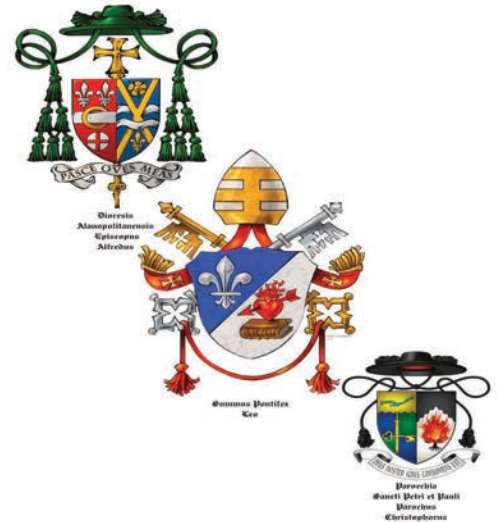

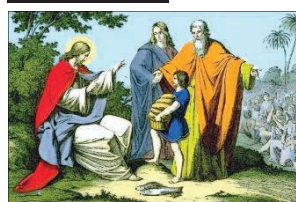

As Canon and Diocesan Law stipulate, the priest will keep only one of the stipends (offerings) and send the other to the Diocese for the priest retirement fund and upkeep of Holy Family Villa, the Diocesan home for retired and infirm priests.

**Stations of the Crib:** Journey with Franciscan Sister Barbara Brown through the story of Christ’s birth, from the Annunciation to Bethlehem and beyond. Experience the mystery of God’s humility and love in the Incarnation. Celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation often feature today’s first reading from the eleventh chapter of Isaiah. The prophet paints a truly charismatic leader (Gr *charisma*, “gift,” > *charis*: cf. Eucharist, rizz); He is anointed with the “spirit of the Lord,” Whom the prophet does not yet understand in personal, trinitarian terms.

As the most human and Godlike powers are the will and intellect, the Spirit’s infusion influences them the most: wisdom, understanding, counsel, and knowledge perfect the intellect, while the others augment the will. Isaiah mentions “fear of the Lord” twice, but the catechetical tradition teased out “piety,” filial devotion, to make it a perfect seven.

Consider these gifts fully operative in Jesus, effortlessly able to draw the apostles from their families and livelihoods, to confer health upon the sick, calmness to storms, and above all forgiveness to sinners.

The “offshoot of Jesse” signals another David, another ideal King, known for justice, advocacy, fidelity, and peacefulness. His charismata will extend unto earth’s bounds, such that nations and their citizens no longer will inflict their insecurities upon their neighbors across continents, rivers, streets, or pews.

Anything unworthy of this King deserves to burn. Our attachments must be separated from us like the Baptist’s head. Jesus wants us entirely unto Himself. His call to “repentance” means attitude and value changes befitting a sovereign God coming to claim His own.



John the Baptist prepared the people for the coming of Jesus. He taught them to repent, be sorry for their sins and reform their lives to be good and helpful to others.

## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

### Directions

- [1] Color the tree green, write your good deeds on the ornaments and color them in.
- [2] Cut out and fold at right angle to stand up by itself.
- [3] Each week of Advent complete the tree and repeat steps 1-2.
- [4] After you have 4 weeks of trees colored, filled in and cut out, attach **week 1** to **week 2** by matching the corner letters and gluing or taping halves together up to the fold line. Do the same for **week 3** and **week 4**, which will then attach to **week 1** and **2** to complete.

Color tree and fill in good deeds, then color ornaments and cut out.

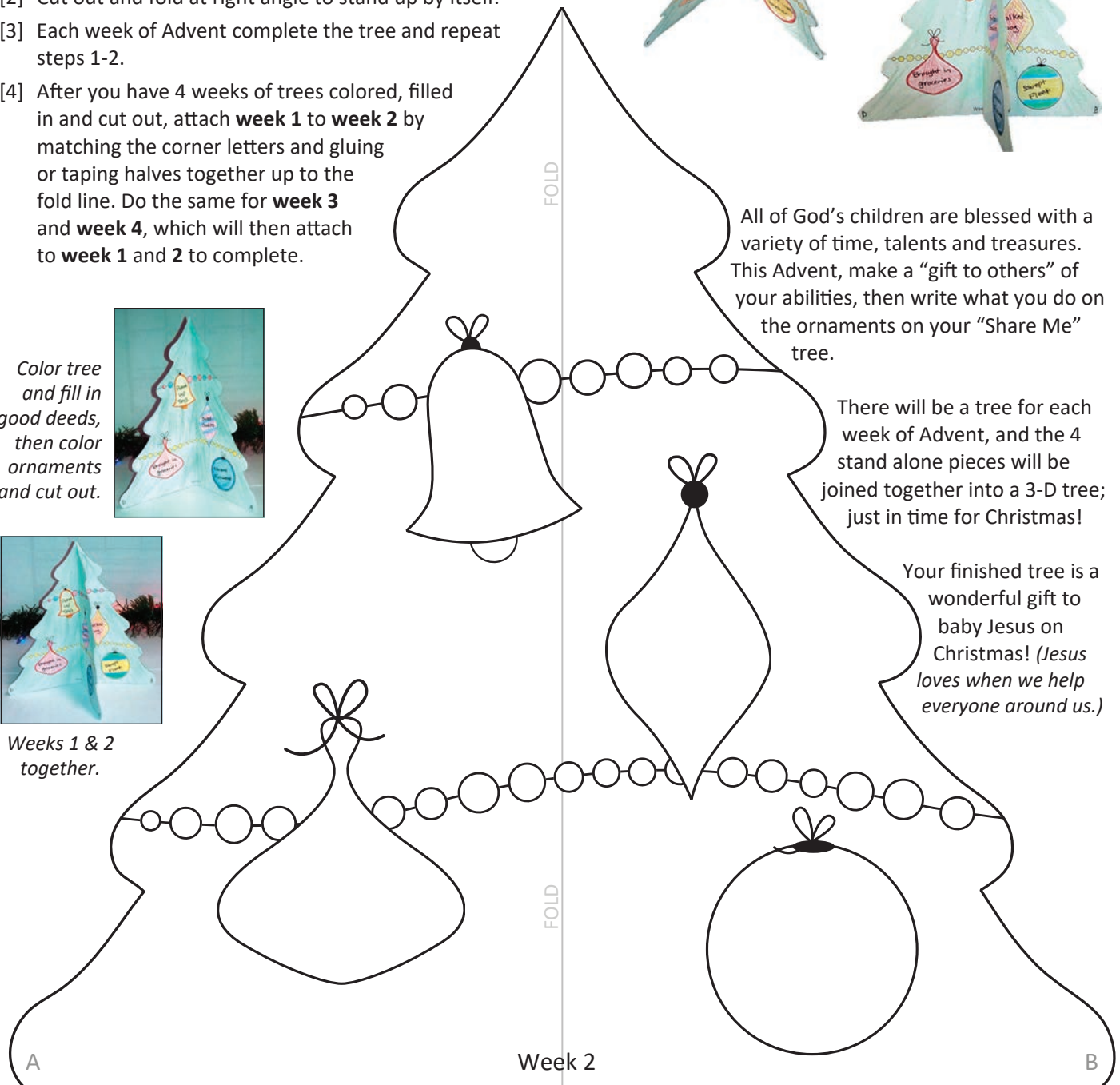
Different angles of completed tree.
