Corpus Christi

FAITH OF OUR FATHERS:  
**FROM THE GREAT  
*SUMMA THEOLOGICA* OF  
ST. THOMAS AQUINAS**



**This week's Faith of Our Fathers** features an excerpt from the great *Summa Theologica* of St. Thomas Aquinas in which he explains why it makes sense that Christ's Body and Blood are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. St. Thomas was the first to coin the term "transubstantiation" to describe the mysterious manner in which the substance of the bread and wine of the Eucharist are transformed into the substance of the very Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Because of his groundbreaking contributions to the Eucharistic doctrine of the Church, St. Thomas was commissioned by Pope Urban IV in 1264 to compose the Mass, Divine Office, and hymns for the Feast of Corpus Christi which we celebrate today.

**From the *Summa Theologica* by St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor of the Church**  
(*Third Part, Question 75, Article 1, Resp.*)

I answer that, The presence of Christ's true body and blood in this sacrament cannot be detected by sense, nor understanding, but by faith alone, which rests upon Divine authority. Hence, on Luke 22:19: "This is My body which shall be delivered up for you," Cyril says: "Doubt not whether this be true; but take rather the Saviour's words with faith; for since He is the Truth, He lieth not."

Now this is suitable, first for the perfection of the New Law. For, the sacrifices of the Old Law contained only in figure that true sacrifice of Christ's Passion, according to Hebrews 10:1: "For the law having a shadow of the good things to come, not the very image of the things." And therefore it was necessary that the sacrifice of the New Law instituted by Christ should have something more, namely, that it should contain Christ Himself crucified, not merely in signification or figure, but also in very truth. And therefore this sacrament which contains Christ Himself, as Dionysius says (Eccl. Hier. iii), is perfective of all the other sacraments, in which Christ's virtue is participated.

Secondly, this belongs to Christ's love, out of which for our salvation He assumed a true body of our nature. And because it is the special feature of friendship to live together with friends, as the Philosopher says (Ethic. ix), He promises us His bodily presence as a reward, saying (Matthew 24:28): "Where the body is, there shall the eagles be gathered together." Yet meanwhile in our pilgrimage He does not deprive us of His bodily presence; but unites us with Himself in this sacrament through the truth of His body and blood. Hence (John 6:57) he says: "He that eateth My flesh, and drinketh My blood, abideth in Me, and I in him." Hence this sacrament is the sign of supreme charity, and the uplifter of our hope, from such familiar union of Christ with us.

Thirdly, it belongs to the perfection of faith, which concerns His humanity just as it does His Godhead, according to John 14:1: "You believe in God, believe also in Me." And since faith is of things unseen, as Christ shows us His Godhead invisibly, so also in this sacrament He shows us His flesh in an invisible manner.

# CORPUS CHRISTI: CELEBRATING THE REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST



Each year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi. This beautiful feast invites us to deepen our faith in one of the greatest gifts Jesus has given His Church: the Holy Eucharist. More than a symbol or a reminder, the Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, offered to us in Holy Communion and present in the tabernacle for our worship and adoration.

The origins of Corpus Christi date back to the thirteenth century. The feast was established by Pope Urban IV in 1264 after reports of Eucharistic miracles and through the efforts of St. Juliana of Liège, who promoted a special day dedicated solely to honoring the Blessed Sacrament. Since then, Catholics around the world have celebrated this solemnity as an opportunity to proclaim their belief in Christ's Real Presence.

The Gospel readings for Corpus Christi remind us of Jesus' words and actions at the Last Supper: "Take and eat; this is my body." These words are not merely symbolic. The Church teaches that through the power of the Holy Spirit and the words of consecration spoken by the priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. While the appearances of bread and wine remain, their substance is transformed into Jesus Himself.

This mystery lies at the heart of our Catholic faith. Every Mass is more than a gathering or a remembrance. It is a participation in Christ's sacrifice on Calvary and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. When we receive Holy Communion, we are united not only with Christ but also with one another as members of His Body, the Church.

Yet Corpus Christi is not only a feast to be understood, it is a feast to be lived. The Eucharist calls us into a deeper relationship with Christ. In every Holy Communion, Jesus gives Himself completely to us. He nourishes our souls, strengthens us against temptation, forgives venial sins, and fills us with grace. As St. John Paul II often reminded the faithful, **the Church draws her life from the Eucharist.**

One of the most visible and beloved traditions associated with Corpus Christi is the Eucharistic procession. Following Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is carried through the streets in a monstrance, accompanied by prayers, hymns, incense, and the faithful. This tradition dates back centuries and serves as a public witness to our belief in Christ's Real Presence.

The procession is rich with spiritual significance. We do not keep Jesus hidden within the walls of the church; rather, **we bring Him into the world**. As the faithful walk behind the Blessed Sacrament, they proclaim that Christ is Lord not only of our churches but also of our homes, neighborhoods, workplaces, and communities. The procession reminds us that Jesus walks with His people and desires to be present in every aspect of our lives.

In many places, flower petals are scattered along the path of the procession, children wear their First Communion attire, and temporary altars are erected for periods of prayer and blessing. These customs express joy, reverence, and gratitude for the gift of the Eucharist. They also remind us that our faith is not meant to remain private but is meant to be shared with the world.

The feast of Corpus Christi also encourages us to spend time in Eucharistic Adoration. Throughout the year, Jesus waits for us in the tabernacle and in times of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. In the quiet presence of the Eucharist, we can bring our joys, concerns, fears, and hopes to the Lord. Adoration teaches us to listen, to trust, and to recognize Christ's loving presence in our lives.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi, we are invited to reflect on a simple but profound question: Do we truly believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist? If we do, how does that belief shape our lives? The answer is found not only in what we profess but in how we pray, how we receive Holy Communion, and how we live as disciples of Christ.

May this feast renew our love for the Eucharist and inspire us to approach the altar with greater faith, reverence, and gratitude. May we recognize Christ in the breaking of the bread and carry His presence into the world through our words, actions, and witness. And may our participation in the Holy Mass and Eucharistic processions strengthen us to become what we receive, the Body of Christ, sent forth to share His love with all.
