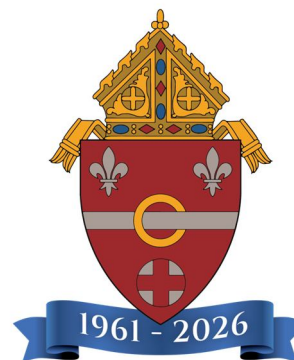

As we celebrate the 65th Anniversary of the Diocese of Allentown, Bishop Schlert invites you to take part in a special spiritual initiative for this jubilee year: **33 Days to Eucharistic Glory**.

This diocesan-wide journey of prayer and Eucharistic renewal will begin on May 5 and culminate on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, June 7, with a Eucharistic Consecration across our Diocese.

Together, we are invited to deepen our love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and to unite as one Church in prayer during this milestone year.

Free copies of the book “33 Days to Eucharistic Glory” by Matthew Kelly will be available at every parish to help everyone prepare for the Consecration. Books are available in the back of the church.

Safe and Sacred Space the Second (SSSS) is our campaign to raise money toward the replacement of the church HVAC, the Coal Street sidewalk, and the cemetery road. Donate through the QR code. Estimated costs for these projects: church HVAC, \$65,000; Coal Street sidewalk, \$40,000; parish cemetery road, \$70,000; for a total of approximately \$175,000. *Some four-figure gifts have come in!*



Eucharistic Adoration every Thursday from noon to 6:00 PM, and **the Sacrament of Penance (Confession)** is available from 5 to 6 PM.

Parish Beautification Days: In the week of **May 10-16**, we begin demolition of a dividing wall and will load the dumpster with debris and with items from the convent and the modular); in the week of **May 17-23**, we begin moving currently-stored and Backyard Bash items back into the new storage room. Diocesan Vocation Ministry: Please join us in offering a **Spiritual Bouquet** of prayers for Fr. Zelonis. You can pick up specially-made cards and information in the back of the church. Cards should be returned by June 7th.

As part of the new **Diocesan Vocations Ministry**, Bishop Schlert has asked parents, catechists, etc. to recommend names of parishioners who might be suitable candidates for ordained or consecrated life. They are also collecting phone cards, which can be dropped off in marked envelopes. Please place all cash and card donations in the collection or take them to the parish office. Call Esther in advance (570-657-6738) to donate larger items. Those in need of these items can call Esther or the rectory (option 4).

Regarding the former convent building, we have two choices: **retention/renovation, or demolition**. To fix it up to code will be expensive. Demolition also will be expensive, especially if and when asbestos remediation is necessary. The Diocese has been very helpful in helping with the bidding process. The parish will assume responsibility for the costs, whichever option we go with, as it remains parish property. The Society agreed to pay for the restoration of the boiler and various pipes to working order. **Home Comfort Solutions (parishioners) performed that service at a considerable discount to them.**

Father Zelonis intends to convene the Finance Committee and the Pastoral Council to inform about the bids and to solicit opinions on the above options.

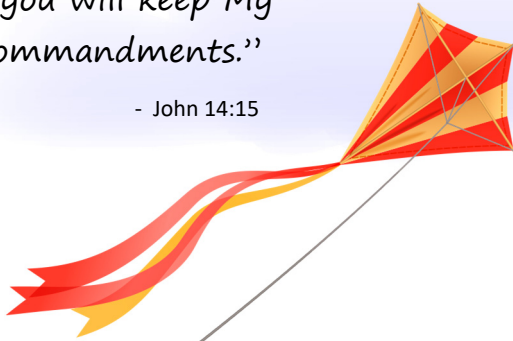
