"GOD'S LOVE LETTER"

Today is the Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time and our readings concern themselves with Faith, Sacred Scripture, and Persistent Prayer. In the first reading from the Book of Exodus, we find Moses displaying great Faith by lifting his mighty staff and invoking God's powerful authority to defeat the enemy. Although exhausted, Moses persisted with the help of others and successfully achieved Victory. Moses's actions are a witness of trust in God's love and goodness. How deep is your own faith believing the Lord is in your corner, working to bring about Victory for you? In today's Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the dishonest judge and a widow who procures a just decision by her persistence, saying; "I tell you, will God not see to it that justice is done for those who call out to Him day and night, yet when the Son of Man comes, will He find Faith on earth?" We can only develop a "Moses kind of Faith" by delving into the Holy Scriptures, the Living Word of God. Saint Paul urges you to; "Remain faithful, all Scripture is inspired by God whether convenient or inconvenient. Through Faith in Christ Jesus the one who belongs to God may be competent and equipped for every good work." We must stay true to the teachings of Christ and be careful not to muddy the Scriptures with our own opinions or politics. Beware of false teachings that twist the Lord's words to support a deceptive agenda. TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So, two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.


