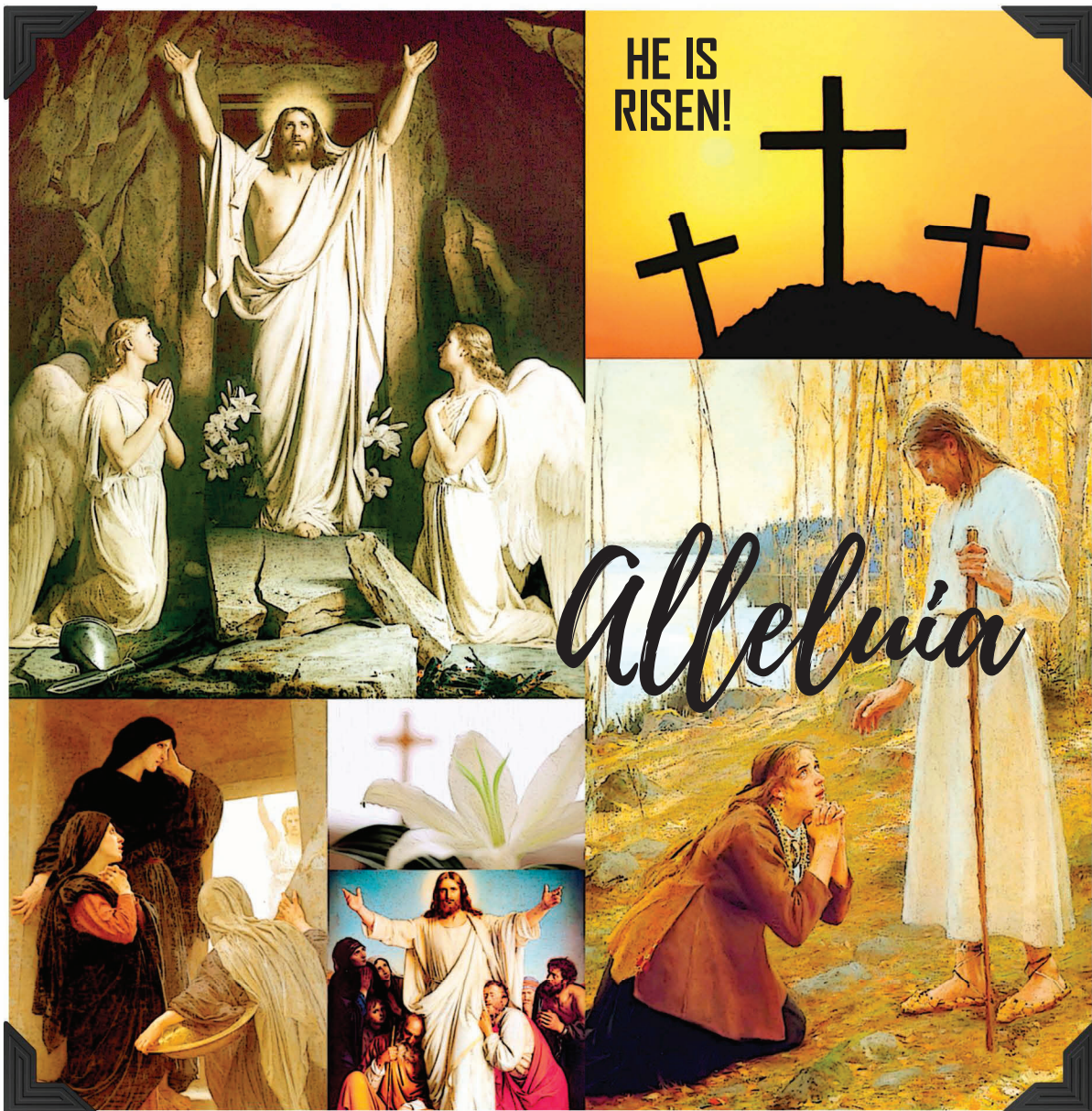

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS
HIS WORD TODAY

Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord
April 5, 2026

“Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, ‘He has been raised from the dead, and he is going to Galilee; there you will see him.’ Behold, I have told you. Then they went quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed.”

How many selections from the scriptures can be used for our reflection today! The gospel of Matthew and the message to Mary Magdalene is chosen, for she, who perhaps was the first to encounter the Risen Lord, is advised to go to Galilee to see Him. Before going, we find her as the first evangelizer of the good news, to tell the disciples that He is alive and where they could find Him.

Fearful yet overjoyed they ran to announce this to the disciples. As we too are overjoyed with the Easter message, we are sent. ‘He met them on their way and greeted them.’ May we discover the many ways Jesus meets us this special day as He sends us to tell the good news.



**SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER OR SUNDAY OF
DIVINE MERCY**

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

In the early days of the Church in Jerusalem, the faithful listened intently to the teachings of the apostles. They lived a communal life, sharing all property in common and praying and taking their meals together.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

In this first letter from Peter, he speaks to the Christians with great joy and confidence, reminding them that through Christ's resurrection, they have been given a new birth and are heirs to the kingdom of heaven.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

After his resurrection, Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the power to forgive sins. Thomas, who is absent, sees Christ later and believes in His resurrection after feeling His wounds. Christ admonishes Thomas by saying, “You became a believer because you saw Me. Blessed are they who have not seen and believed.”

**REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURE READINGS
BEFORE MASS**

You can enrich your experience of the Liturgy of the Word during Mass by reflecting on the Scripture readings before the Mass. It could help you to better hear what God is trying to say to you through His Word and it also gives you the opportunity to do your own study on these passages to get a better understanding of the context in which they were written. The next week's Mass readings are in the bulletin every week.
