

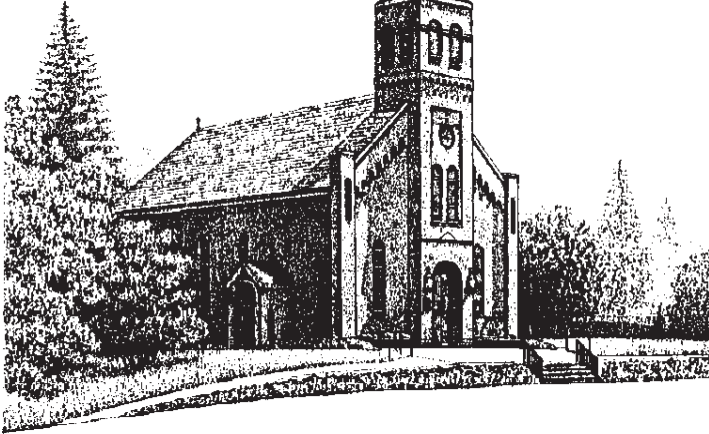

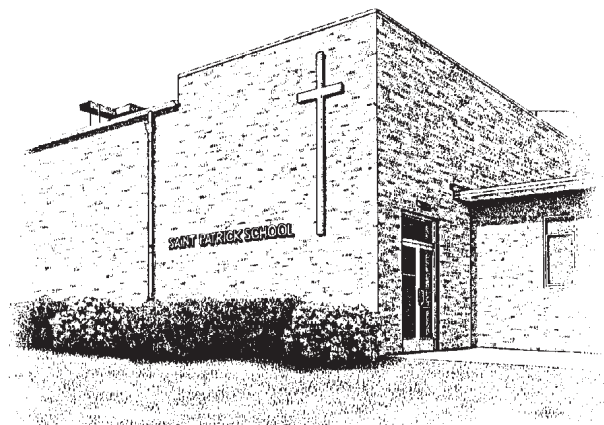

First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God told Abram that he would give him the land of Egypt and his descendants would become a great people. Abram then made sacrifices to God, cutting them in half. A torch passed between the pieces, as a visible sign to Abram of God's promise.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17-4:1

Paul urges the Philippians to avoid becoming too interested in material possessions. He reminds them that their most important wealth is their faith in Jesus, which will lead them to eternal life.

Gospel: Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus took Peter, John and James to a mountain to pray. When his clothes grew incredibly white, Moses and Elijah appeared. They spoke of the scripture he was to fulfill. Then a cloud came down and a voice said, "This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to him." The disciples who had seen Jesus' glory did not disclose this experience to anyone until much later.

REQUIREMENTS FOR BAPTISM

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Joseph, Husband of Our Lady St. Mary
March 19th (First Century)

According to the Roman Martyrology, March 19th is "the (heavenly) birthday of St. Joseph, husband of the most Blessed Virgin Mary and confessor, whom the Supreme Pontiff Pius IX, assenting the desires and prayers of the whole Catholic world, had proclaimed patron of the Universal Church." The history of his life, says Butler, has not been written by men, but his principal actions, through the inspired evangelists, are recorded by the Holy Ghost Himself. What is told in the gospels concerning him is so familiar that it needs no commentary. He was of royal descent and his genealogy has been set out for us both by St. Matthew and by St. Luke. He was the protector of our Lady's good name, and in that character of necessity the confidant of Heaven's secrets, and he was the foster-father of Jesus, charged with the guidance and support of the holy family, and responsible in some sense for the education of Him who, though divine, loved to call Himself 'the son of man'. It was Joseph's trade that Jesus learned, it was his manner of speech that the boy imitated, it was he whom our Lady herself seemed to invest with full parental rights when she said without qualification, 'Thy father and I have sought thee sorrowing'. No wonder that the evangelist adopted her phrase and tells us, in connection with the incidents which attended the Child's presentation in the Temple, that "His father and mother were wondering at those things which were spoken concerning Him." None the less our positive knowledge concerning St. Joseph's life is very restricted. We may assume that he was betrothed to Mary his bride with the formalities prescribed by Jewish ritual, but the nature of this ceremonial is not clearly known, especially in the case of the poor; and that Joseph and Mary were poor is proved by the offering of only a pair of turtle-doves at Mary's purification in the Temple. We must be content to know the simple facts that when Mary's pregnancy had saddened her husband his fears were set at rest by an angelic vision, that he was again warned by angels—first to seek refuge in Egypt, and afterwards to return to Palestine—that he was present at Bethlehem when our Lord was laid in the manger and the shepherds came to worship Him, that he was present also when the Infant was placed in the arms of Holy Simeon, and finally that he shared his wife's sorrow at the loss of her Son and her joy when they found Him debating with the doctors in the Temple. St. Joseph's merit is summed up in the phrase that "he was a just man", that is to say, a godly man. This was the eulogy of Holy Writ itself.

Dear Parishioners,

On Wednesday, March 6th, at Community Board 3 there was a transportation meeting that talked about the widening of Arthur Kill Road from Richmond Avenue to Clarke Avenue. This widening will take place in eight phases, starting at Richmond Avenue and moving toward Clarke Avenue, in 2021. But, once that is completed and four lanes stretch from Richmond to Clarke, there will be a "bottleneck" at Clarke and we are afraid that at that point the City will resurrect the LOOP proposal.

The "Loop" provided for a widening of Clarke Avenue to St. Patrick's Place and a widening of the street in front of the church with a continuation of St. Patrick's Place through the woods behind St. Andrews Hall, connecting with Richmond Hill Road. This would be disastrous for St. Patrick's because a major street would be going past our church, parking on the street would be eliminated, and the constant traffic would weaken the structure of our landmark church.

All the traffic coming down the hill from the mall would be backed up at Clarke Ave, on St. Patrick's Place, and up the hill. What is supposed to alleviate the traffic problem on Staten Island will only make it worse. When the traffic is backed up people will use the side streets, Center and West Cedarview, and the overflow will spill into Richmondtown, perhaps as far as Wilder. This will create another traffic problem that will have to be fixed by another project that will claim to be solving the problem that they themselves created.

We need all of you to write to your city officials: Joseph Borrelli, Steven Matteo, and James Oddo to express your opposition to this Loop. We also need as many people as possible to attend the Community Board 3 meetings: Land Use, Wednesday, March 13th at 7:30pm in the Board Headquarters, 1243 Woodrow Rd, 2nd Floor in the Woodrow Shopping Center and for the General Meeting on Tuesday March 26th at 7:30pm at the Woodrow Methodist Church, 1075 Woodrow Road. We will keep you informed about developments and any future meetings.

City Officials may tell you that the Loop is not in the plan, but the problem is that it is in the NEXT PLAN, THE HIDDEN PLAN which will be activated before we have a chance to react. So, we must remain vigilant.

The Loop would mean the end of meaningful access to St. Patrick's Church for Sunday Mass. There would be no parking and the traffic in the area would be so horrendous that people would opt to go to another church rather than face the chaos. We would be forced to have our Sunday Masses in the Worship Center and our beautiful, historic church would sit dormant for much of the time.

We can't let that happen.
