SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT ✕ MARCH 1, 2026

First Reading: Genesis 12:1-4a ✕ Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:8b-10
Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9



In December of 1997 I became a professed member of the Secular Franciscan Order, formally called the Order of Penance, as well as the Third Order of the Franciscan Family, joining the Friars Minor (1st Order) and the Poor Clares (2nd Order). Members of the Secular Order includes men and women as well as diocesan priests and deacons. It is still regarded as the largest religious order in the Church today. Here at St. Anne Parish, we have our own group of Seculars called the Fraternity of St. Anne. When I was professed, Fr. Richard Trezza OFM, presided at the Liturgy of Profession at Assumption Church in Wood Ridge, NJ. Recently he and I collaborated on a hymn entitled: *“That Place at Christmastime.”* In 1224, remembering his visit to the Holy Land (especially Bethlehem), Saint Francis of Assisi had the idea to replicate the manger scene in his native Italy. In this year of St. Francis commemorating the 800th anniversary of the transitus (or passing) of St. Francis in 1226, Fr. Trezza and I wrote the hymn, which was first played on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord at St. Anthony Church in Butler, NJ to mark the end of the Christmas Season and apparently the start of the Year of St. Francis. The refrain is this: *“That place, that place where the Bethlehem child smiled at the Poverello. That place, that place at Christmastime in the town of Greccio.”*

On January 10, 2026 (On the Vigil of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord), Pope Leo asked that a Decree be issued entitled: *“On the Eighth Centenary of the Death of St. Francis of Assisi, A Special Jubilee Year is Being Announced.”* In the Decree these words were stated: *“His Holiness Pope Leo XIV, Minister of our faith and our joy, establishes that, from January 10, 2026, to coincide with the closing of the Ordinary Jubilee, until 10 January 2027, a special Year of St. Francis may be proclaimed, in which every Christian faithful, following the example of the Saint of Assisi, may him/herself become a model of holiness of life and a constant witness of peace.”*

Now that you and I are entering upon our Lenten Pilgrimage at this time, it may be apropos to honor the special year of St. Francis decree by learning more about the “Poverello” or “poor man” as he was called. In the Divine Comedy writing of the Italian poet Dante, St. Francis was described at the time of his birth in 1181 as this: “A sun was born into the world.” One of my favorite books on St. Francis is: “St. Francis of Assisi” by G.K. Chesterton. A good YouTube video on St. Francis is: “The INSPIRING Life of St. Francis of Assisi.” May these and other resources at the genesis of Lent help us to “become a model of holiness and a constant witness of peace.”

With a friendly wink and a prayer or two for you and your families. Have a Blessed Sunday, and a wonderful start to the First Lenten week ahead. May this Lenten Season give you the peace and joy of St. Francis.

Online Giving...

You have the opportunity to make donations to our Sunday collection online!

To sign up, go to the St. Anne website – www.stannefairlawnnj.org

Go to the DONATE button in the top right hand corner of the homepage

Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says **Create New Account**.

Next you will see **New User Account Registration**. Fill out the form and click "submit."

When you are enrolled, you can go into **Manage My Account**, where you will see **My Payment Methods**. Here you can choose to have the funds deducted from your checking or bank account (you will need your routing and account numbers on hand). Under **Manage My Account**, you will also see **Give a New Gift**. There you will decide when and how much to give. (In the list, Offertory Collection means the Sunday collection.) You can select recurring or one time gifts. You also have the option to access all the other special envelopes you would normally find in your envelope packet and which are generally one-time donations.

Each time you go to Mass, get a card that says "I have made my donation online" and put it in the collection when the usher comes around. Thanks so much for giving online!

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2026 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22, 2026 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 31, 2026.**

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

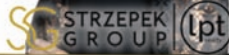
