This Week:

Sunday of Divine Mercy

1st Reading: Acts 2:42-47

2nd Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Today's Gospel invites us to reflect on the parts of our lives where we feel closed off, like the disciples hiding behind locked doors. These doors aren't physical, but emotional and spiritual, built from fear, regret, disappointment, or doubt. We often carry the weight of our mistakes and assume that if God were to meet us there, it would be with judgment or disappointment.

But instead, Jesus enters that very space and offers peace. He doesn't demand explanations or perfection; He simply says, "Peace be with you." This is the essence of Divine Mercy, God meeting us not when we have everything figured out, but precisely when we feel lost or unworthy. So often, we tell ourselves that we'll move forward once we've fixed everything, that we'll feel worthy once we've done better.

But Divine Mercy turns that thinking upside down. God doesn't wait for us to be perfect, He comes to us as we are. Even in doubt, like Thomas, who needed to see and touch to believe, Jesus responds with patience and understanding rather than rejection. This reminds us that faith doesn't have to be flawless; it just has to be honest.

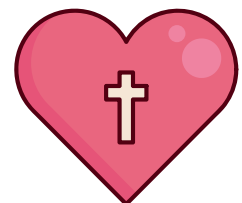

The Little Catholic's Corner



Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that Jesus loves us no matter what. In the Gospel, the disciples were hiding because they were scared and unsure of what would happen next. They even locked the doors! But Jesus still came to them. He didn't get angry or scold them. Instead, He said, "Peace be with you." That means He wanted them to feel calm, safe, and loved. This shows us that even when we feel afraid, make mistakes, or mess up, Jesus doesn't turn away from us, He comes closer.

Jesus also showed the disciples His wounds to remind them how much He loves them. His love is so big that He gave everything for them and for us too. Then there was Thomas, who said he wouldn't believe unless he could see Jesus himself. When Jesus came back, He didn't get mad at Thomas. He helped him believe. This teaches us that it's okay to have questions sometimes. Jesus understands and is patient with us. Divine Mercy Sunday is a reminder that we can always go to Jesus, no matter what. When we feel sad, scared, or guilty, we can talk to Him and trust that He forgives us and loves us.

EASTER BIBLE STUDY



This six-week book study will survey the First Letter of St. Peter, one of the seven Catholic epistles written to early Christians in Asia Minor. We will explore how this letter speaks to communities whose newfound faith in the crucified and risen Jesus made them strangers among their own—exiles in their native land—radically changing their relationship to the world around them.

As we see how St. Peter's wisdom helped these early believers navigate the competing demands of Caesar and Christ, we will discover how his insights, born of his encounter with the risen Christ, can shape how we think, speak, and act today. In this way, we will learn to live as an Easter people even now, "during the time of our exile," as we await the glory of the Resurrection.

This study begins on Tuesday, April 14 (Friday, April 17 for the Friday group) and wraps up on Friday, May 22.

APRIL 16 ST. BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS

Saint Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844 in Lourdes to a very poor family and suffered from asthma and fragile health throughout her life. At just 14 years old, she began experiencing a series of 18 apparitions of the Virgin Mary between February 11 and July 16, 1858, in a grotto called Massabielle near the Gave River.

During the first apparition, Bernadette saw a beautiful young lady dressed in white with a blue sash, holding a rosary, with yellow roses at her feet. Over the course of the apparitions, the Lady called Bernadette to prayer, penance, and conversion for sinners. She asked that a chapel be built at the site and that people come there in procession. One of the most significant moments occurred when the Lady instructed Bernadette to dig in the ground, eventually revealing a spring of water that continues to flow to this day and has been associated with many healings.

At first, Bernadette faced intense skepticism and questioning from both civil authorities and Church leaders. Despite this, she remained consistent and simple in her testimony, never changing her account. On March 25, the Lady finally revealed her identity, saying, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Despite the fame surrounding the events, Bernadette chose a hidden life, entering the Sisters of Notre Dame of Nevers, where she lived in humility and prayer. She died in 1879 at age 35 and was canonized in 1933.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: A CELEBRATION OF GOD'S BOUNDLESS LOVE



Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated on the Sunday after Easter, invites the faithful to encounter the infinite mercy of God in a deeply personal and transformative way. Instituted by Pope John Paul II in 2000, this feast stems from the private revelations received by Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, a humble Polish nun who, through her diary, shared God's call for the world to trust in His mercy.

