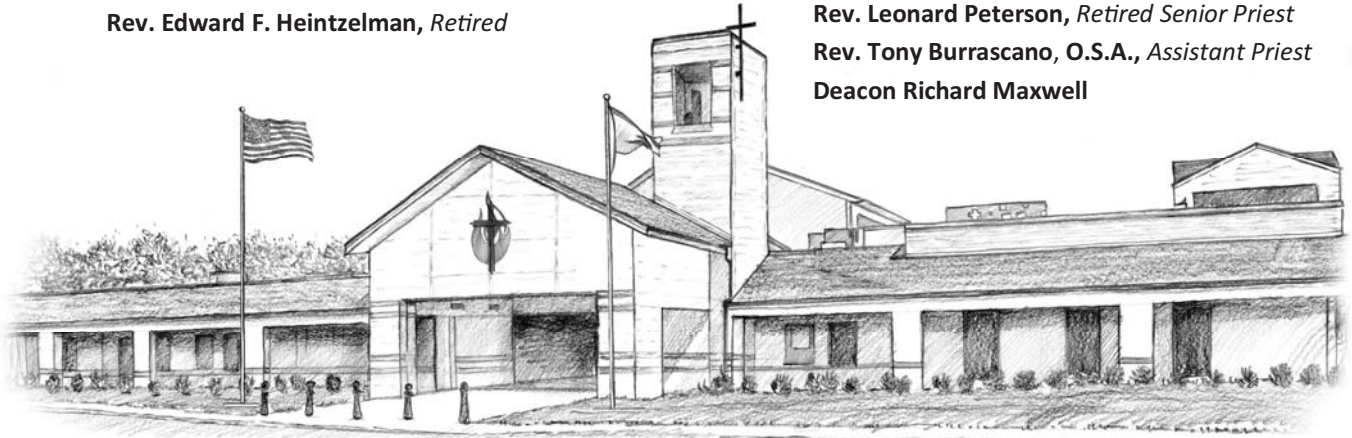

St. Vincent de Paul Church in cooperation with Holy Cross Cemetery is once again participating in Wreaths Across America. On Saturday, Dec. 14 parish members, along with other local area groups will meet and place wreaths on Veteran graves in the cemetery. Last year we had about 200 people come out and place 500 wreaths in the cemetery. Earlier this year, we did a

count and found that there are about 1,500 veterans buried in Holy Cross. So, we want to make our effort and ceremony even bigger.

Just like last year, , each wreath needs a sponsorship that costs \$17. For each wreath sponsored, St. Vincent de Paul gets \$5 back, which will go to supporting our food pantry ministry or our SVDP Regional School – your choice. Please consider sponsoring one or more wreaths to help us honor our deceased Veterans this holiday season.

Judgment and Spiritual Health

Take a moment to reflect on specific judgments you have held towards other people. In what ways have you felt superior to other people? Can these same judgments and attitudes reflect our own shortcomings with fully living as authentic witnesses of God's truth? Do we pick and choose aspects of our faith that we want to practice while rationalizing and hiding our sins behind a mask of self-righteousness? Our judgments can keep us from living up to our full potential. We may run from ourselves by hiding behind our knowledge. We become out of touch with our own hearts and become resistant to facing our own brokenness. But behind all our sin, wounds, and defenses, we desire God's mercy and love. Jesus sees through our hypocrisy.

"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own... You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." (Lk 6:41-42).

From His own experience, Jesus knows our suffering intimately and identifies with our brokenness. Bob Schuchts notes that Jesus did not judge or condemn from an attitude of superiority. "Though his judgment is just, he didn't come into this world to judge us. Rather, he came to reveal the Father's mercy and compassion. His mercy triumphs over judgment." No matter how much we insulate and protect our heart with self-righteous judgments, we cannot fix ourselves without Jesus, who knows the depths of our pain and persists in breaking through our internal barriers to reveal the deeper longings of our hearts. Allow God's embrace to touch the core of the disappointment and pain you've been carrying and release it (Schuchts 29-34).

Dear Parishioners,

I was speaking to Jim Armstrong the other night. (Thank you for all your prayers for our past Grand Knight – he is still in the hospital and says he feels the prayers.) I felt blessed to hear the story of his childhood, which involved several coaches and families stepping in and helping him when he needed it.

He made me think more about the kind of community we are called to be.

This afternoon, I watched a video of an interview with a priest who has ministered to college students for twenty years. (He is also a well known speaker, Fr Mike Schmitz.) He was asked what the college students are looking for. He said they are incredibly lonely and what they are looking for is friendship and family.

I am observing things in our community that give me hope in this area.

In our youth club for children ages 5-8 on Sunday mornings, I see little souls being formed to be saints. They love coming.

In our youth club for ages 9-16 on Sunday morning, I see children from various families wanting to come every week to spend time with each other. It's awesome.

This past week, we had seven juniors and seniors in high school show up for a new study for young people their age.

On Monday, we finished the fourth and final session of our new family faith formation for parents, teens, and children. I am very encouraged by reports I am getting about how it was received.

For Jim, this week friends took turns sitting with him and his wife in the hospital, literally taking shifts.

This morning, the Seven Sisters ministry approached me – they have a second team of seven sisters to pray for a second priest. As grateful as I am for their prayers, the community and friendship I see between them is strikingly beautiful too. The woman who started the group, Emilie Sales, inculcated this. And the group continues in this way.

There is one man who practiced this in a way I particularly appreciated this past week. When I wasn't feeling well, I asked him to meet with a man new to the parish. He spent an hour and a half listening to his story and letting him know the various opportunities to plug in to the parish.

I should also mention the 7th grade class at the school – they served our older parishioners a turkey dinner this past Sunday. Many commented on their sweetness as a group. In their and their parents service, they helped to cultivate friendships among those they served and one another.

We thank God for these blessings!

On this Sunday, we remember Christ who is true King. The celebration came about to make clear that Christ is the *only* true King. There is no one greater. He rules. And he loves like no other. His friendship and his family (the Church) are the ultimate ones we are called to receive and enjoy and to invite others to do the same.
