- + The "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults" (OCIA) is the new name for the process that prepares people to receive any or all "Sacraments of Initiation" (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Following are some points from an article in the *Detroit Catholic:*
- + Rites are still part of the Order, but the new structure is meant to invite candidates and catechumens into a continuous process of spiritual formation as opposed to fixed checkpoints on the path to [the Sacraments of Initiation]."
- + The rituals, whenever undergone, are just one part of the <u>ongoing</u>, <u>lifelong</u> <u>journey of</u> <u>discipleship</u>.
- + "While most converts enter the Church at the Easter Vigil, this new structure acknowledges that converts could be baptized or welcomed into the Church at any point in the year, even taking multiple years of prayerful discernment before making the final decision."

Clergy and faithful from our Diocese recently attended the 10<sup>th</sup> National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, which capped the three-year National Eucharistic Revival. The Congress, the first such since 1941\*, featured a huge procession and presenters from around the world. (\*The one in Philly in 1976 was international.)

Our diocese gave little airtime to the Revival, in favor of a "Year of Real Presence" independent of and leading up to it. Our YORP had many diocesan and local events aimed to inspire more of the same in the future. Our "Forty Hours Devotion" remains a staple (upcoming one TBA).

I reflect here on a point from the speech by Father Mike Schmitz of the Diocese of Duluth. Some years before, a priest on Twitter, Father Paul Hedman of the Archdiocese of St. Paul-Minneapolis (@backwardsfeet), said something similar. Here I summarize with commentary.

The "tent revivals" of the "Great Awakening" of the 1730s were evangelical Protestant events, lamentably devoid of Christ's Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist. However, their focus on the Gospel spurred a surge in repentance, which always follows a duel with God's two-edged sWord.

As the Word of God leads to the Sacrifice of His Flesh and shedding of His Blood in atonement for all sin, there can be no revival without repentance. External repentance and interior conversion prevent liturgical undertakings from becoming dogand-pony shows that have never impressed God or His prophets. Pull no punches in a repentance revival, why dontcha?
