Gospel Reflection Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

*I Samuel 3:3-10, 19
John. 1:35-42*

Most of us are not clinicians like my niece who is a speech and hearing therapist. I am sure that Lisa, my niece, has studied a syndrome called auditory processing delay. I recently learned about it from a former educator who encountered it among very bright students whom he tutored. Their intelligence was not the issue. No, they simply had difficulty processing what they were hearing when spoken to. Often, persons who suffer from APD can repeat word for word what was said to them but are unable to easily decipher the verbal information they have received.

Can anyone slight young Samuel for hearing quite well but not processing that call in the night as the voice of God? The Temple where he was reared under Eli's tutelage was silent at night; the Voice was clear, but the message for Samuel was still a mystery. He needed time and guidance to unravel and process the call.

Hearing is an external process, but listening is an interior and acquired skill. When it comes to the Voice of God, most of us may hear it readily but process it slowly and in our own unique way. Spiritually, do we not all experience a processing delay?

Like Samuel, in today's first reading, and like Andrew and his companion in today's Gospel, what we may need is a still and quiet night with the Lord to understand more fully what God is saying to us.

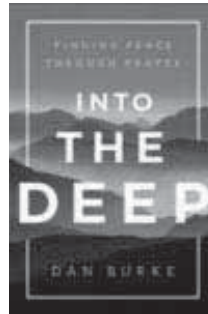

SIT REFLECTION

SITuation

There is one country in the Middle East that is regularly making the headlines as of late – one which we do not normally discuss within the context of Christian persecution, but one that bears more than its share of culpability in how Christian citizens are treated.

Over the past few weeks young protestors in Iran have actively voiced their displeasure of a dictatorial regime with grievances stemming from economic disparity and now percolating into issues of social equality. The riots are the largest in Iran in nearly a decade, and are a counter to the 1979 revolution which gave way to the current governance based on Islamic Sharia law.

As our dear friend Juliana Taimoorazy of the Iraqi Christian Relief Council tells us, prior to the takeover by the Islamic “Supreme Leader,” Christians were respected more than they currently are. After the regime change in 1979, Juliana faced repeated harassment at the hands of schoolmates, teachers, and officials resulting in her beloved father arranging for her to be smuggled out of Iran to Europe mixed in with livestock where she found sanctuary with a cloister of nuns prior to eventually landing in the Chicago area. Her harrowing story is a fortunate one, for as the *Boston Pilot* in a January 4 article states, “Christians are systematically discriminated against ... [government] routinely harasses them, monitors and raids their house churches, and arrests and imprisons their pastors on trumped-up national security charges.”

We know that many Christians in Iran are in secret prisons throughout Tehran and neighboring areas. We can only pray that the voices of revolutionary angst in the country ultimately results in more acceptance of an established Christian minority in the region – one that obviously bears no threat to national security, but includes, like anywhere else, a community of faithful followers looking to worship in a free and protected manner.

God bless the Christians in Iran, and God bless all of our persecuted brothers and sisters.
