The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)

"This Word of the Lord astonishes us, and makes us think. It introduces the dynamic of faith, which is a relationship: the relationship between the human person — all of us — and the Person of Jesus, where the Father plays a decisive role, and, of course, the Holy Spirit does too, which is implied here. To believe in Him, it is not enough to meet Jesus, it is not enough to read the Bible, the Gospel — this is important!" (Pope Francis, Angelus Homily, August 9, 2015).

Jesus told His disciples, "Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted." This Sunday, we mourn all those who have died, especially those we love, those who are close to us. But we indeed are comforted by our memories of them, by sharing our grief with our loved ones, and by our faith, which tells us that death is not the end. Their souls are in the arms of God, forever comforted from the suffering and hardships they faced in life. Our faith in the Resurrection allows us to be pilgrims of hope in this life, placing our trust in God's love and mercy.

Over thousands of years, God's Word has given us comfort and hope to those who mourn. May faith in a loving and merciful God, whom we hear portrayed in this weekend's readings, dispel our doubts and calm our fears of death. May our faith in the Resurrection and in the redemption Jesus won for us assure us of the promise of eternal life in the kingdom. May the faith we share and the act of sharing it with each other console us in our grief.

Hope in the Resurrection

Throughout His ministry, Jesus gave life to those in need. Early on, it was to people who were ill or possessed by demons, freeing them from conditions that worsened or shattered their lives. He cured lepers, restoring them to life in society. He forgave the woman caught in adultery, saving her life. He raised Jairus's daughter, thought to be dead, and Lazarus, already entombed. Finally, He sacrificed His own life, saving us from the permanency of death when He was raised to eternal life. Therefore, we can rejoice, for in Jesus we have a Savior who offers us the fullness of life, both now and forever.

Realize that Thomas, who saw Jesus perform miracles, saw Him raise Lazarus from the dead, and heard Him testify that He would be put to death but be raised on the last day, still doubted that all the other Apostles had seen Him in the flesh, risen to new life. How much more are we susceptible to such doubts? When we suffer from grief, as surely Thomas did as well, we find it difficult to hold on to hope. But it is at this time that we most need it. May our faith, the faith of those close to us, and the faith of those who gather in this church in His name restore in us our hope in the Resurrection, which is our ultimate consolation in the face of death.

We are all members of the communion of saints, joined by all those who have died in the faith and await that ultimate unity with God, along with the saints who are already with God. That communion not only spans space and time, but it also spans life and death itself. Our parish community and all who have ever belonged to it are examples of that communion. We are joined with an everlasting communion of saints. May that console us as we remember those we have lost, for they live on in our communion as we all await our heavenly reward.

La Conmemoración de los Fieles Difuntos (Todos Santos)

"La Palabra del Señor nos asombra y nos hace pensar. Nos introduce a la dinámica de fe, que es una relación: la relación entre la persona humana – todos nosotros – y la Persona de Jesús, en donde el Padre juega un papel decisivo, y claro, también el Espíritu Santo, que se implica aquí. Creer en El no es suficiente para conocer a Jesús, no es suficiente leer la Biblia, el Evangelio – jesto es importante!" (Papa Francisco, Homilia del Angelus, 9 de agosto de 2015.)

Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Bienaventurados los que lloran, porque serán consolados." Este domingo lloramos por los que han muerto, especialmente por los que amamos, cercanos a nosotros. Nos consuelan los recuerdos, el compartir nuestro dolor con seres amados, y nuestra fe, que nos asegura que la muerte no es el fin. Sus almas están ya en los brazos de Dios, por siempre libres del sufrimiento y dificultades que enfrentaron en vida. Nuestra fe en la Resurrección nos permite ser peregrinos de esperanza en esta vida, depositando nuestra confianza en el amor y la misericordia de Dios.

Por miles de años, la Palabra de Dios ha consolado y dado esperanza a los que lloran. Que la fe en un amoroso y misericordioso Dios, del cual escuchamos en las lecturas de este fin de semana, disipe nuestras dudas y calme nuestro temor a la muerte. Que nuestra fe en la Resurrección y la redención que Jesús ganó para nosotros nos asegure la promesa de vida eterna en el Reino. Que la fe que compartimos y el acto de compartirla con cada uno de nosotros nos consuele en nuestra pena.

Esperanza en la Resurrección

A través de Su Ministerio, Jesús dió vida a los necesitados. Al principio fue a gente enferma o poseída por demonios, liberándolas de condiciones que empeoraban o destrozaban sus vidas. Curó leprosos, devolviéndolos a la vida en sociedad. Perdonó a la adúltera, y salvó su vida. Resucitó a la hija de Jairo, dada por muerta, y a Lázaro, ya sepultado. Finalmente sacrificó su propia vida, salvándonos de una muerte definitiva cuando fué resucitado a la vida eterna. Regocijémonos ya que en Jesús tenemos un Salvador que nos ofrece la plenitud de la vida, tanto ahora como en la eternidad.

Dése cuenta de que Tomás, quien lo vió realizar milagros, resucitar a Lázaro y que lo había escuchado decir que sería condenado a muerte pero que resucitaría en el último día, dudó cuando todos los otros Apóstolos lo habían visto en persona, resucitado a una vida nueva. ¿No somos mucho más suceptibles a tales dudas? Cuando estamos de duelo, como estaría Tomás, se nos dificulta tener esperanza. Pero es cuando más la necesitamos. Que nuestra fe, la de nuestros seres amados, y la fe de los que nos reunimos en esta Iglesia en Su nombre, restaure nuestra esperanza en la Resurrección, que es el mayor consuelo al enfrentar la muerte.

Todos somos miembros de la comunión de los santos, unidos con quienes han muerto en la fe y esperan la ultimada unión con Dios, junto a los santos que ya lo están. Esa comunión no sólo se expande en tiempo y espacio, sino en vida y muerte. Nuestra comunidad parroquial y todos los que han permanecido a ella son ejemplos de esa comunión. Estamos unidos a la eterna comunión de santos. Que eso nos consuele al recordar a los que hemos perdido, ya que viven en nuestra comunión mientras esperamos nuestra recompensa celestial.



Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
- 5. I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and **infinite ocean of mercy**.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless those places wherein the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
- 10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.
- 12. In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that **my all-powerful love** will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, **the grace of final repentance**: they will **not die in my displeasure**, nor **without receiving the sacraments**; and my Heart will be their **secure refuge in that last hour**.

To meet the promises for the First Friday Devotion promises a person must: Go to **Confession**: Attend **Mass**; and Receive **Holy Communion**. **This devotion must be done for nine consecutive first Fridays**.

Promises of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

- 1. To save sinners
- 2. Grace of final perseverance and a safe refuge in death.
- 3. Mary promises her special protection and great graces to those who say the Rosary devoutly.
- 4. A powerful armor against hell, destroying vice, dispelling heresy and decreasing sin.
- 5. Virtue and good works to flourish and draw people from loving the world to loving God.

To meet the promises for the First Saturday Devotion Promises a person must: Go to **Confession**; Attend **Mass**; Receive **Holy Communion**; Pray five decades of **the Rosary**; **Meditate** for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary. **This devotion must be done for five consecutive first Saturdays**.

Attend mass on the First Fridays (6:45 and 8:00am); First Saturdays (8:00am) to receive these wonderful graces and blessings from Jesus and the Blessed Mother.


