Pastor's Corner

The Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

“Today the simple and disarming love of Jesus revives the heart of His disciple. Like the Apostle Thomas, let us accept mercy, the salvation of the world. And let us show mercy to those who are most vulnerable; for only in this way will we build a new world.” (Pope Francis, *Homily*, April 19, 2020).

This weekend's readings capture the wonder and joy of the early Church as they celebrate the new life they have found in the risen Lord. In the First Reading, the disciples come together to listen to the teaching of the Apostles, to pray, and to break bread, much as we do during Mass today. The First Letter of Peter extols the gift of salvation, which animates a “living hope” in us. The risen Lord gifts the Apostles with the Holy Spirit and the power to forgive sins in His name. Let us listen and imagine ourselves alongside the earliest members of the infant Church.

In the Gospel, we hear the well-known story of St. Thomas, the Apostle who doubted that Jesus had truly risen, refusing to believe until he touched the nail marks in the Lord's hands. Out of mercy for the single Apostle who had missed the first appearance after rising from the dead, Jesus returned to invite Thomas to probe His wounds. Thomas, with the faith we hope to emulate, immediately exclaimed, “My Lord and my God.” On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we ask God to strengthen our faith to overcome our doubts so that we too may see the risen Lord in our midst.

The Importance of Worship on Sunday

This Sunday's Gospel opens at John 20:19, by telling us that Jesus' appearance to the disciples happens “on the evening of that first day of the week.” This points back to the beginning of that same chapter, where Mary of Magdala discovers Jesus' empty tomb “on the first day of the week.” Then, further along in today's Gospel, after that appearance and the Apostle Thomas' skepticism about it, we hear that the next part, with Jesus appearing to Thomas, happens “a week later.” In other words, John is careful to make clear that Jesus rose on *Sunday*, appeared to His disciples for the first time that *Sunday*, and then appeared to Thomas the following *Sunday*.

Sunday, John is telling us, had a central and essential place in the life and worship of the Church from the very beginning. Let us not ignore what a shocking assertion that is: the early Christians had the boldness to change the day they observed as “the Lord's Day” from Saturday (a designation written into the very story of creation in Genesis) to Sunday (the day of creation's glorious re-creation in Christ). Before there was any annual Easter celebration (and long before there was an annual Christmas celebration), there was the weekly Sunday celebration of Christ's resurrection.

We see this central place that Sunday held in the life of the Church in the witness of the martyrs of Abitene. They were a group of forty-nine Christians arrested in Tunisia in the year 303 when they were caught celebrating Sunday Mass in one of their homes. Standing before a judge for committing a crime that carried the penalty of death, the one among them who had hosted the group in his home was asked why they had ignored the law. He responded boldly, “Sine dominico non possumus” – “We cannot live without Sunday.” For such bold honesty and faith, the entire group went to their death. Can we live without Sunday?

Segundo Domingo de Pascua (Domingo de la Divina Misericordia)

«Hoy, el amor sencillo y desarmante de Jesús reanima el corazón de su discípulo. Como el apóstol Tomás, acojamos la misericordia, la salvación del mundo. Y mostremos misericordia a los más vulnerables; pues solo así construiremos un mundo nuevo». (Papa Francisco, Homilía, 19 de abril de 2020).

Las lecturas de este fin de semana captan el asombro y la alegría de la Iglesia primitiva al celebrar la nueva vida que han hallado en el Señor resucitado. En la Primera Lectura, los discípulos se reúnen para escuchar la enseñanza de los Apóstoles, para orar y para partir el pan, tal como hacemos nosotros hoy durante la Misa. La Primera Carta de Pedro exalta el don de la salvación, que suscita en nosotros una «esperanza viva». El Señor resucitado otorga a los Apóstoles el Espíritu Santo y el poder de perdonar los pecados en su nombre. Escuchemos e imaginémonos junto a los primeros miembros de la Iglesia naciente.

En el Evangelio, escuchamos la conocida historia de Santo Tomás, el apóstol que dudó de que Jesús hubiera resucitado verdaderamente, negándose a creer hasta no tocar las marcas de los clavos en las manos del Señor. Por misericordia hacia el único apóstol que se había perdido la primera aparición tras la resurrección de entre los muertos, Jesús regresó para invitar a Tomás a palpar sus heridas. Tomás, con una fe que anhelamos imitar, exclamó de inmediato: «¡Señor mío y Dios mío!». En este Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, pidamos a Dios que fortalezca nuestra fe para superar nuestras dudas, de modo que también nosotros podamos ver al Señor resucitado en medio de nosotros.

La Importancia de Guardar el Día Domingo

El Evangelio de este domingo comienza en Juan 20:19, diciéndonos que la aparición de Jesús a los discípulos ocurre «al atardecer de ese primer día de la semana». Esto nos remite al principio de ese mismo capítulo, donde María Magdalena descubre la tumba vacía de Jesús «el primer día de la semana». Luego, más adelante en el Evangelio de hoy —tras esa aparición y el escepticismo del apóstol Tomás al respecto— escuchamos que la siguiente parte, en la que Jesús se aparece a Tomás, sucede «una semana después». En otras palabras, Juan se esmera en dejar claro que Jesús resucitó el domingo, se apareció a sus discípulos por primera vez ese mismo domingo y, posteriormente, se apareció a Tomás el domingo siguiente.

El domingo —nos dice Juan— ocupó un lugar central y esencial en la vida y el culto de la Iglesia desde sus mismos inicios. No pasemos por alto cuán sorprendente resulta tal afirmación: los primeros cristianos tuvieron la audacia de cambiar el día que observaban como «el Día del Señor», pasando del sábado —una designación inscrita en la propia historia de la creación en el Génesis— al domingo: el día de la gloriosa recreación de la creación en Cristo. Antes de que existiera celebración anual alguna de la Pascua —y mucho antes de que existiera una celebración anual de la Navidad—, ya existía la celebración dominical y semanal de la resurrección de Cristo.

Vemos este lugar central que el domingo ocupaba en la vida de la Iglesia en el testimonio de los mártires de Abitene. Se trataba de un grupo de cuarenta y nueve cristianos arrestados en Túnez en el año 303, al ser sorprendidos celebrando la Misa dominical en una de sus propias casas. Al comparecer ante un juez por haber cometido un delito que conllevaba la pena de muerte, se le preguntó a aquel de entre ellos que había acogido al grupo en su hogar por qué habían desacatado la ley. Él respondió con audacia: «Sine dominico non possumus» — «No podemos vivir sin el domingo». Por tal audaz honestidad y fe, todo el grupo marchó hacia la muerte. ¿Podemos nosotros vivir sin el domingo?
