## Thirtieth Sunday of Ordinary Time

October 26, 2025

**First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18**

God is just and does not show favoritism, but hears the prayers of everyone. Anyone who serves God, no matter how lowly his position here on earth, will be heard and answered.

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18**

Paul writes to Timothy that he thinks his mission is near the end, and he is glad his faith is still strong. Paul hopes that all nations will hear the gospel. But, if he is executed as he anticipates, he is sure he will live forever in heaven.

**Gospel: Luke 18:9-14**

Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee who went to the temple, and offered up a prayer of thanks because he was not a sinner like the tax collector who was also there to pray. The tax collector was far more humble, acknowledging his sins, and asking forgiveness for them. Jesus said the tax collector's prayer would be heard because, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, while he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Saint Patrick Parish invites you to join us for a special **weekly novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal** every Monday starting in October 2025.

The novena will begin immediately following the 8:00 a.m. Mass. We encourage all parishioners to attend the Monday morning Mass and stay to pray this beautiful novena with us.

A powerful and timeless truth of our faith is that **devotion to the Mother of God leads us ever closer to her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ**. By honoring Mary, we follow her example of faith and obedience, allowing her to guide us on the path to a deeper relationship with her Son.

### The History of the Miraculous Medal Novena

The devotion of the Miraculous Medal began in 1830 when the Blessed Mother appeared to a young novice, Saint Catherine Labouré, in Paris, France. Mary requested that a medal be made based on the image she showed Catherine, promising great graces to those who wore it with confidence. The medal quickly became known for the many conversions, healings, and miracles attributed to its intercession, earning it the name "Miraculous Medal."



While a traditional novena is a nine-day period of prayer, this devotion has been adapted to be prayed on a weekly basis, honoring Mary under this specific title. It is a powerful way to seek her intercession for our needs and to grow in our faith.
