Pastor's Corner

Second Sunday of Advent

“At home, when we await the visit of a dear person, we prepare everything with care and gladness. In the same way, we want to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord: to await him each day attentively, so as to be filled by his grace when he comes” (Pope Francis, *Angelus*, Second Sunday of Advent, December 10, 2017).

Advent is a season of preparation and today's readings emphasize our need to prepare for the Lord's coming. But Isaiah also gives us words of comfort and hope. The Lord's coming is a sign of God's generosity. The Second Letter of Peter tells us to conduct ourselves in holiness and devotion, echoing John the Baptist's call for repentance.

Twice this weekend we hear Isaiah's directive, “Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.” How are we preparing for the Lord to make inroads into our lives, into our hearts? What obstacles has our self-centeredness placed in the way and how can we remove them? For what do we need forgiveness and what repentance can we make? As we prepare to receive the Lord today in the Eucharist, let us also prepare to truly receive him into our hearts. As we prepare the way of the Lord, let the Word of God inspire us.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Tuesday, December 8 – A Holy Day of Obligation

“On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in Mass” (Code of Canon Law, Can. 1247).

This coming Tuesday, December 8, the Church celebrates the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. This solemnity celebrates Mary's miraculous conception without sin from the very first instant of her human existence and God's provident plan, from the beginning of time, to arrange for the sinlessness of the woman he chose as the Mother of God. It also prepares for the arrival of our Savior and the happy beginning of our plan of salvation.

In Advent we enter into a time of waiting and preparation, both for the feast of Christmas and for the eventual return of Christ in glory. We look to Mary as a model for our waiting and preparation. Though this miraculous pregnancy will disrupt her life in unknown ways, in the Gospel reading for the solemnity (Luke 1:26-38), we hear how Mary trusts in God's providence and agrees to bear the one who will be “called holy, the Son of God.”

In Raymond Brown's *A Coming Christ in Advent*, the Scripture scholar writes of Mary's fiat, “Her readiness is possible for her because by God's grace she has said yes to Him before. Thus, Mary's discipleship does not exhibit conversion but consistency.” In our own waiting and preparation, let us practice this same consistency, saying yes to God in small, ordinary ways that will prepare us to welcome Christ fully.

We will celebrate six Masses for this solemnity; see the schedule posted in this bulletin. Please join us for one of the Masses to honor our Blessed Mother.

“En casa, cuando esperamos la visita de alguien querido, preparamos todo con cuidado y alegría. De la misma forma, deseamos prepararnos nosotros mismos para la venida del Señor: esperándolo atentamente cada día, y de esa manera llenarnos de gracia cuando llegue.” (Papa Francisco, *Angelus*, Segundo Domingo de Adviento, Diciembre 10, 2017).

El Adviento es una época de preparación, y las lecturas de hoy enfatizan nuestra necesidad de prepararnos para la venida del Señor. Pero Isaías también nos brinda palabras de consuelo y esperanza. La venida del Señor es una señal de la generosidad de Dios. La Segunda Carta de San Pedro nos dice que nos conduzcamos santamente y con devoción, haciéndolo a la llamada de arrepentimiento de San Juan Bautista.

Dos veces este fin de semana hemos escuchado la instrucción de Isaías: “Preparen el camino del Señor, allanen sus senderos.” ¿Cómo estamos preparando para que el Señor haga caminos en nuestras vidas, en nuestros corazones? ¿Qué obstáculos ha puesto nuestro egoísmo en el camino y cómo podemos removerlos? Al prepararnos a recibir al Señor hoy en la Eucaristía, preparémonos para verdaderamente recibirlo en nuestros corazones también. Al preparar el camino del Señor, permitamos que la Palabra de Dios nos inspire.

La Inmaculada Concepción de la Santísima Virgen María Martes, 8 de Diciembre – Día Santo de Obligación

“Los Domingos y otros días santos de obligación, los feligreses están obligados a participar en la Misa.”
(*Código de Ley Canónica*, Can. 1247).

Este próximo martes, 8 de diciembre, la Iglesia celebra la Inmaculada Concepción de la Santísima Virgen María, un Día Santo de Obligación. Este día solemne celebra la concepción milagrosa de María, sin pecado desde el primer instante de su existencia humana, y el plan previsor de Dios, desde el principio del tiempo, que previó la falta de pecado de la mujer que escogió como la Madre de Dios. También nos prepara para la llegada de nuestro Salvador y el feliz comienzo de nuestro plan de salvación.

Durante el Adviento entramos en una época de espera y preparación, ambos por la festividad de la Navidad y por el eventual regreso de Cristo en gloria. Vemos en María un modelo para nuestra espera y preparación. A pesar de que este embarazo milagroso interrumpiría su vida de formas desconocidas, en la lectura del Evangelio de la solemnidad (San Lucas 1:26-38), escuchamos cómo María confía en la providencia de Dios y acepta llevar a quien “será Santo y será llamado Hijo de Dios.”

En el libro de Raymond Brown: *El Cristo que llega en Adviento*, el autor, erudito de las Escrituras, escribe sobre el decreto de María: “Su disposición es posible para ella ya que por la gracia de Dios, ella ha aceptado previamente. Por ello, el discipulado de María no demuestra conversión sino consistencia.” En nuestra propia espera y preparación, practiquemos esta misma consistencia, diciendo ‘sí’ a Dios en cosas pequeñas y ordinarias que nos prepararán a recibir a Cristo plenamente.

Celebraremos seis Misas durante este día de solemnidad; puede encontrar el horario en este boletín. Por favor únase a nosotros durante una de estas Misas para honrar a nuestra Santísima Madre.

S3030/A4848 Reproductive Freedom Act

What you should know about the Reproductive Freedom Act from the Beacon Article of November 2020 and NJ Right to Life Voter Voice.net:

- Guarantees the right to contraception, abortion and to carry a pregnancy to term;
- Allows late term abortion right up to birth of baby;
- Living babies inside of the womb - fertilized egg, embryo or fetus shall not have independent rights under the law, even if they are viable and at full term;
- Non-Physicians can perform abortions. Under the bill, qualified health care professionals licensed under Title 45 can provide abortions services in the state. Defines health care professional as “person who is licensed or otherwise authorized to provide health care services, including, but not limited to a physician, advance practice nurse, physician assistant, certified midwife or certified nurse midwife”;
- Nullifies conscientious clauses for medical personnel;
- Mandates annual allocation of tax payers funding to Planned Parenthood under Title X in the state budget;
- Exempts prosecution for individuals who terminate or attempt to terminate their own pregnancy. It eliminates the requirement that a medicolegal death investigation be conducted in a case where a fetal death occurs without medical attendance. This language will grant immunity from prosecution for cases, including, but not limited to where infants have been born alive and left to die or through a deliberate act, are killed, therefore rendering the NJ Safe Haven Infant Protection Act obsolete;
- Requires all insurance carriers to provide coverage for abortions and expands coverage for contraceptives to a long term (12 month) supply. Religious employers could request an exclusion if the required coverage conflicts with the religious employer’s bona fide religious beliefs and practices; and
- If bill becomes law, it will not be able to be struck down in the future as a clause in the bill states: “It shall be the policy of the state to invalidate and prohibit the future adoption of all laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, resolutions, policies, standards or parts thereof that conflict with the provisions or the express or implied purposes of this bill.


