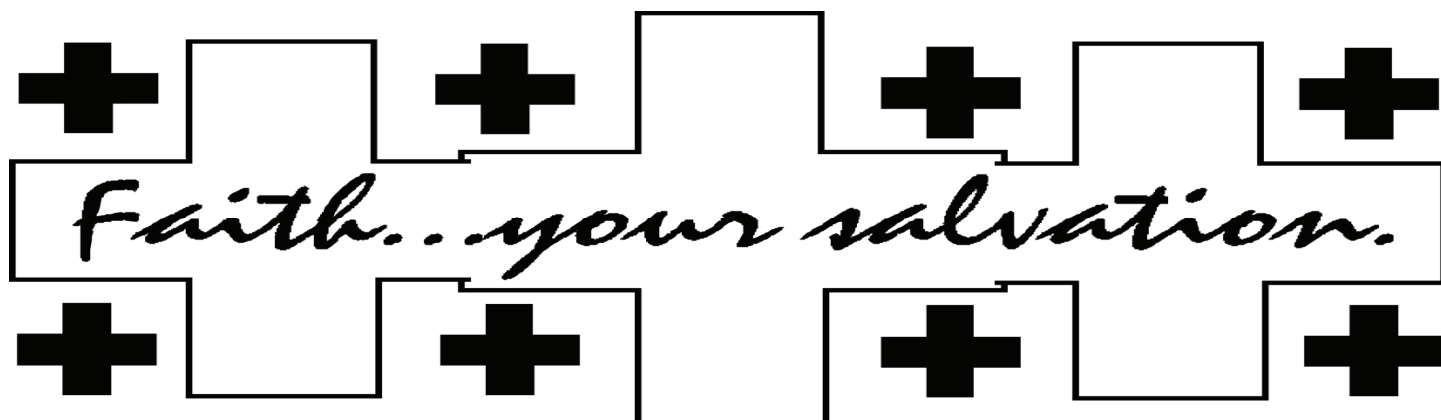
Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says **Create New Account**.
