


#### FOOD COLLECTION

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

**July 29** ▶ Today, we celebrate an extraordinary celebration - in one liturgy, we commemorate three siblings. Martha came from Bethany, a town on the eastern slope of the Mount of Olives, near the village of Bethphage, about 2 miles from Jerusalem (today Al Azariya). She was the sister of Mary and Lazarus, whom Christ had been friends with. St. Luke describes one of their meetings in detail (Lk 10:38-42). Martha is also mentioned in the Gospel of St. John, who records the raising of Lazarus after she confessed her faith in Jesus as the Messiah and Son of God (Jn 11:1-45). John also describes Jesus' visit to Lazarus six days before the Passover, where Martha served (Jn 12:1-11). It was from Bethany that Jesus set out in triumph on a donkey for Jerusalem on Palm Sunday (Mk 11:1). Finally, near Bethany, Jesus ascended from the Mount of Olives into heaven (Luke 24:50). St. Martha is the patron saint of housewives, hoteliers, cooks, cleaners, and innkeepers. A Provence legend states that after Jesus' Ascension, the Jews put Lazarus, Mary, and Martha on a ship without a rudder and so sent them out into the Mediterranean Sea. They all landed safely on the coast of France, near Marseille (other stories indicate Autun and Avallon). Lazarus was to become the first bishop of this city, Martha founded a convent nearby, and Mary did penance in a nearby hermitage. Mary was the sister of Martha and Lazarus. She believed in Christ even before her brother was raised from the dead (John 11:1-44). She was the woman who, according to Jesus' words, "chose the good part" (Luke 10:42), listening to the words of the Savior. She anointed His feet with a precious ointment made of spikenard (John 12:3). According to Tradition, Mary and Martha were among the women who rushed to Jesus' tomb with spices. We know Lazarus from the Gospel of John (John 11:1-44; 12:1-11) as the brother of Mary and Martha. When Jesus was staying on the shores of the Jordan River due to fear of the Jews, news of Lazarus' death reached him. He then returned to Judea and went to Bethany. St. John describes in detail the scene of His meeting with the sisters, the dialogue with Martha, Jesus' deep emotion, and the resurrection of Lazarus. We also learn about the reaction of the Jews, who could not deny the facts but hated Jesus even more. This reluctance also affected Lazarus. John the Evangelist also describes another stay of Jesus in Lazarus' house the day before He entered Jerusalem (John 12:1-11). Anonymous Christian writers supplemented the Gospel's silence about Lazarus's further fate. In the East, the most famous legend was that which made Lazarus the bishop of Cyprus and placed his - second - tomb there. The so-called Lazarus Sunday, one of the last Sundays of Lent, on which the Gospel of his resurrection was read, and scrutiny was carried out before admission to baptism. July 31 > Ignatius was born in 1491 in the castle of Loyola in Spain. He was wounded in 1521, and during his recovery, he read "The Golden Legend" and "The Life of Jesus". After recovering, he gave away his expensive knight's robes to a beggar and settled in Manresa, choosing to live in one of the caves. In 1523, Ignatius went on a pilgrimage through Rome and Venice, living on money he begged and favors he did along the way. He studied Latin for two years in Barcelona despite being 34 years old. He studied philosophy, founded the Society of Jesus, and took vows of poverty, chastity, and fidelity to the Church. He went to Rome with some followers, and

Pope Paul III kindly received them. Ignatius and his companions became priests and focused on serving the sick and teaching children. The Society grew quickly, and in 1541, St. Francis Xavier was invited to India. St. Peter Faber preached in northern Italy, southern France, and Spain. In 1541, Ignatius was elected superior general of the Jesuits. The Pope gave them the Church of Our Lady della Strada the same year. In 1542, the Jesuits founded a college in Coimbra. In 1550, St. Francis Borgia joined the order. Ignatius died on July 31, 1556, leaving behind valuable writings on spirituality and mysticism. August 1 Alphonsus Maria Liguori was born in 1696 into a wealthy noble family near Naples. He became a renowned preacher and established the Congregation of the Savior. Alphonsus also noticed the local highlanders lacked pastoral care, so he established the male congregation "Most Holy Redeemer" in 1732. In 1762, he was appointed a bishop of S. Agata dei Goti. Alphonsus dedicated himself to apostolic work, giving all his income to the poor and new institutions. He died on August 1, 1787, at 91 and was beatified in 1816 and canonized in 1839. St. Alphonsus Liguori was known for giving over 500 missions and retreats and was a prolific writer. He is the patron of the Redemptorist Order, lawyers, lay people, confessors, and theologians, especially moralists.
