

While humility underlies each of the Scripture readings for this weekend, Jesus definitively spells it out in the eight Beatitudes: poverty of spirit, mourning, meekness, hungering and thirsting for righteousness, mercy, cleanliness of heart, peacemaking, and persecution for the sake of righteousness/Him.

Humility also can be called "littleness," which one priest describes as "lovable limitation." We tend to consider it natural and unfeigned, and so it presents in some fortunate souls. The prophet Zephaniah, however, exhorted us to "seek" it, so intentionality ends up necessary for most of us. But if we think we have humility, do we have it? Better to focus on faith working through love and sustained by hope.

Another helpful synonym is "willingness to live in reality." The ancients defined truth as "the conformity of the mind to the object." Modernity has it backwards. Our Creator strangely invested us with freedom that we can misuse to unmake or destroy ourselves, especially when our passions dominate us and muck up our perception of reality.

The baptismal call to holiness requires roots in the truth, where we regularly rediscover and reaffirm our limits. Here we identify with God-the-Son-made-man, Jesus, Who exceeded the limits of His humanity only for the benefit of others, as when He healed them, taught them, or forgave their sins.

"[We] have centered ourselves on political figures and movements rather than on Jesus Christ. No problem of this world will be solved without the foundation of a profound friendship with Jesus Christ, prophetic teaching of Him crucified for the forgiveness of sins, and above all seeking Him first, Who is the Way and the Truth and the Life. We do not worship the donkey. We do not worship the elephant. We worship the Lamb." (Fr. Paul Hedman, priest of the Archdiocese of Minneapolis-St. Paul and Minnesota National Guard chaplain.)




