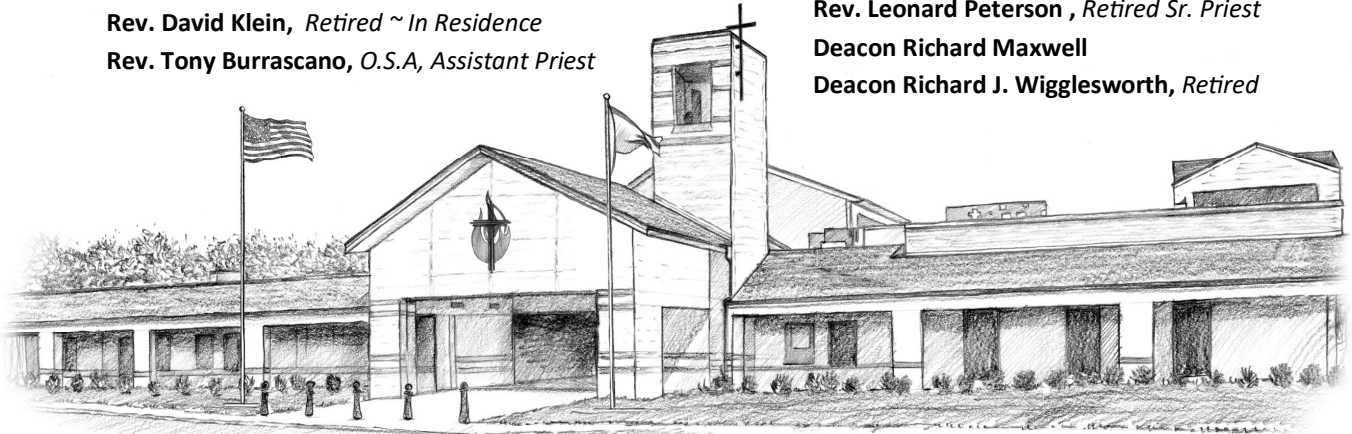

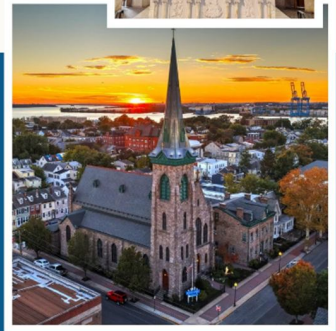

Heat-Related Illnesses

Being overheated for too long or being exposed without protection to the sun can cause many health problems. Heat-related illnesses include the following:

- Heat syncope is a sudden dizziness that can happen when you are active in hot weather. If you take a heart medication called a beta blocker or are not acclimated to hot weather, you are even more likely to feel faint. Rest in a cool place, put your legs up, and drink water to make the dizzy feeling go away.
- Heat cramps are the painful tightening or spasms of muscles in your stomach, arms, or legs. Cramps can result from hard work or intense exercise. Though your body temperature and pulse usually stay normal during heat cramps, your skin may feel moist and cool. Stop the physical activity you're doing and rest in the shade or in a cool building. Drink plenty of fluids, such as water and sports drinks containing electrolytes. Do not consume alcohol or caffeinated beverages.
- Heat edema is a swelling in your ankles and feet when you get hot. Put your legs up to reduce swelling. If that doesn't work fairly quickly, check with your doctor.
- Heat rash is a skin irritation from heavy sweating. It causes red clusters of small blisters that look similar to pimples on the skin. Your skin may feel itchy or you may feel "prickly" tingling pain. Keep the affected area dry, use powder to sooth the rash, and stay in cool areas.

If you are concerned about any of these heat-related illnesses, talk with your doctor.

Dear Parishioners.

For the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), I share with you some quotes from St Justin Martyr, who wrote about the Mass and the Eucharist around the year 155 AD.

On the Mass: “On the day we call the day of the sun, all who dwell in the city or country gather in the same place. The memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read, as much as time permits. When the reader has finished, he who presides over those gathered admonishes and challenges them to imitate these beautiful things. Then we all rise together and offer prayers* for ourselves . . .and for all others, wherever they may be, so that we may be found righteous by our life and actions, and faithful to the commandments, so as to obtain eternal salvation. When the prayers are concluded we exchange the kiss. Then someone brings bread and a cup of water and wine mixed together to him who presides over the brethren. He takes them and offers praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and for a considerable time he gives thanks (in Greek: eucharistian) that we have been judged worthy of these gifts. When he has concluded the prayers and thanksgivings, all present give voice to an acclamation by saying: 'Amen.' When he who presides has given thanks and the people have responded, those whom we call deacons give to those present the "eucharisted" bread, wine and water and take them to those who are absent.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1345 quoting 1st Apology, Chps 65 and 67)

On the Eucharist: “And this food is called among us Εὐχαριστία [the [Eucharist](#)], of which no one is allowed to partake but the man who believes that the things which we teach are [true](#), and who has been washed with the washing that is for the remission of [sins](#), and unto regeneration, and who is so living as Christ has enjoined. For not as common bread and common drink do we receive these; but in like manner as [Jesus Christ](#) our Saviour, having been made flesh by the [Word of God](#), had both flesh and blood for our [salvation](#), so likewise have we been taught that the food which is blessed by the [prayer](#) of His word, and from which our blood and flesh by transmutation are nourished, is the flesh and blood of that [Jesus](#) who was made flesh. For the [apostles](#), in the memoirs composed by them, which are called [Gospels](#), have thus delivered unto us what was enjoined upon them; that [Jesus](#) took bread, and when He had given thanks, said, *“This do in remembrance of Me, this is My body;”* and that, after the same manner, having taken the cup and given thanks, He said, *“This is My blood;”* and gave it to them alone...” (1st Apology, Ch. 66)

At the end of Chapter 67, St Justin says, “Having appeared to His apostles and disciples, [Jesus Christ] taught them these things, which we have submitted to you.” It is Jesus who taught us, through the apostles and the church, how to worship him in the Mass. It is Jesus who teaches us, through the apostles and the church, that the blessed bread and wine are truly his Body and Blood.
