## Palm Sunday

*Sunday, April 14, 2019*

### First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes an individual who had been taught by God to reach out to others. He also describes this individual's willingness to be beaten and spit upon, secure that with God's help, he will not be disgraced.

### Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul discusses how Jesus did not declare equality with God, but took on human form. He humbled himself enough to accept dying on the cross. God in turn exalted him and wants us to respect Jesus' name and worship him.

### Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56

Luke gives a detailed account of Jesus' last supper with the apostles, where Jesus tells them He will soon suffer in fulfillment of God's will. Then Jesus prayed that He might be spared if it suited God's will. After Judas betrayed Jesus, he was arrested. Although Pilate did not think Jesus was guilty of a crime, he gave in to the will of the people, and sentenced Jesus to death on a cross. Then Jesus was crucified and His body laid in a new tomb.

#### *Inspiration for the Week*

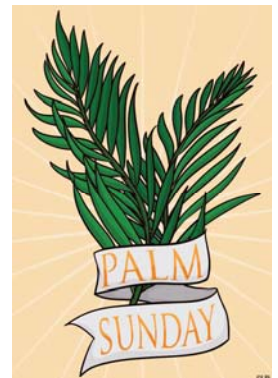

### Sacramental Guideline for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist

Diocesan guidelines: Sacramental preparation is a two-year process. Children must be enrolled in formal faith formation classes for two years prior to the reception of Sacraments.

### Sacramental Guidelines for Catholic School Students

Per Diocesan Policy, all Catholic School students preparing for reception of Confirmation are to participate in their Parish Community's Sacramental preparation programs.

Students entering 9<sup>th</sup> grade in September 2019 are reminded to enroll for Faith Formation classes.

*The preparation and the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation are parish-based. The parish is the center of lifelong faith development; therefore, it is essential to integrate youth into the life of the parish. Students who attend Catholic high schools and wish to be prepared for the Sacrament of Confirmation need to enroll in their parish Confirmation program. (from Sacramental Policies and Guidelines, Diocese of Paterson)*

## Gospel Meditation

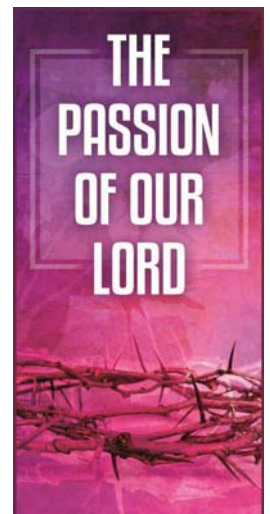


### Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is a strange day in our liturgical calendar. We begin by waving palms, but somewhere in the middle, we call for Jesus to be crucified. We celebrate today an equally paradoxical God, one who comes to save through suffering.

*"I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out!"* Jesus, who so often in the Gospels tries to hide his true identity, speaks thunderously to the Pharisees who would still the rejoicing crowd. At the Last Supper, Jesus confirms the Messianic promise to his disciples, saying *"I confer a kingdom on you, just as my Father has conferred one on me."* Yet, before the night is over, Jesus has been betrayed.

We hear the tragedy unfold in Luke's Passion narrative. Jesus is abused by the council of elders, denied by Peter, whipped by Roman soldiers and condemned to death by Pilate. But what else do we see? Jesus heals someone who came to arrest him, forgives his torturers, promises a repentant man paradise and - by his loving endurance - converts a centurion at the foot of the cross. Jesus is both Redeemer of the World and Suffering Servant. In taking on the mantle of Messiah, Jesus does not only receive our praise and our accolades, but he bears our burdens and sins and does so with the deepest love. He may go about our salvation in a paradoxical way, but he is dearer to our own suffering hearts for it. This week, we remember that no sorrow of our own is beyond the reach of the compassion of God.

## Soles 4 Souls *Shoe collection*



Two eighth-grade students at Randolph Middle School are working on a project to help create and promote a more successful society. They are participating in a capstone *take action* to benefit the lives of others and promote an inclusive society. They are working with goals promoting infrastructure, technologies, and equality in general.

The *take action* focuses on the idea that people lack basic transportation methods and quality jobs in developing nations. People are struggling to travel and support their families due to various challenges. Walking is the main source of transportation and many people are walking on a rocky terrain in bare feet. This difficult situation prevents kids from getting to school and adults from getting to work.

There is a collection bin in the Gathering space where gently used shoes may be donated. The shoes will be donated to the organization **Soles4Souls**. By donating shoes, you will be providing developing communities with footwear that will allow them to travel easier and will create job opportunities as well. We ask that the shoes be in good shape and are paired. For sanitary reasons, please place donations in a plastic bag.
