First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

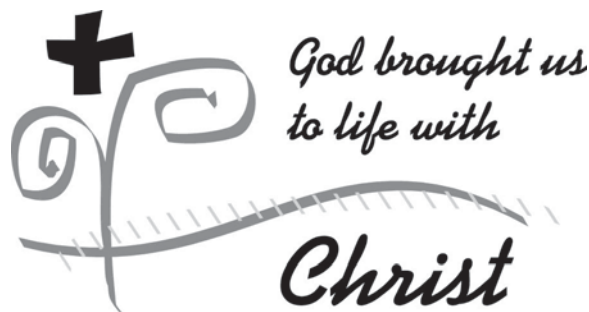

Our Father, We Have Wandered

This Lent, we have been singing the hymn "Our Father, We Have Wandered" as our gathering song. The words of this hymn were written by Monsignor Kevin Nichols (1929-2006), who was a Roman Catholic priest for the diocese of Hexham and Newcastle in England. Nichols was a teacher as well as a poet and writer.

Nichols studied English at Cambridge University, and then taught English, theology, and religious education. He became a member of the International Committee for English in the Liturgy, and as his influence grew, he was appointed associate professor at the Catholic University of America. After retiring from teaching, he returned to England to be a parish priest. Nichols contributed to writing the moral section of the Catechism of the Catholic Church published in 1992, and published books and articles about religious education.

The beautiful text "Our Father, We Have Wandered" is about reconciliation with God. One of the lines in the first verse strikes a chord with me: "...as distant but compelling, we hear you call our name." I believe this thought to be true for many of us; God's voice is distant because it is a mystery, but it is compelling because deep inside, we believe God is really calling us.

May our faith be deepened through our prayers and reflection this Lent, and take hope in our faith that God is calling our name.

From the Desk of our Pastor, Fr. Bob-

Lent: Personal Prayer

At a recent weekday mass Mark's Gospel (Mk: 7:1-12) brought forth a reflection on personal prayer with the instruction to ask, seek and knock in the way we approach God. I pondered over those three words prior to celebrating mass, and concluded that they may be summarized with the acronym "ASK" (A: Ask, S: Seek, and K: Knock.) I mentioned that frequently we become frustrated with this passage in that we ask, seek, and knock, but do not obtain all that we ASK. I believe this occurs since it is common to pray for "things" from God rather than a greater sense of God's presence in our lives. This week the church celebrates Laetare Sunday (the 4th Sunday in Lent) which calls us to "rejoice." Sometimes we forget to rejoice throughout Lent, which is an opportune season to review personal prayer so that prayer is not a request for "things" but for a greater closeness for God's presence in our lives.

At times our prayer may be lackluster or appear to be a chore, which reminds me of a young boy who was once asked if he ever prayed. His answer, "Sometimes I pray, but sometimes I just say my prayers." This occurs so easily in many lives whereby repetition leads us to just say prayers rather than pray, which is a mighty difference. It is healthy to set times for prayer within a day and a style of prayer that is meaningful to us, but there is a fine line between "saying prayers" to accomplish a task versus prayer that comes from the heart that establishes a deepened relationship and connection with God. I also believe that some of our greatest prayer is at moments of stress when only God may render calmness to life; yet, set times for prayer renders discipline that is needed in our spiritual lives in the same manner that we set times to begin class, work, exercise, and even meals. Prayer throughout a day is essential since it maintains communication with God in the same way we communicate with others whom we love in our lives.

One great challenge in prayer is to reveal ourselves to God in whatever way that begets honesty to the relationship. Martin Luther once stated that to be successful in prayer we cannot "lie to God." Matthew's Gospel (6:16-18) read on Ash Wednesday makes it known that personal prayer should not be boastful, but done in secrecy; therefore, prayer should engender the ability to reveal the truth about our lives to God, which consist of our thoughts, desires, weaknesses, and feelings in the true capacity that they exist. This reveals the reality of our lives as it is common for many of us to live in denial before God in not wishing to acknowledge our true selves unlike Jeremiah, Job, and King David in the Old Testament who owned up to their weaknesses before God.

Last weekend brought Pope Francis to Iraq. In his message on Saturday, March 6, the pontiff stated, "At times we go through moments of darkness in our personal, family or social life, and of fear that there is no way out. We feel frightened before great enigmas such as illness, innocent pain or the mystery of death. In the same journey of faith, we often stumble encountering the scandal of the cross and the demands of the Gospel, which calls us to spend our life in service and to lose it in love, rather than preserve it for ourselves and protect it. Thus, we need a different outlook of a light that illuminates the mystery of life in depth, and helps us to move beyond our paradigms and beyond the criteria of this world."

Examine your personal prayer. Do you pray for "things?" Or, do you pray to gain a greater union with God? Sometimes it is wise to review our relationship with God, and take note of his goodness throughout the history of our lives in the manner that God touches us and loves us. This centers life on the beauty of a connection with God that sways us to "ask, seek, and knock" not to get "things" from God, but to gain notable closeness with God as we would in any other relationship of love.

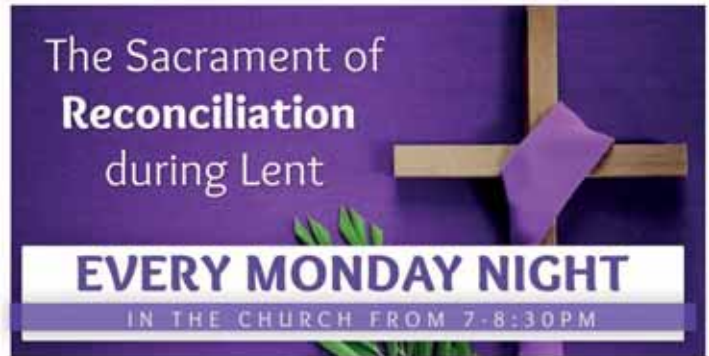
GOLD ANNIVERSARY MASS FOR 2020

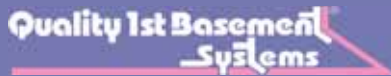
