My Moral Theology professor from St. Vincent Seminary asked the for-credit students to write a paper on the moral and spiritual life of any modern saint. Even after I learned my level of involvement didn't require a paper, I wanted to write one anyhow. It's still in process.

Born in Hebei, China in 1834, Mark Ji Tianxiang (tyen-SHONG) became a physician and frequently worked *pro bono*. To treat a stomach ailment, he was prescribed (or prescribed himself, I'm not sure) opium, to which he became addicted. His condition caused scandal in the community and church.

Devastated, Mark soon turned to the grace of the Sacraments for divine help, especially the Eucharist and Confession. However, since he was admitting to the same sin so often, his confessor told him to come back when he had the firm purpose of amendment necessary for absolution. Who could fault any shame and despair in such circumstances?

Mark continued to pray and go to church, hoping to witness to his faith even as a martyr, which the Boxer Rebellion would facilitate for him. Many Chinese considered Christianity among the foreign influences of which their country needed to be purified. Mark heroically pleaded to be killed last among his family members so they wouldn't die alone.

Is firm purpose of amendment necessary for absolution? Yes. Did 19th century China (or anywhere) realize the physical influence that drugs can exert over the human body and mind? The suffering Christ identified with Mark in his addiction and the Church validated Mark's witness of perseverance with the honors of the altar.

Addicts belong. They need our prayers, and we need theirs.


