Pastor's Corner

The Fourth Sunday of Lent

“*I am the light of the world’ ...That light shines on us now, for we have had our eyes anointed with the eye-salve of faith.*” (Saint Augustine, *A Treatise on John*).

This weekend we celebrate Laetare Sunday, named for the first word in the opening antiphon: “Rejoice.” Lent can seem burdensome with its emphasis on penitence and sacrifice. But today we look with anticipation to its end in the Easter miracle. Jesus’ resurrection is the light at the end of the tunnel. Let us give thanks for the light he gives to our lives.

In the First Reading, God chooses the overlooked son of Jesse, for God sees beyond appearances. In the Gospel, the Pharisees cannot see past the appearance of sin whereas the man who was formerly blind sees that Jesus is Lord. As we listen to the readings, let us think about our blind spots and the times when we fail to see beyond appearances.

Sisters and Brothers:

What crazy times we are living in! Unfortunately, we are going through a pandemic, so we need to take steps to keep everyone safe. Safety along with the health and well-being of all is why Bishop Serratelli mandated that all public Masses be suspended until further notice. Believe me, I did not derive any pleasure from following the Bishop’s lead. Most priests will tell you that the greatest joy and privilege of being a priest is celebrating Eucharist, especially with parishioners in the pews. As we have announced, our priests are celebrating Mass in private by themselves so that all of the Mass intentions are fulfilled. Hopefully, we can get back to celebrating Masses in public very soon.

In the meantime, please stay alert for updates about parish happenings. Make sure you check our website and our parish Facebook page, www.facebook.com/SaintPetertheApostleParsippany, from time to time. Also, please make sure we have your email address so that you can receive our Flocknote broadcast emails. Plus, we are cutting down on the number of bulletins we print each week, but we will still have some copies available in the church.

The best thing we can do now is pray. Continue to pray in earnest for the end of this pandemic. Because of its small size, we closed the Adoration Chapel for now, but we have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament every day from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in Our Lady’s Daily Mass Chapel. Spend some time with Jesus.

As Saint Paul tells us, “Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God” (Philippians 4:6-7). We look forward to returning to our regular schedules as soon as possible. In the meantime, please be careful and take precautions to guard against picking up the virus.

**Additional Health and Safety Measures
By Mandate of the Bishop**

As events and civil guidelines continue to unfold the following Health and Safety Measures are effective immediately.

Deferral of Baptism

Until further notice all baptisms administered by the ordinary minister of the sacrament within the parish setting are deferred except in case of urgent necessity. Should an urgent necessity arise, the faithful should contact a priest immediately.

Funeral Rites


Because of the impossibility of limiting large gatherings of family and friends for a Funeral Mass, all Funeral Masses are to be discontinued until further notice. The Rite of Committal as established in the *Order of Christian Funerals* may be used for a graveside service with no more than 8 members of the immediate family present. All are to keep the recommended social distance. The priest is to offer a private Mass for the repose of the soul of the departed. A public Memorial Mass can be arranged for a later date when restrictions on the gathering of large crowds have been lifted.

Derogation from Specific Previous Norms

The policies delineated above supersede and replace the norms regarding the celebration of Baptism and the observance of Funeral Rites in the decree issued on March 16, 2020 under my signature; all of the other norms of the March 16th decree remain in full effect with force of law.

Given this 19th day of March, 2020, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


El rincón del pastor:






