Reflection from Fr. Innocent...

November 1st and November 2nd are two separate days the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls), respectively. Traditionally, the Feast of All Saints honors all the saints, known and unknown, who now enjoy the beatific vision, or communion with God. These saints are those, who in their daily devotion on earth made an effective contribution to the Church's growth and to the building of society; those who were consumed in offering material and spiritual aid to their neighbors in need; those who left everything to bring the Gospel message to every part of the world (cf. Saint John Paul II, *Holy See Press Office*, Vatican City, November 1, 2000). All Souls' Day, on the other hand, embraces all the faithful departed who are in the process of achieving perfect communion with God through our prayers, good works, and the offering of Mass. Thus, the Church firmly "believes that Christ, who died and was raised up for all, can through his Spirit offer man the light and the strength to measure up to his supreme destiny" (Vatican II, *Gaudium et Spes*, n. 10).

The theological basis for the Commemoration of All Souls is the "doctrine that the souls which, on departing from the body, are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past transgressions, are debarred from the beatific vision, and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, alms, deeds and especially by the sacrifice of the Mass." This doctrine is biblically supported by the Second Book of Maccabees which has the clearest biblical reference about prayers or supplications for the dead. Hence, it says: "Judas rallied his army and went to the city of Adullam... to gather up the bodies of the fallen and bury them with their kindred in their ancestral tombs... Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... He then took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection in mind; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead... Thus, he made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin" (2 Maccabees 12:38-46). Note the connection in this quote between praying for the dead and the resurrection.

Evidently, the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls are days of memory and of hope. They remind "us of what we can expect: the hope of encountering the love of the Father" (Pope Francis, *Holy See Press Office*, November 2, 2018). Thus, the "most proper and effective way to honor the dead is to pray for them, offering acts of faith, hope and charity. In union with the Eucharistic Sacrifice, we can intercede for their eternal salvation and experience the most profound communion in the expectation of being together, enjoying forever the Love which created and redeemed us" (Pope Benedict XVI, *Holy See Press Office*, November 2, 2009). Let

us take time daily to pray for those souls who have gone before us and know that a prayer or Mass for the dead is never wasted, since we are a people of hope who look forward to the fulfillment of Christ's promise of "the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come" (*Nicene Creed*). We can never go wrong when we ask for the intercession of the saints and as well, pray for those who have gone before us.

Conmemoración de todos los fieles difuntos

Reflexión del P. Inocencio... El 1 y el 2 de noviembre son dos días distintos en los que la Iglesia celebra la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos y la Conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos (All Souls), respectivamente. Tradicionalmente, la Fiesta de Todos los Santos honra a todos los santos, conocidos y desconocidos, que ahora disfrutan de la visión beatífica, o comunión con Dios. Estos santos son los que, en su devoción cotidiana en la tierra, contribuyeron eficazmente al crecimiento de la Iglesia y a la construcción de la sociedad; los que se consumieron en ofrecer ayuda material y espiritual a sus prójimos necesitados; los que lo dejaron todo para llevar el mensaje del Evangelio a todas las partes del mundo (cf. San Juan Pablo II, Oficina de Prensa de la Santa Sede, Ciudad del Vaticano, 1 de noviembre de 2000). El Día de Todos los Difuntos, por otra parte, abraza a todos los fieles difuntos que están en proceso de alcanzar la comunión perfecta con Dios a través de nuestras oraciones, buenas obras y el ofrecimiento de la Misa. Así, la Iglesia "cree firmemente que Cristo, muerto y resucitado por todos, puede ofrecer al hombre, mediante su Espíritu, la luz y la fuerza para estar a la altura de su supremo destino" (Vaticano II, Gaudium et Spes, n. 10).

El fundamento teológico de la Conmemoración de Todas las Almas es la "doctrina según la cual las almas que, al partir del cuerpo, no están perfectamente limpias de pecados veniales, o no han expiado plenamente las transgresiones pasadas, quedan excluidas de la visión beatífica, y que los fieles en la tierra pueden ayudarlas con oraciones, limosnas, obras y especialmente con el sacrificio de la Misa". Esta doctrina está apoyada bíblicamente por el Segundo Libro de los Macabeos, que tiene la referencia bíblica más clara sobre oraciones o súplicas por los muertos. Así, dice: "Judas reunió a su ejército y fue a la ciudad de Adulam... para recoger los cuerpos de los caídos y enterrarlos con sus parientes en sus tumbas ancestrales... Volviéndose a la súplica, oraron para que el hecho pecaminoso fuera completamente borrado... Luego hizo una colecta entre todos sus soldados, que ascendió a dos mil dracmas de plata, que envió a Jerusalén para proveer a un sacrificio expiatorio. Al hacer esto, actuó de una manera muy excelente y noble, en la medida en que tenía en mente la resurrección; porque si no esperara que los caídos resucitaran, habría sido superfluo e insensato orar por los muertos... Así, hizo expiación por los muertos para que pudieran ser absueltos de su pecado" (2 Macabeos 12:38-46). Obsérvese la relación en esta cita entre rezar por los muertos y la resurrección. Evidentemente, la Fiesta de Todos los Santos y la Conmemoración de Todos los Difuntos son días de memoria y de esperanza. Nos recuerdan "lo que podemos esperar: la esperanza de encontrar el amor del Padre" (Papa Francisco, Oficina de Prensa de la Santa Sede, 2 de noviembre de 2018). Así, el "modo más propio y eficaz de honrar a los difuntos es rezar por ellos, ofreciendo actos de fe, esperanza y caridad. En unión con el Sacrificio Eucarístico, podemos interceder por su salvación eterna y experimentar la comunión más profunda en

la espera de estar juntos, gozando para siempre del Amor que nos ha creado y redimido" (Papa Benedicto XVI, Oficina de Prensa de la Santa Sede, 2 de noviembre de 2009). Dedicuemos un tiempo diario a rezar por las almas que nos han precedido y sepamos que una oración o una Misa por los difuntos nunca es inútil, ya que somos un pueblo de esperanza que espera el cumplimiento de la promesa de Cristo de "la resurrección de los muertos y la vida del mundo futuro" (Credo Niceno). Nunca nos equivocamos cuando pedimos la intercesión de los santos y también cuando rezamos por los que nos han precedido.
