Dear Friends,

I read an interesting comment the other day. The writer noted:

Most people in most centuries have believed in the existence of God or gods. It may well be in fact that human beings in aggregate and through the centuries have given more attention and concern to divinity than to all their other concerns put together - food, housing, clothing, pleasure, work, family whatever.

This person makes an important point about the power of belief. If he's right, it's a given in most of history. I think, however, that the more important question is: what difference has belief made? It certainly has also generated fear, motivated violence, and encouraged many to find ways to get around the perceived anger of the divinity in which they believe.

The basic meaning of belief is to trust that something is so because of the word of another. I have never personally seen Australia, but I believe that it exists because others I trust have said it does. But will that make any real difference to how I live? This kind of belief is about facts and there are many who have reduced God to a fact and that's basically it.

If we read the Scriptures, beginning with the Hebrew ones and into our Christian ones, belief in God is a given there too. But the Scriptures aren't trying to convince us that there is a god. Their concern is to proclaim that God is so in love with us that he can be trusted with our lives.

That's what Jesus said: "Even the hairs on your heads are counted by him." He wants more than acknowledgment. He is so concerned about how we live with each other that he joined us in the work of daily life. And, as this Sunday's Gospel reminds us, God is so infinitely patient with us that he's willing to give us all, even the worst of us, time to get our act together: "Let the wheat and the weeds grow together until harvest. Then collect the weeds for burning and gather the wheat into my barn."

And, let's not make a mistake about that last line. The "burning" isn't a description of punishment in hell. It's the "hell" we create with each other when we don't work on God's challenge to "love one another as we love ourselves."

This is why a life of prayer is so important. I don't mean prayer as only seeking something from God. Jesus' vision about his Father was that God is permanently engaging us at every moment. That was so real for him that he died living that vision. After he rose, his earliest followers trusted, not just in words about the vision, but how he was fulfilling it by his continued living presence in their midst. It's this vision that must become our vision.

This is what a life of prayer can do for us. It's primarily a life of friendship with God as revealed by Jesus, as the one who wants to engage us in and through our daily lives.

Like any friendship, it begins by paying attention to how God does enter our lives now. It happens as we take chances that how he wants us to live really does enhance our relationships. We discover that when our use of our time and talents to love each other – to live for them not just for ourselves, to show compassion and justice, to challenge each other to be our best, to forgive - does make a difference. We begin to discover personally and patiently that God is really good and that we can grow in that trust in him.

It's then that we can begin to let God have a real say in our lives. That's when prayer becomes most real, most Christlike. Let's find out together how we can do this.

Online Giving...

You have the opportunity to make donations to our Sunday collection online!

To sign up, go to the St. Anne website – www.stannefairlaw.nj.org

Go to the DONATE button in the top right hand corner of the homepage

Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says **Create New Account**.

Next you will see **New User Account Registration**. Fill out the form and click "submit."

When you are enrolled, you can go into **Manage My Account**, where you will see **My Payment Methods**. Here you can choose to have the funds deducted from your checking or bank account (you will need your routing and account numbers on hand). Under **Manage My**

Account, you will also see **Give a New Gift**. There you will decide when and how much to give. (In the list, Offertory Collection means the Sunday collection.) You can select recurring or one time gifts. You also have the option to access all the other special envelopes you would normally find in your envelope packet and which are generally one-time donations. Each time you go to Mass, get a card that says "I have made my donation online" and put it in the collection when the usher comes around. Thanks so much for giving online!
