



MAY THEY REST IN PEACE. Today all Catholics unite in prayer for all the faithful departed; All Souls' Day is so important it 'bumps' the Ordinary Time Sunday. And my summer series on Pope Leo and the Jubilee Days 'bumped' my plans to reflect on the 3 sets of Jubilee Year Mass orations which can only be used on weekdays with no obligatory Solemnity, Feast, Memorial. I reflected on 'Set A' last January; today I will do 'Set B' and next week 'Set C.' Although they can only be 'officially' used for a few more weeks, they are still sources of grace and spiritual inspiration.

Collect - Mass for the Holy Year - B

O God, who in the fullness of time sent your Son into the world as our Savior, grant that, making our pilgrim way through history, the light of his paschal mystery may lead us to encounter you, our only hope.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE ARE AN EASTER PEOPLE. Every Rite and ritual the Church offers seeks to incorporate us into Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection. While the Sacraments are the most efficacious way to enter into the paschal mystery, Holy Year traditions like pilgrimages to sacred sites, offering prescribed prayers, seeking indulgences, etc., also unite us to Christ's saving deeds.

Prayer over the Offerings - Mass for the Holy Year - B
O Lord, may the offerings that we present on
your altars in joyful celebration of this holy year
be acceptable in your sight, so that we may
come to share in the eternal life of him
by whose mortality we are saved from death,
Jesus Christ our Lord.
Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

WE DIE WITH CHRIST SO WE CAN LIVE WITH HIM. As we commemorate All Souls' Day in this Holy Year, we offer prayers for the faithful departed who are still on their pilgrimage to heaven. For no one is asked to make this arduous journey alone; we are meant to help each other by interceding for each other. What have you done for your beloved dead?

<u>Preface - Mass for the Holy Year - B</u>

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For your Son, begotten before all ages, born in time of the Virgin Mary, and anointed by the Holy Spirit, proclaimed a year of favor in your name, bringing consolation to the afflicted, redemption to captives, salvation and peace to the whole human race.

He is the one true hope, surpassing every human hope, that shines forth in every age.

And so, with all the Angels and Saints, we praise you, as without end we acclaim:

Holy, Holy, Holy ...

A YEAR OF FAVOR. In His inaugural address, Jesus set the stage for Holy Years: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." [Luke 4:18-19] As All Souls' Day soberly reminds us: eventually, time runs out ... so we must make proper use of whatever time with which the Lord gifts us ... before it's too late. Since this is an acceptable time, remember to pray for those who need our help in being freed from sin.

<u>Prayer after Communion - Mass for the Holy Year - B</u>

May our participation at your table sanctify us, O Lord, we pray, and grant that through the Sacrament of your Church all nations may receive in rejoicing the salvation accomplished on the Cross by your Only Begotten Son. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

GUESTS AT GOD'S TABLE. A common image of heaven used by Jesus and many Prophets is that of a banquet or feast. Every Eucharistic Celebration is a foretaste of the eternal party to which we have been invited. However, we must actively participate in the Sacred Mysteries to benefit from their countless blessings and graces. We can also make an intention at holy Mass to offer these spiritual gifts FOR others, especially those who have preceded us through death.






