THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Are you interested in becoming a Catholic? Already Baptized, but never received Communion or Confirmation? RCIA is the process the Church uses to bring adults into the Catholic Faith. To find out more, call the parish office and ask for Sr. Therese Mary.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the last two Sundays of the month. Parents should call the Parish Office to make arrangements for the baptism of their child. Parents are required to attend a prebaptismal program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples should begin making arrangements for their marriage in advance in order to complete requirements.

VISITATION OF THE SICK

Hospitals are visited each week. Communion is taken to Allied Skilled Nursing on Saturdays at 2:00 pm and Allied Rehab on Mondays. Communion is taken to the homebound on Sundays after 9:30 am or on First Friday after the 9:00 am Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

CCD Classes are held on Tuesdays from 2:45 pm - 3:45 pm and on Sundays from 9:30 am - 10:45 am. All grade school children should be attending religious education classes.



"PARENTS A 2ND TIME"

In coordination with the Lackawanna County Area Agency on Aging and Office of Youth & Family Services, a new support group has been developed called "Parents for a 2nd Time", commonly referred to as PAST, for older adults raising children of a family member. With a growing contingent of grandparents, aunts, uncles, and other older relatives raising children as a result of the opioid epidemic, this support group is in response to community need. A co-facilitator from LCAAA & OYFS will be hosting the groups dedicated to education & programming; the remaining time will be discussion and networking. Surveys will be shared to gage interest to topics of concern. The Lackawanna-Susquehanna Behavioral Health Intellectual Disabilities Early Intervention Program and the Lackawanna-Susquehanna Office of Alcohol & Drug Programs will also be available to provide programming. Support groups meet 3x/month in different venues around the county:

3rd Wed of the month, Lackawanna Children's Library 6:30-8:30pm

4th Mon of the month, Carbondale Library 9:30-11:30am

4th Tues of the month, Taylor Library 1:00-3:00pm

Funding is available through LCAAA Caregiver Program, where adults 55 and older, may be eligible for financial benefits to purchase services to ease the burden of caring for a younger loved one. Benefits include school supplies & uniforms, sport fees, supplies & uniforms, extra-curricular activities, tutoring, baby-sitting, housekeeping, etc. Assessments are completed by the LCAAA to determine eligibility that is based on need, household income, etc.
