A couple days ago the priests of the Diocese received an electronic missive from Maggie Riggins, Diocesan Executive Director of Evangelization and Formation and Marian Catholic alumna. Having served in campus ministry at DeSales, she is a blessing to our whole Diocese.

Maggie mentioned that our Diocese is echoing the National Eucharistic Revival's initiative, <u>Invite One Back</u>. Whether it was the pandemic, or some other reason that has kept a person or family away for one, two, three weeks and eventually the same number of years, "now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation!" (2 Cor 6:2)

^{*}The number of registered families (potential BWAC donors) is "adjusted" from previous ParishSoft records, and likely not 100% accurate. 25% of what we raise over our goal will return to the parish, as well as 100% of gifts from donors NEW to the appeal this year.

Christmas might be considered a prime time to invite people back, but why not the Solemnity of Christ the King? Why not the Second Sunday of Lent, or the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, for that matter?

My guess: since Christmas is such a special day, even (though for different reasons) in secular circles, it might seem "more meaningful" as a time to return. Horsepucky! Do you think you're God's gift to the Church or to our parish? You are. And we'll take gifts from God anytime.

Or will we? Do we turn people away from helping at parish events because "we have enough help"? Do we scatter like mice to our cars for no good reason? Or: do we gatekeep with doctrines (however true they are), or sound like we stump for a political party more than represent Jesus? I don't think the initiative was called "Push One Away"!

Might as well just drive them to one of our so-called competitors. You know, the ones who go by initials (says the pastor of "SSPP"). True, a church doesn't need to go by initials to be more welcoming, sound more "relevant" (whatever that means), or otherwise "reel one in."

I've read those survey results, and I wonder. How well do we (read: I) equip Christ's beloved faithful to know and be known, love and be loved, give and be given by Him? How well do we trust Who and what we know when the opportunity to know, love, or share emerges?

It's not all on the pastor, but I want to take care of what is proper to me. This same analogy applies to parents and their children (for you do call me Father, and both my spiritual generativity and your physical generativity—and spiritual influence—derive from God, a Communion of Love).

I submit that the spiritual fruitfulness of a person and a parish depend on their willingness to recognize, repent, and reveal their interior lives in the appropriate forum. Short confessional lines translate into short-lived parishes.


