An online friend, Father Chase Goodman of the Diocese of Victoria (TX) has been publishing on his parish Facebook page an excellent series on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which I am summarizing. This week's material gets to the heart of our journey in discipleship: the ins and outs of prayer.

Regular examination of conscience and confession helps us to see patterns of sin as well as the sometimes seemingly insignificant root causes and conditions known in the Act of Contrition as "near occasions of sin": the people, places, and things that make sins easier to choose.

Even further, sins have underlying emotions and desires worth consideration, though not worth confession because they are not in and of themselves sinful. Recovering addicts try to avoid getting too hungry, angry, lonely, or tired (HALT). But we need to become aware of ourselves in those states, and here's where distractions do us dirty.

While distractions are a regular part of life—some would say they *are* life—we want to learn how to deal with them well. When we want to dedicate ourselves to prayer, instead we start to think about errands, what we should have said, a show we watched or want to watch, upcoming appointments, fears and worries, and prayer takes a back seat.

Prepare for prayer as much as possible. Deliberately reserve the time and space as much as one might for a spouse or friend (and even that is getting harder today!). In the same way, examining one's conscience deserves an unpressured block of time, especially if the span since your last confession is long.

Examinations frequently bid us consider not only where we committed sins in the day, but more broadly, where God was offering me grace, where God was calling me to be holy? If I don't recall anything, that betrays a lack of sensitivity, as God is always lavishing such opportunities upon us. Notice!

We conclude this brief (2-3 minute) period by resolving to do better, praying for greater sensitivity to the presence and invitations of God, and thanking Him for the good we did accomplish, all by His grace!

While checklists help (think the back of our **Treasury of Prayer** book), the moral life is more than a checklist. In the Gospels, Jesus calls us to interiorize the commandments, to affirm their basis in the knowledge and love of God's will, where true happiness lies.

While the Treasury focuses on the Ten Commandments, a reliable guide for sure, and further gives the nod to the Precepts of the Church, there are the Beatitudes, the capital sins, and the works of mercy, corporal and spiritual. Examinations become more thorough, beyond self-centered navel-gazing to where God wants us to invest in relationships and responsibilities.

Stop excusing yourselves for "not killing anyone or running around." Big whoop! Jesus said murder and adultery start in the heart. Look out for ways to show charity and tolerance, check motives for actions, seek peace and justice, and the needle starts moving toward the Lord's ideal for living. Next week I will cite a more detailed plan meant for more than monks.








