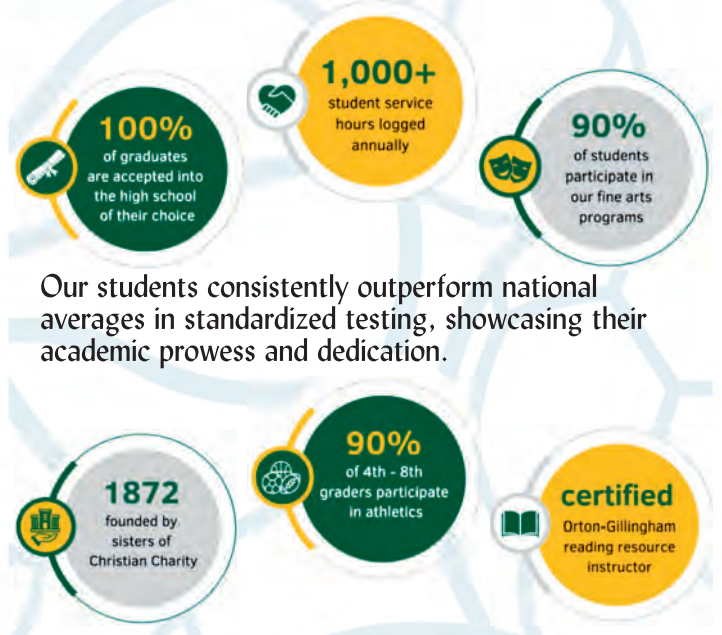

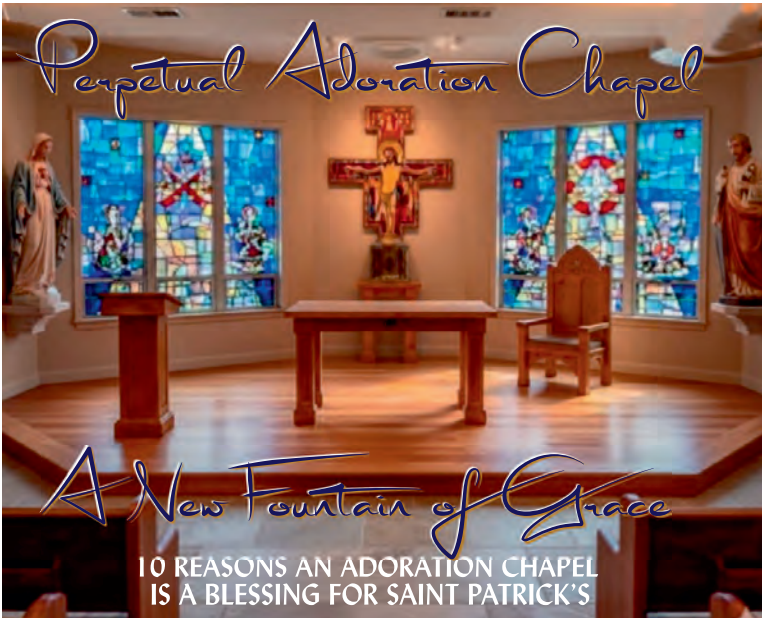


America 250

When Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament is placed at the center of our parish life, His grace ripples outward. Here is why this chapel will be such a source of life for our community:

1. Answering Christ's Personal Invitation - In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus asked, "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" (Mt. 26:40). This chapel provides a tangible way to answer His call.
2. A Sanctuary of Peace in a Noisy World - Modern life is fast-paced and stressful. The chapel offers a rare, sacred silence where you can unplug, breathe, and rest in the presence of the Good Shepherd.
3. Deepening Your Personal Relationship with Jesus - While Sunday Mass is the pinnacle of our communal worship, Adoration fosters intimate, heart-to-heart dialogue with Christ, helping us hear His voice guiding our daily lives.
4. 24/7 Comfort and Strength - Tragedy, anxiety, and spiritual crises don't keep a 9-to-5 schedule. A perpetual chapel ensures the doors are open whenever a soul is hurting and needs the Divine Physician.
5. Strengthening Marriages and Families - Bringing your marriage and children before the Blessed Sacrament invites Christ's grace directly into your home, healing relationships and anchoring your family in faith.
6. Igniting a Hunger for the Sacraments - Time spent before Jesus in the Eucharist intensifies our desire for Holy Communion and a renewed appreciation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
7. Cultivating Priestly & Religious Vocations - The majority of vocations are born in front of the Blessed Sacrament. By providing this chapel, we help foster the future spiritual leaders of our Church.

