A Reflection by Sister Kathy

Time to Move?

I often hear parishioners talking about the numbers of new residents in Beacon and the changes they bring. Many remember a Beacon that reflected families that had lived here for generations and knew each other by name. People still speak of this one's parents or that one's uncle who lived on such and such a street and married a cousin. Now there are new faces, new voices and new housing. For better or for worse, things are changing.

What we don't see are large numbers of new parishioners in our churches. We did have a number of new people at our potluck dinner for newcomers, but the number was small. There may be many explanations, but, among them, I think we have to look at the church's resistance to change. For most of our history we have identified "church" as a place. It may have been the school, the church edifice, the Knights of Columbus building or another gathering place, but in our minds it was the "church". It seems to me that we may need to move from our conception of "church" as place and begin to think of it more as "community".

We may have to look to Jesus to gather some clues as to how to proceed. Jesus was an itinerant preacher whose identity was tied to the community that moved with him. He did not require the status of traditional culture or cultural "absolutes". He encountered others on the way, Jews and non-Jews, and these encounters broadened his horizons. Jesus moved- and the community grew.

So I wonder if we need to move- physically, spiritually and intellectually, to meet the newcomers and invite them to join our community. Where is it that new residents in Beacon are going to find community and support? Where are they seeking the company of like-minded people? Perhaps these are the places where true Evangelization can happen through the committed efforts of our wonderful parish.

New Friendships and Enduring Memories after Maria

All of us watched in horror in 2017 as Hurricane Maria devastated the U.S. Virgin Islands, Dominica and Puerto Rico. We also witnessed bits and pieces of the heroic effort following the devastation. We are happy to welcome Wilma Feliciano, Ph.D. who'll be leading a film presentation and discussion at ST. JOHN'S HALL MONDAY MARCH 25th at 7pm. Dr. Feliciano is a professor emerita of Latin American Studies at SUNY New Paltz. Dr. Feliciano's presentation focuses on the cultural exchanges that promoted human kinship among 3 generations of victims and 24 strangers who paid their own costs to travel to an impoverished mountain town to rebuild. Frequent references to Christ, the Virgin Mary and appeals to God reveal the fervor of the mountain folk. When disaster strikes, Puerto Ricans turn to faith, their own resilience and the generosity of others. All are welcome to join what promises to be an interesting discussion! REFLEXION DEL DIACONO OSCAR CIFUENTES

En la primera lectura, en el Libro de Génesis, Dios le hace una promesa a Abram. Y aquí podemos ver dos cosas muy importantes, la promesa de Dios y la fe. Dice que Abram le creyó a Dios y fue tomado por "Justo". Quiero hacer énfasis en un detalle muy particular, Abram le creyó a Dios, muy diferente a creer en Dios y es aquí donde les pido que reflexionen. ¿Estamos creyendo en Dios o creyéndonle a Dios? Si estamos creyendo en Dios, estamos haciendo lo que todos hacen, hasta el enemigo, pero si le creemos a Dios estaremos en el camino que nos lleva a ser tomados por justos. En nuestra segunda lectura Pablo hace un llamado a los filipenses, aparentemente no todos en Filipo están siguiendo el ejemplo que les dejó Pablo, y están yendo por el camino equivocado y a la perdición. Si nos damos cuenta, lo mismo que pasó en aquel tiempo, sigue ocurriendo en nuestros días y posiblemente seguirá ocurriendo en el futuro si no hacemos nada por formarnos e instruirnos en una mejor vida espiritual, y no solo nosotros sino todos los que están a nuestro alrededor, sea familia, amigos o comunidad. Yo ahora que Dios me ha permitido ser parte de su clérigo, he tenido la oportunidad de ver de cerca cuantos de nuestros hermanos están viviendo como enemigos de la cruz de Cristo, porque las cosas del mundo son importantes para ellos que Jesús mismo.
