Gospel Reflection

Lk. 18:1-8

Jesus loved to teach by using parables --- made up stories that teach about life. Sometimes real-life stories can teach us about parables.



One such real-life story appeared in the *Washington Post* a couple years ago. It was about a woman named Wanda Witter. She was an eighty-year-old woman who simply wouldn't give up on what she knew the government owed her, namely, more than \$100,000 in Social Security benefits.

For 16 long years, she lived on the streets of DC, collected all the documentary evidence needed (which she carried in three suitcases) and tried to get the Social Security Administration or, for that matter, anyone to listen to her plea for justice. Many dismissed her. Some thought she must be crazy. But persistent she was and finally Julie Turner, a church-based social worker, heard her story. She sorted through all the paperwork filed in Wanda's suitcase and helped her convince Uncle Sam that he owed her big time. In August of 2016 SSA cut Wanda a check for \$99,999.00, with the promise that other checks will likely follow in the future.

It would seem that the corrupt judge in today's parable was swifter in delivering justice than Uncle Sam was in Witter's case. What was, in justice, due the widow and Wanda was in the end awarded to both. In Wanda's case bureaucracy impeded the hearing of her plea. Justice for the widow in the parable was delayed by corruption.

God's time may not always be our time so, when we pray, we persist in faith, confident that He is neither a bureaucrat nor corrupt but rather, our Father. If prayer is, at one and the same time, the faith-filled plea of a child in need and the Father's response in love, then we should never lose hope nor ever stop praying.

The safest option is to designate a health care agent who not only understands our Catholic values but also shares them and can apply them to current situations and respond to questions as they arise. In choosing an agent or proxy, a person can declare in writing that all treatment and care decisions made on their behalf must be consistent with and not contradict the moral teachings of the Catholic Church.



SIT REFLECTION – OCTOBER 20TH

It is important during this reflection to ask for your prayers for the Syrian and Iraqi people. After seemingly a very short period of time when ISIS has all but retreated from ancient Assyria throughout northern Iraq into Syria, a time of peace for our young schoolchildren as they recolonize their Christian homeland from the cramped and dirty refugee centers they left. What of them now?



We do not know as of yet how the uprisings in Iraq are impacting those we have helped in Qaraqosh and beyond but, as reports surface that the violent protests

are usurping the entire country, we cannot help but feel there is some impact. We ask for your continued prayers for the people of Iraq – especially those faithful Assyrian students and their families who have been through such an ordeal already and simply want to continue living according to Christ's teachings.

And what of Syria? Straying from political discussion, Christians in Syria may be regarded as nothing more than collateral damage as Turkey unleashes its militant strength upon Kurdish forces in the area. Indeed there is discussion on whether the Kurds truly do respect the livelihoods of Christians in the region but regardless of that tete a tete, recent bombings have resulted in many deaths and destroyed towns – towns that Christian families share. I recently was moved upon seeing a posted image of a young Christian girl crying in a hospital being treated for a missing leg, as her brother lay dying next to her.

I do not recount these anecdotes to steal your emotion – but is it not true that, above all others, children deserve a chance to peacefully develop their faith? It is situations like these that further illustrate the need for SIT in our parish. We are not a ministry of a handful of members. Whether you regularly participate in our group or not, you know who we are, and why we exist. By extension, simple knowledge of SIT's mission makes you a member committed to preserving the respect and prayerful dedication to scores of others around that world crying to Our Lord for mercy.

Join me ... join us ... in sharing that prayer. *Jesus, hear the cries of your children. May they come to know peace and rest their weary hearts in the solace of your comfort. Be it done according to your will.*

God bless you all, and God bless the Christians of Iraq and Syria.

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

THE FREDERICK M. GOSSMAN MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Designed to assist members of the Knights of Columbus holding membership in councils within the jurisdiction of Maryland in paying tuition for their sons and daughters at accredited Catholic High Schools, three (3) grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years, and one (1) additional grant of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years funded by the Maryland Knights of Columbus Insurance Advisors will be awarded. Awards will be made based on academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need. Continued support after the first year is contingent on continued academic success. The children of deceased members are also eligible, provided the member was in good standing at the time of death. Funds are applicable to tuition only.

THE WILLIAM J. O'BRIEN JR., MEMORIAL CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Three (3) grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years will be awarded. Eligibility for a grant under this program is open to Catholic students who are residents of the State of Maryland. Affiliation with the Knights of Columbus is not required. However, children and grandchildren of a member of a Knights of Columbus council within the jurisdiction of Maryland are also eligible. Applicants must have been officially accepted at or must be students at accredited Catholic High Schools. Applications will be judged on academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need. Continued support after the first year is contingent on continued academic success. Funds are applicable to tuition only.
