## Reflection by Sr. Michaelene.....

*This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad! Ps118*

In the midst of turmoil in our world, we need to take time out to rejoice in the Resurrection of the Lord! For years my thoughts about Holy Saturday were quiet, happy thoughts. Yes, Jesus had died a horrible death and publicly, but He had overcome death, would rise from that death and tomorrow would be filled with joy! All this is certainly true, but it left out of my thinking all that Jesus had gone through for us and helped me to skip over the hard-to-think-about sufferings of Jesus. In my searching for Holy Saturday thoughts, I found this short piece from an Orthodox liturgy:

“Today Hades groans: My power has vanished, I received one who died as mortals die, but I could not hold him: with him and through him, I lost those over which I had ruled... and lo, he raises them all up with him!”

This agony of the evil one made me smile and reminded me that Jesus suffered the same sort of things we do – hunger, thirst, the misunderstanding of others, fear of illness and finally a brutal death. He felt fear and put his trust in God, who saved him; Christ overpowered the evil one and God raised him from death. I realized that I couldn't just skip over the difficult days because Jesus knew those days and shares our hard times as well as our good times. And on the day of Easter, we can rejoice with and for Christ and be grateful that He walks this life with us – every single day!

## Guatemala 2026

"It's the first sight that throws me into a panic" responded the triage nurse when I asked how she was coping. "Arriving after bumping over rocky roads for two hours in the back of a pickup truck and seeing forty people waiting for me is a bit overwhelming", she went on to explain. Luckily, each day the chaos dissipated as each patient passed through triage and on to the provider line, with stops for labs or physical therapy if needed. The team shared space, consulted with each other, and paid attention to every patient. Finally, the individual or family group arrived at pharmacy to receive medications, instructions, AND the ever-important toothbrushes.

And so it went each day: Santa Ana, Timushan, Mojon, Laredonda, San Jose, San Nicolas, sometimes setting up clinic in a school, a chapel, or a resident's home. The local health promoters cleared space, borrowed chairs and tables, arranged tarps, provided barrels of water, assembled the patients, reported on those who were unable to walk, helped arrange follow-up and generally acted as the responsible agents for our visit. Without them we would not have been able to function.

As always there were memorable patients: a four year old boy who was unable to walk more than a few steps, a young mother with a one month old baby who had given birth alone, elderly individuals who wanted glasses so they could see their grandchildren's faces, women overwhelmed with the responsibilities of the home, children, and work in the coffee harvest. Most needed medications or physical therapy; all needed encouragement and affirmation.

Final numbers are not in, but we saw well over 450 patients. Each encounter presented an opportunity to recognize the dignity, the strength, and the faith of individuals who trusted that God was providing them with care through our visit. What stays with me is the importance of each person who contributed money, medications, devices, prayers or moral support for our trip. Global Health sent a team of 12 people to Guatemala with a support network of thousands. We are so grateful.



## Domingo de Pascua, de la Resurrección de Nuestro Señor

### Reflexión de la hermana Michaelene...

*Este es el día que hizo el Señor; ¡alegrémonos y regocijémonos! Sal 118:*

En medio de la agitación que vive nuestro mundo, ¡necesitamos tomarnos un tiempo para regocijarnos por la Resurrección del Señor! Durante años, mis pensamientos sobre el Sábado Santo eran tranquilos y felices. Sí, Jesús había sufrido una muerte horrible y pública, pero había vencido a la muerte, resucitaría de ella y el día siguiente estaría lleno de alegría. Todo esto es ciertamente cierto, pero dejaba fuera de mi reflexión todo lo que Jesús pasado por nosotros y me ayudaba a pasar por alto los sufrimientos de Jesús, tan difíciles de imaginar. En mi búsqueda de pensamientos para el Sábado Santo, encontré este breve fragmento de una liturgia ortodoxa:

