SUNDAY, JULY 28st, 2024 Pastor's Corner The Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus satiates not only material hunger, but the most profound one, the hunger for the meaning of life, the hunger for God. Before the suffering, loneliness, poverty and difficulties of so many people, what can we ourselves do?" (Pope Francis, Angelus Homily, July 26, 2015).

The First Reading this weekend foreshadows what Jesus will so memorably do centuries later. Elisha insists that twenty small barley loaves, given as an offering to God, would feed a hundred people with some left over. Jesus tells His disciples the same thing when all they could offer to the thousands of pilgrims who gather to see Him are five barley loaves and two fish. God nourishes and sustains us always, no matter how impossible it seems.

From five barley loaves and two fish, Jesus was able to provide a wonderful feast for thousands of people. All of them had plenty to eat and what was left over filled twelve wicker baskets. The people realized they had just witnessed a miracle, a sign to bring them to faith. We gather this weekend for the Eucharistic feast, where we are invited to have our fill of the bread of eternal life. May the miracle we witness today bring us to a deeper belief in the Lord and His saving gift to us.

Diocesan Ministries Appeal

We recently received our final rebate check in the amount of \$1,713.00 for exceeding our goal in the 2023 Diocesan Ministries Appeal. Our goal was \$55,085.00. The Diocese received \$98,356.00 so our total rebate was \$21,636.00. Thank you to all who support the Diocesan Ministries appeal year in and year out. Your generosity helps make the Diocesan Ministries Appeal a major fundraiser for our parish. A major portion of the funds raised in the appeal go to Catholic Charities which recently broke ground on the new Straight and Narrow building. Many of you remember the Straight and Narrow fire that took place in August 2019 shortly after I arrived here. I was happy to see that our Pastor Emeritus Msgr. Herb Tillyer participated in the groundbreaking in Paterson.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS UPDATE - MASONRY WORK

for Rectory, Church, and All Saints Academy

We recently received estimates from three different masonry companies to conduct major masonry repair work around the Rectory, Church, and All Saints Academy. For the Rectory, we need to replace the front steps to the Rectory which are crumbling. For the Church, we have numerous cracks in the pavement, especially by the Church Hall sidewalk. The Sidewalks around All Saints Academy have numerous cracks that need to be addressed. These problems are all safety issues involving trip hazards.

Here are the estimate totals for each building: Rectory - \$6,000; Church - 8,000, and All Saints Academy - \$37,000 for a total of \$51,000. As you can imagine, this cost is above and beyond any Buildings and Grounds repair money in our normal operating budget.

Any donations to help defray the cost of these masonry repairs are appreciated.
