



National Vocations Awareness Week from the desk of Father Brelinsky



Our Bishops have declared that this week is "National Vocations Awareness Week" (Nov. 2-8). Although that might not sound as exciting as "National Donut day" (Nov. 5), Vocations are worth our attention! God calls every person to a relationship with Himself: we call this the "universal call to holiness." But there are many people who are called to holiness by means of consecrated life (such as nuns and friars) and the holy priesthood. These sorts of religious vocations are integral to the life of the Church.

Saint Paul often tells us that the Body of Christ is made up of many members; for example, 1 Corinthians 12. These members fulfill a wide variety of roles in the life of the Church. Many will enter the married state and live family life and share the faith with their children. Many will serve in the single or unmarried state. Still others will make religious vows, professions, or receive the sacrament of Holy Orders. Thus, the various members are united in faith, even while answering different callings.

This week, we are asked to pray for religious vocations. In every age, God calls women to become religious sisters or nuns and men to become brothers, deacons, and priests. It would be a foolish understatement merely to say, "The Church needs more priests." Rather, it is better to say, "How is God calling me?" Further, our mission then becomes encouraging and supporting those who seek to answer God's call.

And so, I have three missions for every parishioner during this Vocations Awareness Week: 1) Pray that you might know your own vocation clearly. 2) Pray for an increase in vocations in our diocese, our parish, even from your family! And 3) directly encourage someone in the pursuit of their vocation. If you are a parent or grandparent, ask your children if they have considered the possibility of the priesthood or religious life.

Prayer for Vocations: God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve in your Son's Kingdom as priests, deacons, and consecrated persons. Send your Holy Spirit to help others to respond generously and courageously to your call. May our community of faith support vocations of sacrificial love in our youth and young adults. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen



I ask that you blind Satan to every parishioner, that they might have the space to know and love you without temptation.





Funeral Procedures

The loss of a loved one is difficult. The first step in making funeral arrangements is to contact the funeral home of your choice. The funeral director will then contact the church to make arrangements for a time, date, and priest. Someone from our Bereavement Committee will reach out to meet with you at the Parish Office to plan the Mass. Funeral Masses are held on weekdays.

Catholic Funeral and Burial

As Catholics, we are blessed with the promise of life everlasting. Death is not the end, but rather the next step. At death, we present our bodies for a sacred Catholic funeral and burial to be prepared for the Resurrection. Choosing a final resting place on consecrated grounds is your choice, your privilege, and the right of every Catholic, as well as a confirmation of faith in our everlasting union with our Lord. Hospital Note

If you or a loved one are in the hospital, need to be anointed, or would like to be added to the sick list for prayer for two weeks, please be sure to call the parish office at 610-395-2876. In the case of an emergency anointing when the office is closed, please use the office number above and extension 16.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

BAPTISM: Held on Sundays at 12:00PM in the church. First time parents must attend a baptism workshop that is held the first Saturday of each month at 9:30AM in the Parish Center. Please call the rectory at 610-395-2876 about your interest in this sacrament and Deacon Readinger will get back to you with all the details. Families must be active registered parishioners at our church for 3 months. Godparents must be practicing their faith and able to get a sponsor form of eligibility from their home parish.

MARRIAGE: Couples must contact one of the Parish Priests at least 6 months in advance of their intended wedding date. Note: Bride or Groom must be a Registered and practicing member for at least 6 months. In addition to the three sessions with the Priest, the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Dialogues must also be attended. Weddings are on Saturdays at 10AM,12PM, or 2PM.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Notify the office as soon as someone becomes seriously ill or weak due to old age, so that they might receive the Sacrament of Extreme Unction.

<u>COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND:</u> The Extraordinary Ministers visit the homebound weekly and visitation can be scheduled through the Parish Office. This includes those who are Catholic and in nursing homes covered by St. Joseph the Worker Parish. Contact the Parish Office.

HOSPITALIZED: If possible, alert the parish office whenever someone has to be hospitalized, especially if this admission is an emergency. Remember that each hospital knows which Catholic Parish is responsible for its emergency situations. A family member should notify the office of any admission if they want their name on the prayer list for the sick.
