This Week in Scripture

“All good giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no alteration or shadow caused by change... Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves.”

The letter of Saint James is a practical guide for living our Christian lives. He reminds us that we have received countless gifts from God which we often take for granted. Make a list. Life, health, family, work, friends, they have been given to us by our God. I did not earn them. Say ‘thank you Lord.’

As I listen to the readings of the word at mass, or pause to read the bible at home, help me to hear what you want to say, and welcome it to lead me to salvation. They are not just empty words, but guides to direct my life to holiness. Maybe this is what is meant by being a doer. We are called to be ‘movers and shakers’ not passive listeners.

At Home with the Word

This week (for further reflection):

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8

Moses tells the people to always observe the statutes God has given them, without adding or subtracting from these laws. He reminds them that the law is just, and that any nation who heard their statutes would consider them a wise nation.

Second Reading: James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27

James discusses the gifts that God has given to all people and implores them to respond by welcoming the words of truth that can save them. He emphasizes that through good deeds and pure conduct, our faith in God is proven to him.

Gospel: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Pharisees observed some of Jesus’ disciples eating without first purifying their hands and ask the disciples why they are going against their ancestor’s traditions. Jesus responds that nothing from the outside can make a person impure. The only true evil, acts such as fornication, murder, and greed among others, come from within and make a person impure.

OCIA –DID YOU KNOW?

Who is OCIA for?

Briefly, for

- 1) persons in need of Baptism
- 2) persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic
- 3) persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

How long is the OCIA process?

The time varies, but is rarely shorter than 6 months. The Church greatly respects the time each person needs for conversion and decision. The OCIA text gives guides for discerning this on a case-by-case basis. *“Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts.”* (1Cor 12:31)

Deacon's Corner

How do we live the Beatitude, Blessed are the Poor in Spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of God?

In *“The Ten Commandments and The Beatitudes: Biblical Studies and Ethics for Real Life,”* theologian Lúcas Chan argues that the Beatitudes are the steps we must take to follow Christ. They are a *“ladder of ascent.”* We start with the first Beatitude, then step up to the next and the next to follow in the footsteps of Christ. Notice the Beatitudes begin and end with the Kingdom of God. The *“poor in spirit”* in the first Beatitude (*“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of God”*) are not simply people who are sad. Matthew’s *“poor in spirit”* correlates with the word *“beggar.”* It is the poverty of people who have no advocate but God. They have no support so even their spirit is poor. All other Beatitudes allow us to respond to the poor in spirit. The second Beatitude, *“Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted,”* connects to the poor in spirit. Those who will be comforted are those who are mourning the condition of the poor in spirit. The rest of the Beatitudes follow as instructions from Jesus about how to grow in care for the poor in spirit. It is effectively a seven-step program that starts with empathy, moves to meekness, then to the practices of hunger and thirst, allowing us to enter into solidarity with the poor in spirit, developing practices of mercy, working for peace, and risking persecution, insult, and injustice. Living the Beatitudes this way equips us well to respond to our call to discipleship. The early Christians lived the Beatitudes by welcoming the poor in spirit who were in their midst. We need to do the same. *Now you know!*