*«Hoy el Hades gime: Mi poder se ha desvanecido, recibí a uno que murió como mueren los mortales, pero no pude retenerlo: con él y a través de él, perdí a aquellos sobre los que había reinado... ¡y he aquí que los resucita a todos con él!»*

Esta agonía del maligno me hizo sonreír y me recordó que Jesús sufrió el mismo tipo de cosas que nosotros: hambre, sed, la incompreensión de los demás, el miedo a la enfermedad y, finalmente, una muerte brutal. Sintió miedo y puso su confianza en Dios, quien lo salvó; Cristo venció al maligno y Dios lo resucitó de entre los muertos. Me di cuenta de que no podía simplemente pasar por alto los días difíciles porque Jesús conoció esos días y comparte nuestros momentos difíciles tanto como nuestros momentos buenos. Y el día de Pascua, podemos regocijarnos con Cristo y por Cristo, y estar agradecidos de que Él recorra esta vida con nosotros —¡cada día! Tu vida está escondida con Cristo en Dios. Cuando Cristo, tu vida, aparezca, ¡entonces tú también aparecerás con él en la gloria. Col. 3

### Cena compartida de bienvenida para los nuevos feligreses

El sábado 18 de abril, tras la misa de las 16:30 en la iglesia de San Joaquín, nos gustaría invitar a todos los nuevos feligreses a una cena compartida. La velada será una maravillosa oportunidad para conocer a otros feligreses, relacionarse con nuestros sacerdotes y clérigos, y disfrutar de una comida juntos como comunidad de fe. Si lo desean, pueden traer su aperitivo favorito. Esperamos compartir comida, compañerismo y amistad mientras les damos la bienvenida a nuestra familia parroquial.

### Guatemala 2026:

«Es la primera imagen la que me hace entrar en pánico», respondió la enfermera de triaje cuando le pregunté cómo se las estaba arreglando. «Llegar tras dos horas de traqueteo por caminos pedregosos en la caja de una camioneta y ver a cuarenta personas esperándome es un poco abrumador», continuó explicando. Por suerte, cada día el caos se disipaba a medida que cada paciente pasaba por el triaje y se dirigía a la fila de los profesionales sanitarios, con paradas para análisis o fisioterapia si era necesario. El equipo compartía espacio, se consultaba entre sí y prestaba atención a cada paciente. Finalmente, la persona o el grupo familiar llegaba a la farmacia para recibir medicamentos, instrucciones y los siempre importantes cepillos de dientes.

Y así transcurría cada día: Santa Ana, Timushan, Mojon, Laredonda, San José, San Nicolás, a veces montando la clínica en una escuela, una capilla o la casa de un residente. Los promotores de salud locales despejaban el espacio, pedían prestadas sillas y mesas, colocaban lonas, proporcionaban barriles de agua, reunían a los pacientes, informaban de aquellos que no podían caminar, ayudaban a organizar el seguimiento y, en general, actuaban como los agentes responsables de nuestra visita. Sin ellos no habríamos podido funcionar.

Como siempre, hubo pacientes memorables: un niño de cuatro años que no podía dar más que unos pocos pasos, una joven madre con un bebé de un mes que había dado a luz sola, personas mayores que querían gafas para poder ver los rostros de sus nietos, mujeres abrumadas por las responsabilidades del hogar, los niños y el trabajo en la cosecha del café. La mayoría necesitaba medicamentos o fisioterapia; todos necesitaban ánimo y reconocimiento.

Las cifras definitivas aún no están disponibles, pero atendimos a más de 450 pacientes. Cada encuentro supuso una oportunidad para reconocer la dignidad, la fortaleza y la fe de personas que confiaban en que Dios les estaba proporcionando cuidados a través de nuestra visita. Lo que me queda grabado es la importancia de cada persona que contribuyó con dinero, medicamentos, dispositivos, oraciones o apoyo moral para nuestro viaje. Global Health envió un equipo de 12 personas a Guatemala con una red de apoyo de miles de personas. Estamos muy agradecidos.




