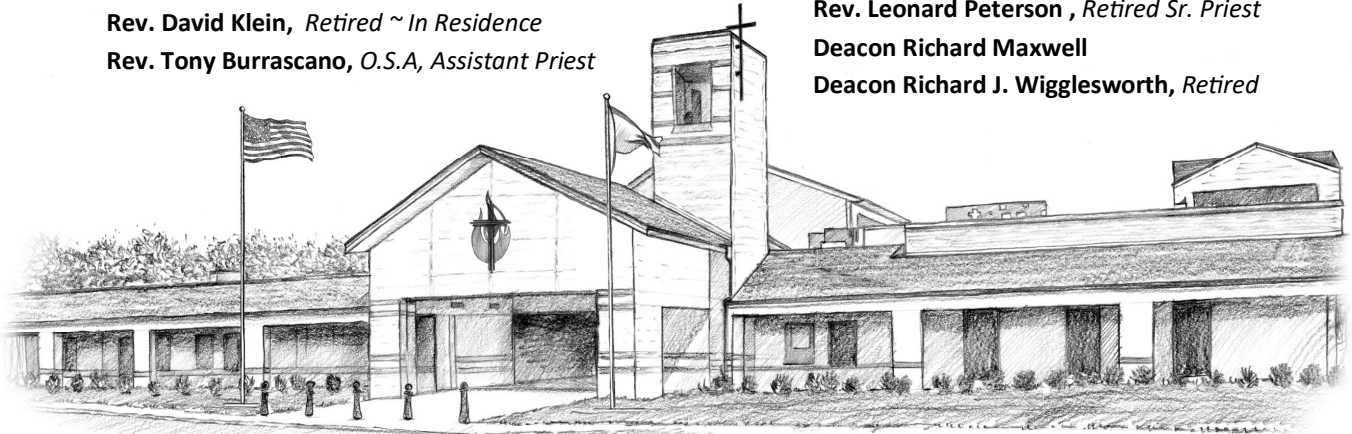

More Heat-Related Illnesses

Being overheated for too long or being exposed without protection from the sun can cause many health problems. Heat-related illnesses include the following:

- Heat exhaustion is a warning that your body can no longer keep itself cool. You might feel thirsty, dizzy, weak, uncoordinated, and nauseated. You may sweat a lot. Your body temperature may stay normal, but your skin may feel cold and clammy. Some people with heat exhaustion have a rapid pulse. Rest in a cool place and get plenty of fluids. If you don't feel better soon, get medical care. Be cautious because heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke.
- Heat stroke is a medical emergency in which the body's temperature rises above 104°F. Signs of heat stroke are fainting; confusion or acting strangely; not sweating even when it's hot; dry, flushed skin; strong, rapid pulse; or a slow, weak pulse. When a person has any of these symptoms, they should seek medical help right away and immediately move to a cooler place, such as under shade or indoors. They should also take action to lower their body temperature with cool clothes, a cool bath or shower, and fans.

If you are concerned about any of these heat-related illnesses, talk with your doctor.

Dear Parishioners,

Yesterday, I celebrated a funeral Mass for a parishioner (Sotero Singanon or "Turing") who was a gifted and generous gardener. In fact, he helped to care for the properties of ten families in his community. As I thought about him in preparation for the funeral, it occurred to me that we each are like a garden to which God attends. I wondered to myself whether the saints ever spoke about such a thing. They have!

St Theresa of Avila said, "the soul of a righteous person is none other than a garden in which the Beloved takes great delight."

In reading a little more, it sounds like St Theresa focused most on watering the garden of our soul with prayer.

There are three "gardens" on our grounds that I have seen receiving a lot of attention of late.

The first is the garden of planters in our walkways and out by the grotto which were actually planted by Turing's daughter and son-in-law. Something fun for me to see is the text string for those who signed up to water the flowers. The other day I saw a couple filling a big bucket with the hose and then using smaller buckets to dip into that and water the flowers.

The second is the vegetable garden in back of the rectory. I think we all wondered how the watering would work. They run a long hose from the rectory which both fills a BIG repository and is also connected to a sprinkler.

The third is one of the long beds in our parking lot which was just planted with 700 "natural habitat" plants we received through a grant. Thankfully, there is irrigation in those rows and the landscaper was able to connect a drip hose to slowly water the plants.

When talking about prayer, St Theresa talks about different ways that our soul receives water. One starts with the hard work of lowering buckets into a well. (Disciplining ourselves to set aside time to pray and focus.) The second she likens to a waterwheel or aqueduct where God starts to help us to enter into silence and be less distracted. The third she likens to water from a stream or river where God takes over the watering and brings the soul to a place of contemplation and rest.

I love seeing these "gardens" on our property. I love seeing our people work together to tend to them and water them. I also love that they remind us of the greatest garden on this earth – that of our soul. And how that greatest of gardens requires watering too, and from the best of teams – you and God.