9. Fueling Our Parish Mission and Outreach - We cannot give what we do not have. True evangelization and charity flow from an overflow of our interior life. Adoration fuels our desire to serve those in need.
10. Building a Chain of Constant Prayer - When we commit to a specific hour, we become part of a beautiful network of prayer, ensuring that our parish, our loved ones, and the world are being lifted up 24/7.

There will be some light refreshments and great conversation. We promise to start and end on time.

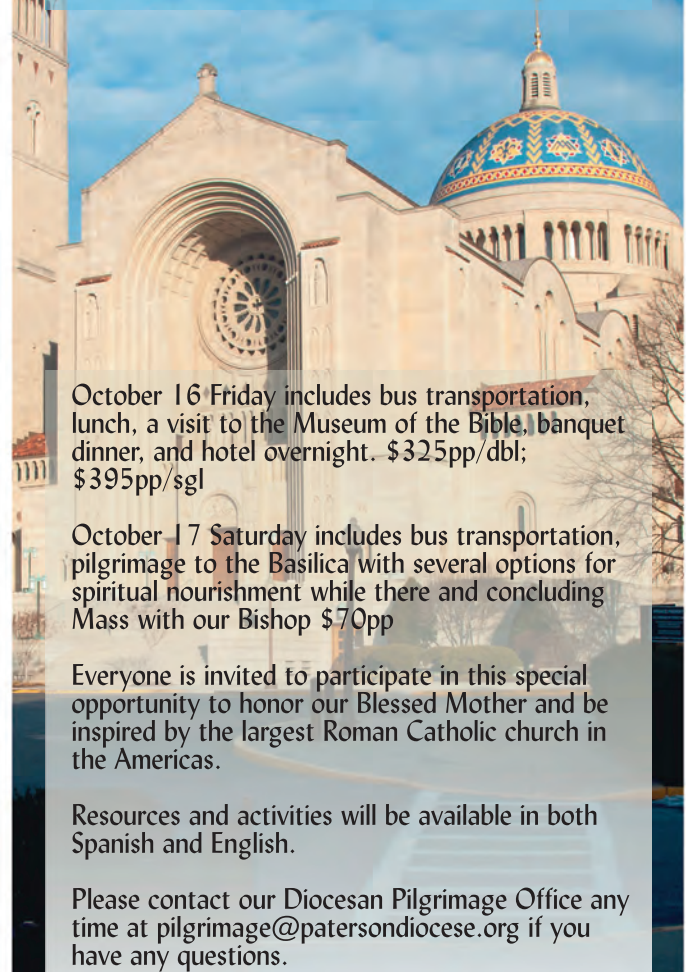

Vincent Spanicciati, a U.S. Marine veteran who served during the Vietnam War and was awarded three Purple Hearts, credits God with guiding him through the war and healing. Along with fellow veterans, he helped build a memorial in Mercer County as a tribute to fallen comrades. Each man who died in Mercer County has a headstone with his name, rank, service number and date of death. The Knights wanted to honor them and their families with something physical that would last.

He continues to serve God and country through his involvement in the Knights of Columbus, acknowledging, "Everything I have is a gift from God. The Knights keep you close to that." Spanicciati says he joined the Knights to help other people, because when someone needs something, the Knights are there to help. As he says, "That's what we do."

- Faith-Focused Staycations: Plan themed activities at home, such as saint celebrations, Scripture scavenger hunts, or family retreats

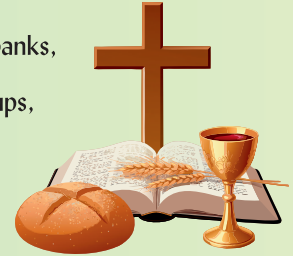


Outdoor and Fun Activities
