## Second Sunday of Lent

*Sunday, March 17, 2019*

### First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God told Abram that he would give him the land of Egypt and his descendants would become a great people. Abram then made sacrifices to God, cutting them in half. A torch passed between the pieces, as a visible sign to Abram of God's promise.

### Second Reading: Philippians 3:17- 4:1

Paul urges the Philippians to avoid becoming too interested in material possessions. He reminds them that their most important wealth is their faith in Jesus, which will lead them to eternal life.

### Gospel: Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus took Peter, John and James to a mountain to pray. When His clothes grew incredibly white, Moses and Elijah appeared. They spoke of the scripture He was to fulfill. Then a cloud came down and a voice said, "This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to Him." The disciples who had seen Jesus' glory did not disclose this experience to anyone until much later.

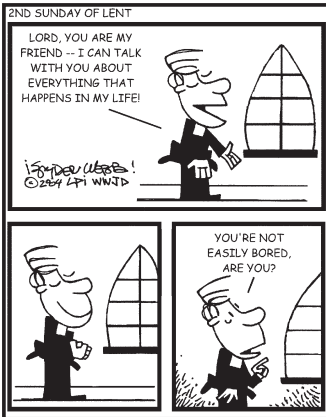

## Matthew's Men in March

Praying with the Beatitudes  
Saturday, March 23, 2019

In March, Matthew's Men welcomes a very special Lenten guest speaker, Bishop Manuel Cruz, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark. Bishop Cruz will provide us with an exegesis of "Blessed" and "the poor" from our Lord's words in the Beatitudes and help us to reflect on how men can pray with the Beatitudes in particular and with scriptures in general. How, in other words, to live and pray the power of the Word!

Bishop Cruz was born in Havana, Cuba and emigrated to the United States in 1966, was ordained in 1980 and appointed a bishop by Pope Benedict XVI in June 2008. He is Vicar for the Newark Archdiocesan Hispanic Apostolate, a faculty member at the New Jersey Medical School of Rutgers University and the Rector of the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark, NJ. Clearly a very busy man, and we appreciate him taking the time to teach us and reflect with us.

All of the men of St. Matthew's are invited to join us for this special faith-sharing breakfast on March 23. Join us in Heritage Hall, from 8:00 to 9:30 am and hear Bishop Cruz, participate in the discussion or just sit back and take it all in. Whatever your preference, it promises to be an excellent addition to your Lenten journey!

## Lenten Abstinence Guidelines & Reflections

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays during Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound on by this may fast from one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Lent (springtime) calls us to be with Jesus. Making Jesus our focus and placing ourselves in His Presence will bring us closer to live as resurrected Christians at Easter. Choose these forty days to live with Christ who was nourished by prayer and fasting and lived in communion with God.

## Gospel Meditation

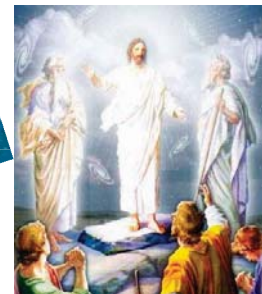


### 2nd Sunday of Lent

As we march through Lent, it can be easy to think it's all about sacrifice. No chocolate, no alcohol, no meat on Fridays. Yet here, only in the second week of Lent, we have the story of the Transfiguration. The reading reminds us of the *why* behind what we do. We don't fast from dessert to lose weight. We don't donate money or serve others because it's merely a nice thing to do. Lent is about transformation!

Peter, James and John trudged up the mountainside behind Jesus. This must have been a difficult hike because when they reached the top, "*Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep.*" Despite our best efforts, perhaps we too, can be asleep to the deeper meaning of the Lenten season. Jesus is transfigured while they slumber, but eventually they become "fully awake, [and] they saw His glory and the two men standing with Him."

This is no small thing! The disciples witness Jesus in his divine splendor and see the miraculous apparitions of Moses and Elijah. The entire mountain becomes a spiritual breakthrough. "*A cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud.*" These symbols are present in the Old Testament. They are present on Mount Sinai when Moses prayed alone and received the 10 Commandments. Elijah had a similar experience when he prayed alone before God. But here are ordinary men, former fishermen, who have been drawn up into an adventure beyond their wildest expectations. Jesus is the Christ, Messiah, the fulfillment of all that came before. But Christianity is not the religion of the elite, where only the select few are allowed to participate. We are invited into spiritual transformation. Lent is a privileged time for this!