At the heart of Divine Mercy Sunday is the image of Jesus as He appeared to Saint Faustina, with rays of red and pale light streaming from His heart, symbolizing the Blood and Water that flowed from His side on the Cross. These rays remind us that Christ's sacrifice was not only for our redemption but also a fountain of healing for our souls. Jesus promised that those who receive His mercy with trust will experience profound grace, forgiveness, and spiritual renewal. He said to Saint Faustina: "On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened."

Divine Mercy Sunday emphasizes that God's mercy is limitless. No matter how far we have strayed, how deep our sin, or how broken our hearts, God's love is always ready to embrace and transform us. The feast encourages us to participate in the Sacraments, especially Confession and the Eucharist, and to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Through these devotions, we not only receive God's mercy but also strengthen our relationship with Him, gaining the courage to live in holiness and compassion.

Yet Divine Mercy Sunday is not only about receiving mercy; it is also a call to act. Christ asks us to become instruments of His mercy in our daily lives. We are called to forgive those who have hurt us, to help those in need, and to speak words of hope to the weary. By showing mercy to others, we participate in the mission of Christ, bringing His light into a world often clouded by judgment, division, and despair. Saint Faustina wrote, "Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy."

God's love does not measure our worth by our achievements or failures but by the sincerity of our hearts. By trusting in His mercy, we are freed from guilt, renewed in hope, and empowered to live lives marked by love and service. By extending mercy to others, we bear witness to Christ's presence in the world, reminding all that no one is beyond the reach of God's love.

FAITH OF OUR FATHERS: **SAINT AUGUSTINE**



This week's Faith of Our Fathers features an excerpt from a Paschal homily of St. Augustine of Hippo in which he describes the power of Baptism as a sacrament of new life which “begins here and now” with the forgiveness of our sins, but whose fullness we will only experience in the resurrection at the end of time. In the meantime we walk by faith, as pilgrims whose life is hid with the risen Christ in God. Finally, Augustine reflects on the deeper meaning of the Easter Octave which we celebrate today.

From a sermon by Saint Augustine, bishop

(Sermo 8 in octava Paschae 1, 4: PL 46, 838, 841)

A new creation in Christ

I speak to you who have just been reborn in baptism, my little children in Christ, you who are the new offspring of the Church, gift of the Father, proof of Mother Church's fruitfulness. All of you who stand fast in the Lord are a holy seed, a new colony of bees, the very flower of our ministry and fruit of our toil, my joy and my crown. It is the words of the Apostle that I address to you: *Put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh and its desires, so that you may be clothed with the life of him whom you have put on in this sacrament. You have all been clothed with Christ by your baptism in him. There is neither Jew nor Greek; there is neither slave nor freeman; there is neither male nor female; you are all one in Christ Jesus.*

Such is the power of this sacrament: it is a sacrament of new life which begins here and now with the forgiveness of all past sins, and will be brought to completion in the resurrection of the dead. *You have been buried with Christ by baptism into death in order that, as Christ has risen from the dead, you also may walk in newness of life.*

You are walking now by faith, still on pilgrimage in a mortal body away from the Lord; but he to whom your steps are directed is himself the sure and certain way for you: Jesus Christ, who for our sake became man. For all who fear him he has stored up abundant happiness, which he will reveal to those who hope in him, bringing it to completion when we have attained the reality which even now we possess in hope.

This is the octave day of your new birth. Today is fulfilled in you the sign of faith that was prefigured in the Old Testament by the circumcision of the flesh on the eighth day after birth. When the Lord rose from the dead, he put off the mortality of the flesh; his risen body was still the same body, but it was no longer subject to death. By his resurrection he consecrated Sunday, or the Lord's day. Though the third after his passion, this day is the eighth after the Sabbath, and thus also the first day of the week. And so your own hope of resurrection, though not yet realised, is sure and certain, because you have received the sacrament or sign of this reality, and have been given the pledge of the Spirit. *If, then, you have risen with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your hearts on heavenly things, not the things that are on earth. For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, your life, appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.*
