

DO YOU PRAY FOR DECEASED PRIESTS?

On this **Father's Day**, I

appeal, on behalf of my deceased brothers, for your prayers. As I often note, I rarely find the name of a **Clergyman, Nun, Religious Sister** or **Brother** on **All Souls' Day Memorial Envelopes**. Please do NOT assume we go right to **heaven**; like you, we need prayers and sacrifices offered in our memory! **Bishops, Priests** and **Deacons** can easily remember to pray for our deceased brothers through what is called an '**Ordo**'.

An **Ordo**, **Latin** for '**Order**', is a small booklet particular to each **Province**; our **Province** is comprised of the **5 NJ Roman Catholic Dioceses**. One side of each **Ordo** page lists the prescribed **Readings, Orations, Liturgical Color, Ranking** [**Solemnity, Feast, Memorial, Optional Memorial**] and all options and updates for each day of the year. The other side lists the name of/year in which a **Bishop, Priest** or **Deacon** in the **Archdiocese of Newark** or **Dioceses** of **Trenton, Camden, Paterson** or **Metuchen**, died on that day. The earliest are **Rev. James Murray: 1854**; exact date unknown, and **Rev. Rudolph Etthoffer: June 30, 1855**; the **highest** number of deaths: **20**, is on **May 23**; the average is 6 or 7 per day. Use the orations below, made singular/ plural, to pray for the deceased **Priests** who ministered to you.

Collect - For Deceased Priests - A

Grant, we pray, O Lord, that the soul[s] of N., your servant[s] and Priest[s], whom you honored with sacred office while he/they lived in this world, may exult for ever in the glorious home of heaven.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

PLEASE RETURN THE FAVOR! A **Priest's** essential ministry is to pray, intercede, and offer sacrifice for those entrusted to his care ... and for all the world. When we die, we need you to return the favor by praying, interceding, and offering sacrifice for us. The above quote in the clipart, from **Saint Joseph Moscati, [1880-1927]** Italian biochemist, professor and physician dedicated to the care of the poor, attests to what I said about the absence of deceased **Clergy** and

Religious on **All Souls' Memorials**. We who bring your loved ones to their grave after ministering to and guiding them toward **heaven** need your help so we can also attain **eternal glory**!

Prayer over the Offerings - For Deceased Priests - A

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that through these holy mysteries N., your servant[s] and Priest[s], may behold with clarity for ever what he/they faithfully ministered here. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PRIESTS ARE SINNERS, TOO! While I know we all know this sad truth, some never consider or forget this harsh reality: to destroy the **Church, Satan** usually starts with her **Priests**. As **Saint Teresa of Avila** noted: **"Behind each Priest is a demon fighting for his fall. If we have the language to criticize them, we must have twice as much to pray for him."** Even though we handle **Divine Mysteries** and preach the **Gospel Truth**, we, like you, struggle to live by it, day after day. And as we hear your **Confessions**, we become more painfully aware of our own faults and failings. Again, **prayers** and **sacrifices** are essential for our salvation - while we are in **this** world - and when we pass into the **next** world!

Prayer after Communion - For Deceased Priests - A

Having received the Sacrament of salvation, we implore your kindness, O God, for N., your servant[s] and Priest[s], that, as you made him/them a steward of your mysteries on earth, so you may bring him/them to be nourished by their truth and reality as unveiled in heaven.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PERFECTION IS ONLY FOUND IN HEAVEN.

As **Saint Paul** said: **"At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully ..."** [1 Corinthians 13:12] While this means that the words and deeds of **Priests** will always be imperfect, it gets worse. For as the **Archbishop Fulton Sheen** reminded us: **"Satan always tempts the pure. The rest are already his."** So, please pray that **God** forgives all **Priests**, living and deceased, for their faults, and rewards them for their goodness.

NARTHEX CHAIRS. Since all are called to be active participants, not 'sideliners,' in the Sacred Mysteries, most Narthex chairs have been removed. With lower Mass attendance this time of year, there is ample space in the church for worshippers. Those needing to sit in a chair, rather than a pew, may use the chairs along the walls inside of the church and those in the 'choir loft.' With vacations, we do not have the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion [EM's] needed to distribute the Sacrament in the back of the church. To find out if you fulfill the requirements to become an EM, please contact the Parish Office. As always, those unable to walk to the Sanctuary should alert an Usher, who guides the EM assigned to bring Holy Communion to those unable to walk to the Sanctuary. Since Narthex seating extends the time needed for Holy Communion, all chairs will be removed if the proper use of chairs is abused. Latecomers: please wait for an Usher to seat you so as not to disturb the other worshippers.







Blessing of a Father

Adapted from the Roman Catholic Church's Book of Blessings

After all have gathered around the Father to be blessed, all make the Sign of the Cross as the leader begins the Rite of Blessing.

leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

all: Amen.

leader: Brothers and sisters, let us bless the Lord Jesus,
who in the womb of the Virgin Mary became one of us. Blessed be God now and for ever.

all: Blessed be God now and for ever.

Then another person proclaims the sacred scripture.

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

Brothers and sisters, listen to a reading from the Book of Sirach

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons.

Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them.

When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother.

Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard.

Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother.

My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives.

Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life;
kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins

- a house raised in justice to you.

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

leader: Let us now ask God's blessing on all those He has blessed with the grace of fatherhood.

O God, author and sustainer of human life, from your goodness your servant *N.*
has received the joy of becoming a father.

Graciously accept our thanks and give ear to our prayers:
defend this father and his *child/children* from every evil,
be their companion along their pathway through life,
and welcome them one day into the joys of your eternal home.

Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

or:

O God, our every blessing comes from you
and you welcome the simple prayers of those who bless your name.

Grant that *this father / these fathers* may live in reliance on your goodness and in thanksgiving to you.

Give to him and his *child/children* the joyful reassurance that you are always near to protect them.

Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The leader invokes God's blessing on the Father[s] and all present by signing himself/herself with the Sign of the Cross and saying:

May the tender love of the Father, the peace of his Son, the grace and strength of the Holy Spirit
preserve you to live by the light of faith and to reach the promise of eternal happiness.

And may almighty God bless us all, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Order for Visiting a Cemetery on Father's Day

Blessing a Tombstone, Grave Marker or Monument

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader begins.

leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

leader: Praised be God our Father, who raised Jesus Christ from the dead. Blessed be God for ever.

all: Blessed be God for ever.

Then the leader says:

My dear friends, we gather today to pray for our brother *N*. whose body lies here in rest. He has passed from death to life in company with the Lord Jesus, who died and rose to new life, and is purified now of all his faults. We pray that God may welcome *N*. among all the saints of heaven.

All listen as another person proclaims the sacred Scriptures from Sirach 44: 1, 10-15.

Brothers and sisters, listen to a reading from the Book of Sirach

Now will I praise those godly men [and women], our ancestors, each in his own time: These also were godly men [and women] whose virtues have not been forgotten; Their wealth remains in their families, their heritage with their descendants; through God's covenant with them their family endures, their posterity, for their sake. And for all time their progeny will endure, their glory will never be blotted out; Their bodies are peacefully laid away, but their name lives on and on. At gatherings their wisdom is retold, and the assembly proclaims their praise.

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**







New Jersey Safe Haven Law

Under the New Jersey Safe Haven Infant Protection Act a person may give up an unwanted infant anonymously. The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed from unsafe abandonment. A distressed parent who is unable to care for an infant can give up custody of a baby less than 30 days old safely, legally and anonymously. All that is required is that the baby be brought to any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squads in New Jersey that are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required. The parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline - 877-839-2339 - and get the address and directions for any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squad in the state.
