

Sacraments

Baptism: Parents are asked to schedule an appointment with one of the priests early in the pregnancy. Parents are reminded that the selection of godparents must be made according to regulations specified in Canon Law. Eligibility letters for godparents should be submitted no later than 10 prior days to the baptism. Baptisms will take place after the 11:30 am Mass on the first and second Sundays of the month. Pre-Baptism Workshops take place on the last Tuesday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Parish Office. Registration for workshops can be made by calling the parish office.

Marriage: Ideally, engaged couples should contact the Parish Office one year prior to the scheduled date.

Anointing of the Sick and Communion Calls: The rectory may be called at any time for the Sacrament of the Sick and for arrangements to visit the sick or elderly with the Eucharist. Our local hospitals also have a Catholic chaplain available.

The Clergy Corner

One of the most charming scenes of the New Testament is the engaging encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. The Gospel, a deeply touching human interest story, describes a twofold thirst:

Our thirst for God. Like the Samaritan woman in the gospel, we thirst for meaning in life. We thirst for fullness and completeness, happiness and satisfaction, good health and long life. But sometimes we try to quench our thirst with stagnant water. We go to the cisterns of excess in drink, drugs, work or material possessions. We go to the cisterns of secularism, materialism, hedonism and sin. We think that five husbands, or five cars, or five houses, or five electronic devices, or five of whatever will satisfy our thirst for human fulfillment. But none of these things can satisfy us completely. They always leave us thirsting for better things—like the peace that comes from following him; or the joy that comes from serving his people.

God's thirst for us. We need to move beyond our desires to appreciate the enormity of God's thirst for us. In the words of St. Augustine, "*Deus sitit sitiri*": God thirsts to be thirsted for. Or as St. Teresa of Calcutta says, "Until you know deep inside that Jesus thirsts for you—you can't begin to know who he wants to be for you. Or who he wants you to be for him."

Jesus is our living water who alone can satisfy our thirsting human spirit. St. Augustine says, "The heart of man is made for you, Lord. It is restless until it rests in you." When we drink of the water that Jesus gives, the water of his **Word** in the scriptures; the water of his **Spirit** in the sacraments; the water of his **Presence** in prayer; the water of his **Grace** in ministry, we will never be thirsty. Since the pleasures of life fail to satisfy the thirsting human spirit, the only remedy is a relationship with Jesus who provides a mysterious type of water producing a well-spring of life within us.

Called to be missionary disciples. Jesus our living water will become a fountain within us, springing up to refresh people around us, to relieve the arid lives of the poor, and to nourish the hearts of the lonely. Following the lead of the Samaritan woman, we will go out and bring others to Jesus: "Come, see the Messiah, drink his water, and never be thirsty again."

How great if many could be drawn to Jesus by our simple testimony. So many are thirsty for words of comfort, direction, hope and peace. We can all be missionaries in our own little way just like the Samaritan woman. Thank you Jesus because through your patient dialogue with us we can come to discover the fountain of living water within us and be a source of life for others.




Prayer to Walk Humbly Through Lent




