First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9 ✠ Second Reading: Romans 12:1-2
Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27



Dear Friends,

Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.
(Matt 16: 25-26)

Jesus uttered these words in Matthew's gospel at a crucial moment in the story. Peter, alone among the apostles, had just recognized Jesus as the Messiah. He then protested the Lord's willingness to endure suffering and death.

Peter's protest was very understandable. Crucifixion was not just a horrible way to die. The Romans used it to say, in effect, "You're nothing to us". It was the ultimate way the empire controlled its subject population.

So why would Jesus embrace such a horrible death. It tells us something about just how seriously God took the damaging effects of sinfulness in all of our lives.

The essence of sin, in the Scriptures, was separating ourselves from God. We do that whenever we treat ourselves and others unjustly, disrespectfully, violating their dignity, or acting violently toward others.

What motivates us to act toward others in these ways? It's the self-hatred we are not good enough. So we need to show that we're better than others for one reason or another. We forget that we are all children the same God. We're made in his image and likeness. Basically, when we get caught up in this attitude, we're claiming that our vision of ourselves is better than God's vision.

Hence Jesus told us to remember our shared dignity by sharing our crosses with each other. We're in the same boat, being human only works when we work with each other, not against others.

To honestly love God is to love our neighbor. The best way to do this is to let the Risen Christ inspire us to live toward each other as he did and still does.

That's how his cross and resurrection saves us from sin. Christ gave himself into the hands of those who killed him, forgiving them as his sisters and brothers, for as the son of Mary, they shared his humanity. As the Son of God, they were his daughters and sons, made in his image and likeness.

As the Eucharist reveals each time we gather to celebrate with Christ, God continues to challenge us with the power of his nonviolent healing of our tendency to make ourselves more important than others. "Nothing" as St. Paul wrote, "can separate us from God!" Christ continues to show us his Eternal Communion with us no matter what!

At the time of his reaction to Jesus foretelling the kind of Messiah he would be, Peter wanted Jesus to be a "warrior messiah." He wanted a messiah who would defeat the enemies of his country. That however would just continue the status quo between nations and people.

Christ was, and still is, the true Messiah and Lord. Even now, he overcomes our acts of separation towards one another and towards our very selves. In Him sin is defeated by his eternal solidarity with us and our mission in this world is confirmed. Opening our hearts to him opens us to the stewardship in which we all share.

As always, there will be an 8:45 am Mass on Saturday.



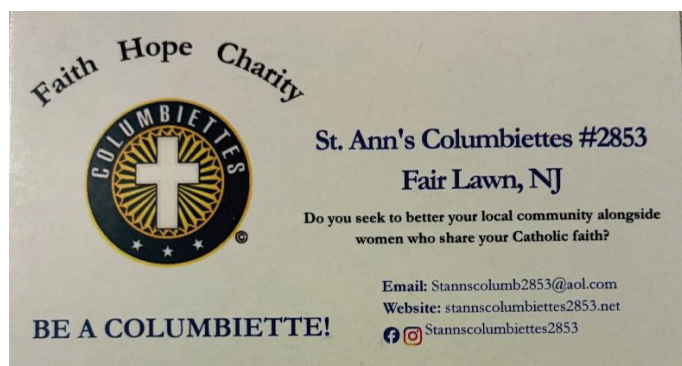
The need for food is steadily rising in our area month to month. Please help us keep up with the growing need for food by donating to our parish Food Pantry.

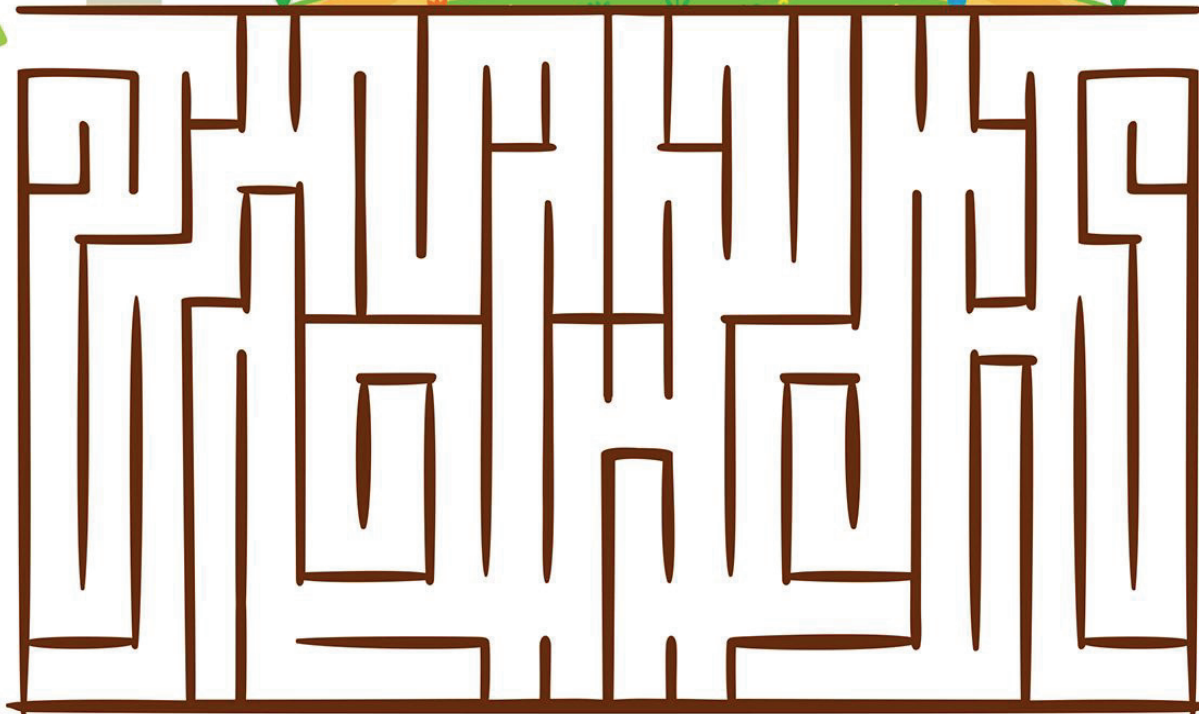

To sign up, go to the St. Anne website – www.stannefairlawnnj.org

Go to the DONATE button in the top right hand corner of the homepage

Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says **Create New Account**.

Next you will see **New User Account Registration**. Fill out the form and click "submit."

When you are enrolled, you can go into **Manage My Account**, where you will see **My Payment Methods**. Here you can choose to have the funds deducted from your checking or bank account (you will need your routing and account numbers on hand). Under **Manage My**

Account, you will also see **Give a New Gift**. There you will decide when and how much to give. (In the list, Offertory Collection means the Sunday collection.) You can select recurring or one time gifts. You also have the option to access all the other special envelopes you would normally find in your envelope packet and which are generally one-time donations. Each time you go to Mass, get a card that says "I have made my donation online" and put it in the collection when the usher comes around. Thanks so much for giving online!

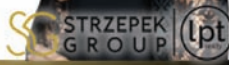
